There follows a listing of some of the significant issues by this Station along with most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period 4/1/23 to 6/30/23. The listing is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance.

There are many social issues that are important and worthy of attention, but here are five that are particularly pressing in this area:

1. ***Humane Society***: plays a crucial role in promoting and ensuring the welfare of animals. They rescue animals from abusive or neglectful situations, provide them with necessary medical care, and work to find them loving homes. The organization helps prevent and alleviate animal suffering, addressing issues such as cruelty, abandonment, and overpopulation.
2. ***Education*** is essential for personal and societal growth and development. It allows individuals to expand their knowledge, skills, and abilities, and enables them to make informed decisions about their lives and their communities. Education is also crucial for economic success and for addressing social and global issues. Investing in education is investing in the future.
3. ***Religion***: plays a significant role in many people's lives, providing a sense of purpose, community, and spiritual fulfillment. It can also serve as a source of moral guidance and inspire individuals to lead ethical and compassionate lives.
