Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Veterans Affairs:** With Veterans Day in November, community members have asked WTL to highlight the importance of this holiday.
- B. Drug Addiction:** To coincide with Red Ribbon Week, WTL created programming that discussed drugs and drug addictions.
- C. WTL Involvement:** With eighth grade students beginning the registration process, WTL has taken steps to provide information on the station to this section of the community
- D. LTHS Football:** The community, as always, asks that WTL provides live play-by-play coverage of LTHS Football and again this Fall/Winter WTL was able to meet this need.

Section II. Responsive Programs

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below:

A. Veterans Affairs

“People, Topics and Issues” Broadcast – On Wednesday, November 16 from 7-8pm, WTL hosted a program that focused on the importance of Veterans Day. Aside from LTHS student reporters looking at this topic, WTL welcomed Chuck Bosko, US Army veteran and member of the local American Legion post in to the studio to discuss this and other veteran’s affairs issues.

B. Drug Addiction:

Special Broadcast. – On Monday, October 24, WTL aired an interview with a former LTHS student who is a recovering heroin addict. This interview looked at the troubles he faced and his road to recovery. A current LTHS student conducted the interview and many questions were geared towards the subject about why students should stay away from illegal drugs.

WLTl also broadcast later that evening from a dance/celebration for LTHS students in support of the new school year from 6 to 9:30pm

C. WLTl Involvement

Future Freshman Night: WLTl always receives an influx of calls and emails from eighth grade students and parents asking how they can get involved in this, their school radio station, when they attend LTHS in 2012-2013. In order to meet this need, WLTl broadcast live from the LTHS Future Freshman Night on Wednesday, December 5 from 6:30-9pm at South Campus. While there, students could sign-up to join WLTl (as well as other LTHS clubs).
