### **3- Swing Bed Program Available at Crossing Rivers Health**

Crossing Rivers Health is proud to offer a Swing Bed Program in our community. Swing Bed is for patients who need additional short-term rehabilitation care following an acute hospital stay. The goal of this program is to help patients return to their homes or with the support of other community resources if needed. The Swing Bed program allows patients to transition, or “swing,” from acute hospital care to rehabilitation and skilled nursing care without leaving the hospital.

### **5- City of Prairie Du Chien Meet About 350 Years Celebration**

The Prairie du Chien Common Council met Tuesday night and approved several events for this upcoming summer, including the 350th anniversary celebration of Marquette and Joliet's expedition sponsored by Prairie du Chien Main Street. That event is scheduled for June 17th

and 18th. The council also approved the Prairie Villa Rendezvous and Prairie du Chien Fire Association's Flea Market that same weekend. The Fire Department will also be observing the department's 150th anniversary the weekend of July 14th through the 16th. Plans are also underway for Prairie du Chien to host the Great Lakes WaterCross Jet Ski Races at the St. Feriole Island Beach/Villa Boat landing and Parking Lot June 23rd through the 25th. The council also approved a 20 percent increase in sewer usage rates septic haulers; and also approved using General Engineering for commercial building inspections. The city will continue using General Engineering for residential inspections.

### **-Platteville Man Still Missing**

It's been nearly a month since a Platteville man was reported missing. 34 year old Ronald Henry was reported missing on December 7th and has not yet been found. The Grant County Sheriff's Department has enlisted the help of the Wisconsin Division of Criminal Investigation to conduct a series of interviews with people who knew or had contact with Henry in the Grant County area. Detectives are analyzing information from those interviews to determine whether any information is relevant to the investigation. The Sheriff's Office is also preparing to do another area search where Henry was last seen utilizing aircraft, K9 teams, and personnel. The case will remain an active investigation until Ronald Henry is located.

### **17- UW-Richland Students Argue to Keep Their Campus Open**

The argument from Richland Center residents that their community needs a college campus continues. Dozens of people, including a few students at UW-Richland pressed lawmakers yesterday to keep the campus open. The university's president announced in November that the campus would close, in part because there are just 60 students on campus. Community members said the decision is unfair. State Senator Howard Marklein says he wants to keep the campus open, but says the university's president didn't ask for his input. The Richland campus is set to close at the end of the spring semester.

### **20- Energizer Closing Fennimore Plant**

Fennimore could be losing a major employer. In a press release, the International Brotherhood of Teamsters said that Energizer has announced intentions to close its battery plants in Fennimore and Portage. The press release says Energizer told the Teamsters it plans to close the plants in the next 12-24 months, and that it plans to send some of the jobs overseas and send others to a nonunion facility in North Carolina. Nearly 600 Wisconsin workers at the two plants are members of Teamsters Local 695. The local plant produces batteries for Energizer's retail brands, including Eveready and Rayovac, and specialty batteries for hearing aids.

### **27- Mississippi Queen Casino Moving to Dry Land**

After nearly 30 years floating on the Mississippi in Marquette, the Casino Queen will be coming to dry land. Casino owner Queen Casino & Entertainment, said in a news release yesterday that they have received approval from the Iowa Racing & Gaming Commission to move to a dry-land site at 100 Anti Monopoly Street in Marquette. The company said it will add more than 12,000 square feet to an existing dockside building to accommodate the 17,000-square-foot casino, which will have more than 400 slot machines, two new blackjack tables and other games, a new main entrance, dining areas and a sports bar. Once the Casino Queen moves to it's new facility, there will be just two riverboat casinos left in Iowa.

### **-Milk Prices Down in 2022**

Dairy farmers across Wisconsin got less for their milk to end last year, but it's more than they were getting a year-ago. The USDA released its latest milk price report yesterday. The report says Wisconsin dairy farmers got 23-dollars and 30-cents per hundredweight in December of last year. That's down 30 cents from November of last year, but a dollar-80 more than farmers got back in December of 2021. Nationally, milk was \$24.70 per hundredweight to end 2022, compared to \$21.70 at the end of 2021.

## **21- Coon Valley Women Arrested in Desoto on Drug Charges**

Waters was charged with possession with intent to deliver methamphetamine, possession of methamphetamine, possession of methamphetamine near the Jail, possession of THC, and drug paraphernalia, and operating with a restricted controlled substance 4th offense.

## **-Missing Grant County Man Found Dead**

The body of a man who had been missing in Grant County since December was found Sunday afternoon. The Grant County Sheriff's Office says that a teen walking in the woods looking for deer antlers found a body in a ravine. Grant County Detectives determined the body was that of Ronald Henry, who had gone missing on December 5. An autopsy will be conducted later this week to determine the cause of death. The location was about a mile south of the residence where he was last seen and was just outside the 28 hundred acre search conducted in January. There are 3 or 4 different properties between where he was found and the residence where he went missing from. A phone was located near Henry's body and will be analyzed. The investigation remains open and more information will be released when the autopsy is complete.

## **9-Congressman Van Orden Wants to Keep Milk-Milk**

Congressman Derrick Van Orden wants to make it clear that milk comes from animals, not plants. Van Orden signed-on to the Dairy Pride Act. That's the federal plan to classify milk as coming from cows or other animals only. He says Wisconsin dairy farmers work incredibly hard to produce top-quality milk and he doesn't want to see nut-based or vegetable-based products horn-in on their success. Wisconsin's dairy groups are all in agreement. The Dairy Pride Act comes not long after the FDA said nut-milk producers can continue to call their products 'milk.'
