Breastfeeding promotion and support are integral parts of the WIC program. WIC is striving to increase the incidence and duration of breastfeeding among women enrolled in the program.

This was an amazing and eye-opening discussion and a reminder that although we have come such a long way in our fight to end HIV/AIDS, we still have so far to go and Broward House is committed to seeing this through and standing by our South Florida Community until the end.

TOPIC: A representative from The Miami Diaper Bank came into discuss the invaluable and quite essential work and services being provided by the MDB. We talked about the immense need for diapers and other personal hygiene products specifically related to babies and young children throughout our community, the financial burden buying these products can pose for disadvantaged and low-income families, and ways our community can take advantage of the services provided by the Miami Diaper Bank as well as get involved and lend support to this organization.

March 17, 2019 6:20 a.m. Community Convo's with KimmyB – Victoria Mallette/The Homeless Trust Duration: 0:30:00 minutes

The Homeless Trust organizes and direct the Miami-Dade County Homeless Plan. It administers proceeds of a 1% food and beverage tax, implements the local continuum of care plan, and serves in an advisory capacity to the Board of County Commissioners on issues involving homelessness.

TOPIC: Victoria Mallette, Executive Director of the Miami-Dade County Homeless Trust, was a highlighted guest during our Women's History Month HERSTORY series, and she came in to talk about the Trust, the work and outreach the Trust and its team and partners do, and the impact it has had over the years as well as what they are hoping to accomplish moving forward. We discussed the issues surrounding homelessness, especially in Miami-Dade County, the drastically high number of homeless/unattached youth we are seeing in South Florida and around the country, common misperceptions of the "who/what/where/when/whys" of the homeless, and how we the community can best help the Trust and its partners eradicate homelessness in and around South Florida. We also provided listeners who may have been in need or facing possible homelessness with outreach information and contact numbers.

March 24, 2019 6:00 a.m. Community Convo's with KimmyB – Miami Dade County Department of Health/WIC Program Duration: 0:15:00 minutes

The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children aka WIC Program is a federally funded public health nutrition program providing nutrition education, nutritious foods, breastfeeding support, and healthcare referrals for income-eligible women who are pregnant, breastfeeding or postpartum, infants, and children up to age 5. Breastfeeding promotion and support are integral parts of the WIC program. WIC is striving to increase the incidence and duration of breastfeeding among women enrolled in the program.

TOPIC: Personnel from the Miami-Dade County Department of Health WIC program came in to talk about breastfeeding, it's benefits, and many of the issues, questions, and concerns that breastfeeding mothers or women considering breastfeeding might have. We also talked about the plethora of services that the WIC agency provides for breastfeeding moms, including a free breast pump program, peer counselor support programs which provide mother-to-mother counseling, and the special WIC food packages that are available for participants who are exclusively breastfeeding their babies.

March 24, 2019 6:20 a.m. Community Convo's with KimmyB – Caitlin Beck-Stella/JDCH Duration: 0:30:00 minutes

Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital is one of the region's leading pediatric hospitals, offering a comprehensive scope of healthcare services and programs in a child-friendly atmosphere. A full-service hospital, we treat minor illnesses, trauma-related accidents and some of the most complex medical conditions.

TOPIC: Caitlin Beck-Stella, the new President/CEO of Joe Dimaggio Children's Hospital, came in as a highlighted guest for our Women's History Month HERSTORY series. We discussed her education and experience in pediatric healthcare, the role and history of women as it pertains to pediatric medicine, and we discussed at length the unique culture surrounding patient care at JDCH and how the approach of her team is what sets them apart from other pediatric hospitals both here in South Florida and around the country. We also discussed the importance of continuing to expand not just the hospital, but its teaching/residency programs, and the need for more women to pursue careers in STEM fields, especially science as it pertains to medicine and research.

ENVIRONMENT:

January 6, 2019 6:00 a.m. Community Convo's with KimmyB – Urban Oasis Project Duration: 00:45:00 minutes

Located in Miami, Florida, Urban Oasis Project was a volunteer-based group for two years and, in February 2010, incorporated as a Florida not-for-profit organization. At the Urban Oasis Project, they believe that good, clean, healthy food should be accessible to all so we run Farmers Markets, we plant gardens with low-income families, and we support many local farms by bringing their produce to markets. In past years we ran our own farms, but we are focusing on all the other parts of our mission this year. Urban Oasis Project prides itself in being an inclusive non-profit organization, embracing all people who support our mission regardless of religious preferences, sexual orientation, economic status, ethnicity, age, or disability. Urban Oasis experiments with all gardening and farming philosophies that do not harm the environment.

Topic: Art Friedrich, President of UOP, came in to talk about the organization, its programs and many moving pieces. We discussed the importance of ensuring all members of our South Florida community have access to healthy and fresh fruits and vegetables, while teaching about and encouraging sustainability. We talked about the G.I.V.E. Gardens program that provides individuals/families/communities with the tools, resources, and man-power in order to plant individual and community gardens in "food deserts" or areas with limited access to healthy fresh produce. Art also spoke at length on the importance of supporting local growers, encourage environmentally friendly gardening and farming, and working with government agencies to ensure that food vouchers can be used to purchase healthy, organic, and locally grown products. We gave out information on the UOP traveling Farmers markets and on their SNAP and Voucher programs.
