At the Urban Oasis Project, they believe that good, clean, healthy food should be accessible to all - so we run Farmers Markets, we plant gardens with low-income families, and we support many local farms by bringing their produce to markets. In past years we ran our own farms, but we are focusing on all the other parts of our mission this year. Urban Oasis Project prides itself in being an inclusive non-profit organization, embracing all people who support our mission regardless of religious preferences, sexual orientation, economic status, ethnicity, age, or disability. Urban Oasis experiments with all gardening and farming philosophies that do not harm the environment.
