





On Thursday, October 6, 2016 at 5pm, **WDTN News** reported, the number of Americans seeking unemployment benefits last week fell to the lowest level since mid-April. The Labor Department reports weekly applications for jobless aid slid by 5-thousand to a seasonally adjusted 248-thousand. The less volatile four-week average dropped 253-thousand-500. The lowest level since December 19-73. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, October 21, 2016 at 6pm, **WDTN News** reported, Ohio unemployment is up slightly, and so is the National unemployment rate. New numbers today show, unemployment in Ohio in September was 4-point-8 percent. That's up from 4 point 7 percent in August. The National number is 5 percent. That's up from 4-point-9. Ohio added jobs in financial, professional and business services. It lost jobs in leisure and hospitality, construction and manufacturing. This report lasted 20 seconds.

It stems from a meeting last month where the school board said it was going to cut at least 20 jobs from the district. In Thursday's discussion, the board said those positions may not be cut at all this year. Some parents say they understand cuts may eventually need to be made because of declining enrollment, but they want to fully understand what's happening. This report lasted 30 seconds.

On Tuesday, December 6, 2016, at 6pm, **WDTN News** reported, we've told you the district says its elementary schools are overcrowded due to a higher

enrollment and keeping grade six at that level. The Springfield Board of Education met today to discuss six options to fix this problem. We asked and they told us they didn't take any action this morning because they don't like any of those options. They'll discuss what's the next step at the next board meeting, Thursday at 6P-M. On Friday, December 23, 2016, at 4:30am, **WDTN News** reported, the age requirements to begin school in Beavercreek are changing for the new school year. The Board of Education approved a change to the entrance age for incoming Kindergarten and first-grade students. On Monday, October 10, 2016, at 5pm, **WDTN News** reported, and number five, an increase in the number of children at St. Vincent De Paul Homeless Shelter. This time of year, they usually house 60 kids. But lately, it's been 100. They don't know what's behind the increase, but they're calling on you to help. To find out how, go to WDTN.com. And that's a look at our top five stories today. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Tuesday, October 18, 2016, at 6pm, **WDTN News** reported, the President of the Downtown Dayton Partnership says the current vacancy rate downtown is 3-point-5 percent. Demand for housing right now is higher than the options available. For example, The Water Street Flats opened in early summer. They're almost full today. This report lasted 15 seconds.

On Wednesday, October 20, 2016, at 11pm, **WDTN News** reported, home sales in the Dayton-area are on the rise. According to the Dayton Area Board of Realtors. Homes and condos for the month of September reached sales of 216-million dollars. That's up 13-percent from the same time last year. The average price for a home was about 146-thousand dollars. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Thursday, October 27, 2016 at 6pm, **WDTN News** reported, the Community Action Partnership's "Home Weatherization Assistance Program" has made more than 13-thousand homes in the Miami Valley ready for winter. It helps save income-eligible families on their energy bills and makes homes safer. This report lasted 15 seconds.

On Monday, October 31, 2016 at 4:30am, **WDTN News** reported, nearly 800 homes in Flint, Michigan will receive new water pipes today in light of the Flint River water crisis. Mayor Karen Weaver is kicking off the third phase of her fast start initiative to restore clean drinking water to residents. This phase of the project will cost the State of Michigan 25-million dollars. Students at Wayne State University will be testing the water in homes before and after the pipes are replaced as part of a study funded by the National Institute of Health. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Thursday, November 17, 2016, at 11pm, **WDTN News** reported, a high demand to live in Downtown Dayton has several new housing developments sprouting up. The Flats at South Park on Warren Street and are set to begin construction next year. Delco Lofts will also be moving in the Old Delco Factory as well. That will become 132 residential units. The Downtown Dayton Partnership says current downtown housing is 97 percent full. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, November 18, 2016, at 5pm, **WDTN News** reported, a few dozen people were sleeping outside to raise awareness for the homeless population in the Miami Valley. Some gathered around a small fire as part of Homefull's Sleep Out Night. Homefull has a goal of ending homelessness by providing housing services, advocacy and education. The event was highlighted by an informative movie, some reflection time and the night out. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Friday, December 2, 2016, at 5pm, **WDTN News** reported, nearly two dozen people are homeless after a fire tore through eight row houses in Pennsylvania overnight. Police say the flames burst through the roof before spreading to the other homes. Firefighters battled the blaze for more than four hours before they were able to bring the fire under control. There were no injuries reported. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Friday, December 5, 2016, at 4:30am, **WDTN News** reported, people in Gatlinburg, Tennessee, are taking a first look at their homes ravaged by wildfires. The town is still closed to the outsiders, but some residents are now allowed to go and check on their houses. A massive wildfire burned hundreds of homes in the resort town last week. At least thirteen people were killed in Eastern Tennessee and dozens more were injured. Officials say they are still searching the area for more victims. Wildfires have been burning across the southeast for weeks, fueled by the worst drought in almost a decade. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Monday, December 19, 2016, at 5pm, **WDTN News** reported, a Dayton-area Non-profit has broken ground in Kettering on a low-income housing development. Miami Valley Housing Opportunity purchased the land in the 39-hundred block of Wilmington Pike. The organization is working open a three-story apartment building by next summer. The development will provide permanent, supportive housing for homeless men and women staying in Montgomery County Shelters. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Monday, October 3, 2016, at 5pm, **WDTN News** reported, Kids who have used certain forms of alternative medicine are less likely to get a flu shot. Researchers studied nine-thousand children between the ages of four and 17. Overall 43-percent had gotten the flu vaccine within the past year. But children who had ever been treated by a chiropractor, acupuncturist or massage therapist had lower vaccine rates. This report lasted 25 seconds.

On Monday, October 17, 2016, at 11pm, **WDTN News** reported, bringing Halloween to kids at Nationwide Children's Hospital. That was the goal of a party in Columbus this afternoon. The mission: to make hospitals a little less scary for patients and provide a little fun. The story tonight is new at 11. This report lasted 15 seconds.

On Friday, October 21, 2016, at 5pm, **WDTN News** reported, things getting back to normal tonight in Northeast Kansas, where a chemical spill caused a noxious cloud and forced a school and nearby resident to evacuate. Sulfuric acid and hypochlorite were mistakenly combined at a plant about 50 miles Northeast of Kansas City. 18 people suffered respiratory problems and were taken to area hospitals. A new government report says health insurance premiums under the Affordable Care Act will rise sharply. Open enrollment begins one week from today and patients may get a surprise. On Sunday, October 16, 2016, at 6pm, **WDTN News** reported, Central Vietnam has been hit by floods that killed 21 people with another eight missing. Vietnamese television reported today heavy rains have caused in several areas. After nearly a week of rain, over 100-thousand homes were underwater. Now they're facing a new problem, a possible typhoon. Forecasts show one could hit the region in the next few days. This report lasted 20 seconds.

On Tuesday, October 18, 2016, at 5pm, **WDTN News** reported, some hurricane Matthew victims in North Carolina say FEMA is not doing enough to help them rebuild their lives. One resident spent the morning cleaning out her first floor apartment. She, like many others, had no flood insurance and says money from government agencies will not be enough to start over. This report lasted 20 seconds.
