TFF reaches millions of Floridians through hard-hitting media campaigns, public relations, social media, evidence-based tobacco cessation services, grassroots initiatives, county-level grants that advance tobacco-free policies, a youth-led movement called Students Working Against Tobacco (SWAT), school-based interventions, and surveillance and evaluation to ensure effectiveness.

TOPIC: A counselor who with Tobacco Free Florida (TFF) Group Quit program in partnership with Nova Southeastern University came in to give some backstory on TFF, what types of services they supply, who is eligible to participate, and how people can take advantage of all TFF's FREE programs designed to help individuals quit tobacco.
