The communities of Hornbrook, Hilt, Coletin and Irongate are all under evacuation order with advisories being issued in the surrounding California/Oregon Border. The evacuation shelter for this fire is at the Jackson Street Elementary school 405 Jackson street. And Ashland High School at 201 South Mountain Avenue. Large animals can be taken to the Siskiyou county fairgrounds at 1712 Fairlane Road. Ager Road is closed at Klamath on, Shelly CopCo, and I-5 Ditch Creek Road. There are over 1,000 fire personnel working on this fire and the temperature and dry conditions aren't being helpful.

The Shasta County Sheriff's Office has issued immediate evacuation orders due to a fire burning in Montgomery Creek. The orders have been issued for residents of Windy Point Road, Crestline Road, Hunt Road, Dunn Moody Road, and all residents in the Montgomery Creek area including the school. Evacuees can go to the evacuation center set up at Shasta High School, located at 2500 Eureka Way in Redding. This is a developing story and we will update you with any important information as it comes in.

It's only 10 percent contained and still threatening almost 200 other structures. Mandatory evacuation orders are in place for Lower Springs Road and west, as well as all roads coming off Rock Creek Road and Iron Mountain Road. The communities of Old Shasta, Keswick and French Gulch are also included. And if you live along Highway 299 west of Trinity Mountain Road to the base of Buckhorn Summit or along Whiskey Creek Road including the boat launch/day use areas you should be evacuated as well. If you live in west Redding, the CHP is saying to start packing and be prepared. They say the fire is out of control. Cal Fire says the blaze is currently at Iron Mountain Road. Between the visitor center and Iron Mountain Road. The fire is only on the north side of Highway 299. Evacuation centers are open. Shasta High School in Redding is one and there is another one in Weaverville at Weaverville Elementary.

We want to give you an update tonight on the Carr Fire. It's grown to nearly 30,000 acres and the containment area has fallen from earlier in the day, to only 6%. Additional evacuation orders were issued tonight. They include: South along Swasey Dr from SR 299 to Placer Rd. West along Placer Rd From Swasey Dr to Prospect Dr. North from Prospect Dr to encompass Middle Park Ranch Land Area West of Overhill Dr and North of SR 299. North of SR 299 and West of Spinmaker Rd to the end of Harlan Dr. Keswick Dam East to Counter Lane, North to Quartz Hill Rd. Evacuation centers are open. If you live east of Trinity Mountain road, use the evacuation center at Shasta College in Redding. West of Trinity Mountain Road use the evacuation center at Weaverville Elementary School in Weaverville. SR 299 is closed at Buckhorn at the Shasta/Trinity

					County line and on SR 299 at JFK Drive in Whiskeytown. Trinity Mountain Road at SRR 299 and Whiskey Creek Road at SR 299 are also closed.

Winds reaching 60 mph are creating firenadoes strong enough to turn over vehicles. Residents in Northwest Redding are now under evacuation orders. The California Highway Patrol is now going door to door to assist in evacuations. Those new evacuation orders are for: Neighborhoods along Quartz Hill Road, Lake Blvd, areas W of N Market St between Caterpillar and Lake Blvd. Neighborhoods W of Market Rd between the Sacramento River and Lake Blvd, including Benton Drive, Lake Redding Drive, Quartz Hill Road North side of Eureka Way (Hwy 299) west of Overhill Drive. All neighborhoods west of Buenaventura Blvd between Eureka Way and Hwy 273; including Lake Mary, Cumberland, and Country Heights neighborhoods. Fire crews are coming in from all over the state and an assist from the National Guard is underway. Cal-Fire says right now they are in life-saving mode, not so much fighting the fire, but to make sure people are getting out of the fire's path. They say the fire is moving at speeds and in ways they haven't seen in the area. Remember, SR 299 is closed at Douglass City, so those trying to head to Redding from the coast will have to find a different route heading east. Please lift up a prayer for those affected, including the first responders. We'll update you with more as conditions warrant.

