## SECTION 1 - ISSUES OF CONCERN TO THE COMMUNITY

Each day KEIB provides 24 minutes of local news, weather and traffic coverage, which means a total 2,016 minutes during this quarter were dedicated to local news, weather and traffic information, keeping the public informed of vital information. This coverage included major issues like: **public safety, crime, economy** and **transportation**.

### Food Insecurity

The amount of people in Southern California experiencing food insecurity is increasing, despite efforts to reduce it. Local food banks and charity organizations are overwhelmed with requests for food and basic daily supplies, several iHeartSocal shows featured these organizations to discuss what they do and how the public can help them help others.

## <u>Health</u>

This quarter there was a focus on health issues including a focus on women's heart health, substance abuse and addiction, an effort to increase dwindling blood donations across Southern California, and several events designed to help raise money and awareness for a myriad of medical issues like MS and cancer.

### **Homelessness**

The increase of homeless individuals in Southern California has caused pressure on local officials to find a permanent solution. In the meantime, these people need help and assistance and several local organizations are coming together to talk about how they are providing help, hygiene supplies and support to those in this situation.

### **Politics**

This quarter with a primary election in Southern California, several episodes of iHeartSoCal featured details about how to register to vote, how and where to vote and how you can ensure that your vote counts.
