- A. Health Care: The cost of health care and delivery of healthcare services.
- B. Education: The effects of budget changes on Education in Kansas.
- C. Judical: The need for child advocacy in courts and parental custody issues.
- D. Agriculture: The Economic Impact on agriculture on land values and marketing issues.
- E. Environment: EPA regulations that impact water use and wildlife in Kansas.
- F. Athletics: New program that allows young men in central Kansas to participate in football with scholarships.

Programs

A. Healthcare:

Eagle Radio Forum. Broadcast on April 5th. Length 4;20. Until the federal health insurance Marketplace opened last year, farmers and ranchers were more likely to be uninsured than many other groups. Heartland Health Monitor reporter Bryan Thompson checked into how the law is working for farmers and ranchers.

Eagle Radio Forum. Broadcast on April 12th. Length 5:10. The University of Kansas Cancer Center has created a partnership to bring cancer treatment options to rural portions of Kansas. Heartland Health Monitor reporter Bryan Thompson learned more about clinical trials being used in rural hospitals.
