**Duration: 00:20:00 minutes**

Cima Georgevich, local business man, philanthropist, cancer survivor, and co-founder of the March for Cancer Fund and the March for Cancer 5k Walk/Run talks about the creation of the March for Cancer Fund and the upcoming 5K fundraiser.

TOPIC: We discussed in detail Cima's battle with cancer. He had a brain tumor the size of baseball that went undetected for a year. Cima talks about his experience with other patients receiving treatment and the lack of day to day resources and care that many of them experienced. He realized that many people were not as fortunate as he was, they lacked proper transportation to get to and from treatment, many could not maintain their personal hygiene poor hygiene or their home environments due to treatment, and many lacked the financial resources to provide for basic necessities like rent and electricity. That was when Cima decided to set up the March for Cancer Fund in Partnership with Memorial Hospital to help provide individuals fighting the greatest battle of their life with the everyday tools and resources needed to continue fighting. The March for Cancer 5k Walk Run is an annual fundraiser with 100% of the proceeds going back into the March for Cancer Fund.

and participate in their upcoming 5K Walk/Run known Walk Like MADD and MADD Dash Fort Lauderdale, which Heather founded and chairs.

**Community Convo's with KimmyB – The Breanna Vergara Foundation**

**Duration: 00:25:00 minutes**

Alex Casanova, Treasurer of The Breanna Vergara Foundation, talks about the creation and work of the Breanna Vergara Foundation. The BVF is a relatively new 501c3 here in South Florida, but has already helped save the lives of 9 children, through its tireless work educating the community on the importance of EKG's for our children. The foundation has made it their mission to raise awareness about undetected heart conditions in children and the importance of EKG's for kids, especially those that are involved in any sort of athletic activities. They have also committed themselves to raising the funds necessary to not only help provide children with these EKG's, but also to help provide defibrillators to community centers, parks, organizations, and any other place where there could be an incident involving a child's heart.

TOPIC: The purpose of this interview was to help raise awareness about The Breanna Vergara Foundation and the great things they are doing in the community, as well as to help raise awareness about getting our children EKG's. Breanna Vergara was only 11 years old when she collapsed on the floor of her dance studio due to an undetected heart condition known as Wolff-Parkinson-White. There was no defibrillator on site and by the time Breanna reached the hospital she was pronounced dead. Within the first 6 months of her passing Breanna's parents and family had already set up the Breanna Vergara Foundation and have made it their mission to make sure no other family suffers the unnecessary loss of a child due to an undetected or underlying heart issue.
