ISSUES AND PROGRAMMING

KFPW-FM PROVIDES LISTENERS WITH NEWS, WEATHER AND TRAFFIC UPDATES THROUGHOUT THE DAY, WITH LOCAL, ON-AIR PERSONALITIES TALKING ABOUT WHAT IS GOING ON IN THE COMMUNITY AND REGION. A FIVE-MINUTE NEWS UPDATE AND 60-SECOND UPDATES EACH WEEKDAY MORNING KEEP OUR LISTENERS INFORMED. DENNIS SNOW HOSTS THE MORNING SNOWSTORM AND BILL PHARIS PROVIDES LOCAL AND AREA NEWS. TOMMY STREET PRESENTS THE "DRIVE AT FIVE."

EACH OF OUR PERSONALITIES IS DEEPLY INVOLVED IN THE COMMUNITY. DENNIS IS PRESIDENT OF THE ANNUAL STEEL HORSE MOTORCYCLE RALLY IN FORT SMITH AND TOMMY IS DEEPLY INVOLVED IN PET RESCUE IN THE REGION. KAREN PHARIS IS PRESIDENT OF THE DEGAN BOARD THAT DISTRIBUTES FUNDS TO AREA MEDICAL SCHOOLS, FACILITIES AND HOSPITALS, AS WELL AS BEING ON THE BOARD OF THE ARKANSAS COLLEGES OF HEALTH EDUCATION.

IMPORTANT ISSUES AND PROGRAMMING THIS FIRST QUARTER INCLUDE THE "RECORD OF DECISION" WHICH WAS ANNOUNCED BY THE U.S. AIR FORCE, ESTABLISHING EBBING FIELD HERE AS THE NEW HOME OF SINGAPORE PILOTS OF THE F-35. LOCKHEED MARTIN ANNOUNCED 150 PERSONS WOULD BE HIRED INISITIALY AS PART OF THE PLAN THAT WILL LEAD TO A \$2 BILLION ECONOMIC IMPACT TO THE TWO-STATE REGION.

DR. ROSILEE RUSSELL ANNOUNCED THE COMMUNITY SCHOOL OF THE ARTS WOULD BEGIN ACCEPTING HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AT NO CHARGE. THIS WILL BE A FIRST OF IT'S KIND IN THE AREA. ADDITIONAL PARKS WERE PURCHASED TO GIVE CITIZENS MORE OPPORTUNITY TO BE OUTDOORS. FOOD PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN AND ADULTS WERE FEATURED IN DISTRIBUTING NOURISHMENT AND ALSO FUNDRAISING. THE FORT SMITH PUBLIC SCHOOLS WERE FEATURED WITH INTERVIEWS WITH LEADING EDUCATORS SHOWCASING THE INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS THEY HAVE PROVIDED STUDENTS.

THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF AN INTERMODEL PORT ON THE ARKANSAS RIVER NEAR FORT SMITH-VAN BUREN WILL BE A MAJOR U.S. CORPS OF ENGINEERS PROJECT.

CITIZENS HERE ARE CONCERNED ABOUT CRIME AND WITH TWO BANK ROBBERIES AND STORE HOLDUPS IT SEEMED THAT SUCH ACTIVITY WAS ON THE RISE. HOWEVER, IN CHECKING WITH POLICE AND ARIC MITCHELL OF THE DEPARTMENT POINTED OUT THAT THE LEVEL WAS ABOUT THE SAME AS THE FIRST QUARTER LAST YEAR. WE ALSO NOTED THAT THE FORT SMITH POLICE FORCE NOW HAS A FULL COMPLEMENT OF EMPLOYEES. CHIEF DANNY BAKER POINTS OUT ON OUR AIR THAT THEY WASN'T TO BE COMMUNITY ORIENTED---COFFEE WITH A COP, SPECIAL EVENTS FOR AUSTISTIC PERSONS, AND SESSIONS THAT STRESS GOOD RELATIONSHIPS WITH LOCAL CITIZENS.

WE ALSO COVERED THE ELECTIONS IN MARCH, FEATURING A NUMBER OF CANDIDATES, LETTING LISTENERS KNOW WHERE TO SEE THESE CANDIDATES AND HOW THEY COULD LEARN MORE ABOUT THEM.
