CBM Today

Segment: Powdered Alcohol: An ER Visit Waiting to Happen?

Americans will soon have the option of consuming alcohol in a new way. It's called powdered alcohol, or Palcohol, and it's recently been approved by the government. Palcohol comes in a pouch containing the equivalent of a shot and half of freeze-dried alcohol and flavorings. You just add water to create an instant cocktail. Public health officials worry Palcohol makes it easier for minors to get away with drinking. There is also concern that people may use it to invent new ways to abuse alcohol, creating a spike in emergency room visits. But the makers of Palcohol balk at such claims in a video on their website. Some college students say it's particularly dangerous to kids who typically drink too much.

Segment: Using Polio, Measles, HIV Viruses to Treat Cancer

A seemingly radical cancer treatment is working for many patients who have tried it. The new treatment uses viruses as the latest weapon in the fight against different types of cancer. The procedure is still in its trial phase, but various forms of the treatment are being used at several different cancer centers. The Mayo Clinic’s Dr. Stephen Russell is leading the trials. “It’s a very simple concept. Viruses naturally come into the body and they destroy tissue,” he explained. Trials at other medical centers are reporting similar success in treating different cancers with different viruses, such as the polio virus to treat brain tumors and the HIV virus to treat leukemia.

Segment: A Breakthrough in Treatment for Brain Trauma?

Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) is one of the signature wounds of war. It's often caused by being too close to an explosion or blast, and its effects can be devastating, resulting in physical, cognitive, emotional and even behavioral problems. A new therapy, however, is achieving remarkable results in TBI patients, all using hormones. Dr. Mark Gordon developed this hormone therapy after he discovered that TBIs can cause hormonal deficiencies. These deficiencies can result in symptoms that include depression, outbursts of anger, anxiety, mood swings and many others. Gordon's therapy is able to restore hormone levels to their pre-injury levels which results in the recovery of many functions that were lost. However, it is a therapy that many patients will require for life.

Segment: Mother, Child Safety First in Texas Abortion Clinic Ruling

The health and safety of both mothers and their babies was front of mind in a federal court ruling on a Texas abortion clinic law. The law requires clinics to operate under the same state standards as any other clinic offering out-patient procedures. It would ensure that the clinics basically operate under hospital-level standards. The court ruled in the case of "Whole Woman's Health vs. Lakey", that the medical requirement advances Texas' interests in safeguarding maternal health and protecting women from substandard abortion facilities and practices. Pro-Life leaders see it as a victory for women and children.

Segment: FDA Gives Food Industry 3 Years to Dump Trans Fat

The Food and Drug Administration is cracking down on trans fats, saying they must be removed from the food supply within three years. Despite being directly linked to heart disease and other health hazards, trans fat, also known as hydrogenated oils, are in thousands of processed foods. The FDA says food manufacturers have until June of 2018 to get trans fats out of their products. This includes not only products on grocery store shelves, but also in restaurants. However, the FDA says food companies may obtain a waiver to this new rule if they can prove the trans fats are not harmful.
