As the school season approaches and the pandemic continues, administrators are struggling with plans to educate the nation's children. Dr. O'Leary was an author of new guidelines from the American Academy of Pediatrics that encourages having students physically present in school. He explained why remote learning has largely failed, and emphasized that there are major health, social and educational risks to keeping children at home.</u>

They have experienced the increased need for food, and a decrease of funds to cover those needs. She talked about the many ways citizens of the community can help during the pandemic.

Mental Health Teenagers InfoTrak 08/30/2020 9:31 Christine Carter, PhD, sociologist, Senior Fellow at the Greater Good Science Center at the University of California Berkeley, author of "The New Adolescence: Raising Happy and Successful Teens in an Age of Anxiety and Distraction" Prof. Carter discussed recent parenting research, along with her own real-world experiences as the mother of four teenagers. She also said that teens are struggling more than ever with suicidal thoughts, depression and anxiety, and that many of the challenges facing today's teens didn't exist when their parents were young. She outlined what she believes are the three most critical skills that parents need to teach their kids.

10. Government Funding in Iowa Drivetime Live 09/02/2020 12:30 Senator Chuck Grassly will discuss Derecho Relief for eastern Iowa, RFS and how the parties are working through a potential new stimulus bill that would provide relief during the pandemic.
