Their research followed eating habits of more than 126-thousand men and women, over a 32-year period. The doctors found a diet replacement of just five-percent polyunsaturated fats can cut mortality risk by 27-percent. Some of the best sources of polyunsaturated fats are nuts, seeds, fatty fish, algae and leafy greens. And replacing that five percent with mono-unsaturated fats, like olive oil and avocados, can lower your death risk by 13-percent.

Scott said the state has called on the CDC to activate a CDC Emergency Response Team (CERT) to assist the Florida Department of Health and other partners in their investigation, sample collection and mosquito control efforts. The team will consist of public health experts who will augment Florida's response efforts, Scott said.

Dr. Amelie Ramirez, a Mexican-American health researcher at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, has tracked these trends and says there are ways to tackle the rising rates, especially among Hispanic children. A report by Salud America! found 81 percent of Latino neighborhoods do not have access to green spaces such as parks and hiking trails, blue spaces like community pools and municipal recreation facilities like school playgrounds.
Seguridad	Despierta America	09/16/2016	0:55	The Department of Transportation is ordering airline passengers not to bring Samsung Galaxy Note 7 phones on planes unless they keep them turned off and don't charge them during the flight. Passengers also must disable all applications that could inadvertently activate the phone, like an alarm clock; protect the power switch to prevent the phone from being unintentionally turned on; and keep the device in a carry-on baggage or on their person, not in a checked bag. Transportation Secretary Anthony Foxx said in a statement that anyone who travels with the recalled device must take precautions to ensure its safe handling. The Federal Aviation Administration issued a

				warning to passengers about the phones last week. Numerous cases have been reported of the phones exploding and catching fire. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission is issuing an official recall of Samsung's Galaxy Note 7 phone.

More police are being deployed to prominent locations because of concerns of terrorist threats, including some from suspected ISIS supporters in the U.S. who may heed the group's call to carry out attacks. The FBI, Department of Homeland Security and National Counterterrorism Center sent a bulletin that listed the holiday weekend and several upcoming Prophet Mohammed drawing events scheduled in the coming weeks as possible targets for attacks.
Salud	Noticiero Univision	07/15/2016	1:42	New York City's health department on Friday reported the first documented case of sexual transmission of Zika from a woman to her male partner, raising new concerns about the spread of the virus, which is typically contracted through mosquito bites. Scientists say it may take years to fully understand how long individuals who are infected with Zika are capable of transmitting the virus, the first mosquito-borne disease ever shown to cause birth defects after a pregnant woman becomes infected. U.S. researchers have begun studying how long the virus can survive in semen to gauge the risk. All previously reported cases of sexual transmission were spread from men who had traveled to a Zika outbreak area to a female or male sex partner who had not. Such cases have been reported in at least 11 countries, including the United States and France.
Salud	Noticiero Univision	08/01/2016	1:53	Governor Rick Scott announced that the Florida Department of Health (DOH) has identified 10 additional people in Florida with the Zika virus who likely contracted it through a mosquito bite. This brings the total number of people with locally transmitted Zika to 14. DOH believes that active transmissions of the Zika virus are still only occurring in the one small area in Miami-Dade County, just north of downtown, that was announced on Friday (see map below). This remains the only area of the state where DOH has confirmed there are ongoing local transmissions of Zika. Among the 10 new individuals announced today, six are asymptomatic and were identified from the door-to-door community survey that DOH is conducting. Following today's announcement, Governor Scott has called upon the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to activate a CDC Emergency Response Team (CERT) to assist the Florida Department of Health and other partners in their investigation, sample collection, and mosquito control efforts.

Consumers should immediately stop using and power down the recalled phones, the government said. The lithium-ion battery in the Galaxy Note 7 smartphones can overheat and catch fire. Samsung has received 92 reports of the batteries overheating in the U.S., including 26 reports of burns and 55 reports of property damage.
Salud	Noticiero Univision	09/16/2016	2:00	Brain cancer is now the leading cause of childhood cancer deaths in the United States, ahead of leukemia as a result of better treatments for leukemia and a frustrating lack of progress in the field of brain cancer. Cancer is the fourth leading cause of death in Americans in general children, representing approximately one of every 10 child deaths in 2014. About a quarter of those cancer deaths (534) were due to brain cancer. There were 445 deaths from leukemia in the same year. Unintentional injuries remain the leading cause of death in children under 19 years, followed by suicide and murder, according to the report. There are more new cases of leukemia are still new cases of brain cancer every year, but no longer represent the largest number of deaths. This is due to advances in the treatment of leukemia in recent decades and that leukemia is easier to fight brain cancer, experts say.