Cal Fire says there are other injuries but hasn't said how many or how severe. Shasta Lake residents have also been told to evacuate. Keswick, and Summit City. Those of us living in French Gulch have also been told to leave. Evacuation centers have been set up at Shasta College. and at Weaverville Elementary School. A shelter for large animals has been set up at the Redding Rodeo Grounds... and a shelter for small animals at Haven Humane on East Side Drive in Redding. Highway 299 at Buckhorn is closed... and 299 at JFK Drive. Also, Trinity Mountain Road at 299... and Whiskey Creek Road at 299 are closed. A red flag warning and excessive heat warning will remain in effect today... The aggressive blaze has grown to 48,000 acres and over 500 structures have been destroyed including the homes of Redding Police Chief Roger Moore and two other police officers. The fire is only 5% contained at this time and still threatens almost 5,000 structures along its current path. Two firefighters have died and 3 more have been injured. 38,000 people have been evacuated so far. The Shasta County Sheriff's Office has issued mandatory evacuation orders for Lower Springs Road and westward, as well as all roads coming off Rock Creek Road and Iron Mountain Road. Also included in the current evacuation areas are the communities of Old Shasta, Keswick and French Gulch as well those living along Highway 299 west of Trinity Mountain Road to the base of Buckhorn Summit and along Whiskey Creek Road including the <i>boat launch/day use areas</i> . If you live in west Redding, the CHP says to pack up and be prepared. They warn that the Carr Fire is an out of control and very unpredictable fire. The fast-moving fire has nearly doubled in size overnight to over 80,000 acres, fire officials say this morning. Still only 5% contained and around 5000 more structures threatened on its current path. The most active parts of the Carr Fire remain in areas northwest and west of Redding, including French Gulch and now Igo and Ono have been added to the evacuation list. Law enforcement has been going door-to-door overnight urging people to leave those areas. According to the CHP, from Placer Road at the Clear Creek Bridge, the fire was moving west, away from Redding and fire crews were moving into that area attempting to build containment lines. Fire officials reported some decrease in the ferociousness of the fire activity in and around the city of Redding last night,

					<p>but today's forecast of gusty winds and hot temperatures is likely to change that with fire officials being told to expect it to pick up again by early afternoon. A heat advisory is in place until tonight, and a Red Flag Warning remains in effect until tomorrow morning, according to the National Weather Service. In the most populated areas, the goal is to keep the fire north of Clear Creek Road and west of Interstate 5. They also want to keep it from crossing into Trinity County near Hoadley Peak, which has communication towers, and from going farther north than Big Gulch, a remote area near the county line to the west of Lake Shasta. New closures issued by the CHP this morning include: Highway 299 at Overhill Drive, Placer Road at Cloverdale Road, Highway 299 at Sunset Drive, Buenaventura Boulevard at Teton Drive, River Park Drive at Benton Drive, Buenaventura Boulevard at Canyon Creek Road, Pine Grove Avenue at Lake Boulevard, Placer Road at Cloverdale Road Evacuation shelters are set up for people and animals. For evacuees, shelters are set up at Shasta College, Crosspointe Community Church and Grace Baptist Church both in Redding and Weaverville Elementary. The fast-moving fire has consumed nearly 84,000 acres with still only 5% containment. Thousands of homes still threatened as the fire continues to spread in various directions, but away from the city of Redding at this point. Let's start with some encouraging news. EVACUATION ORDERS HAVE BEEN LIFTED FOR a number of locations as of last night. Residents may return to their homes: Canyon Road, Ranchette Drive, Prospectors Road, Copper Drive, Valley View Road, Silverado Drive, Windsor Lane, Redbank Road. On the flip side, the newest list of evacuation areas <b>include</b> Hwy 299 at Trinity Dam Road west to Douglas City. Trinity Dam Road Blvd to Hwy 3 including all residences within Lewiston area to Trail Drive. All roads and streets west of Trinity Dam Blvd and east of Lewiston Road Deadwood Road east of Trinity Dam Blvd. All residences on Baker Road including Cooper Gulch, Posey Road, Lakeview Terrace and Pine Cove Marina including Eagle Mountain Road among many others. Those lists are long, so check carefully and don't hesitate to evacuate to a safe area. Evacuation centers available include a new one at Foothill High School - Simpson University, Crosspointe Community Church Grace Baptist Church (all in Redding), Evacuating with animals? Redding Rodeo Grounds-will take pets/large animals. Tehama County Fairgrounds in Red Bluff will take large animals/livestock. Weaverville Elementary evac center has been moved to Trinity High School as of last night to accommodate more evacuees. Centers that are at capacity include Shasta College and Rolling Hills Casino. They are shascom911.com and the Shasta County Sheriff's page. The lists are long, so check carefully and don't hesitate to evacuate to a safe area if you're the least bit unsure. Some good news is the addition of evacuation centers. Evac centers are now located at Simpson College, Cross Point Community Church and Shasta College, all in Redding. Foothill High School in Palo Cedro and at Trinity High School in Weaverville. The Red Cross is asking for donations for evacuees.

Cal Fire says the Carr Fire's about 17% contained, and they're hopeful to see those containment percentages increases. About 3,000 firefighters are battling the flames with helicopters, fire engines and ground crews. The fire remains very dangerous and could turn for the worse at any time. 38,000 of us remain evacuated and at least 6 people have lost their lives... the latest, a grandmother and her two grandkids. More than 95,000 acres have been burnt. 650 structures have been destroyed and thousands more are in harms way. Dozens of roads are still closed, but some evacuation orders have been lifted in some areas. Redding Police, the Shasta County Sheriff and CHP have all beefed up patrolling in evacuated areas due to reports of looting. Police say they're taking a "no tolerance stance" and warn anyone not supposed to be in certain areas, they could be arrested. Shasta County Fire Department Chief said they understand how it feels to be evacuated because a lot of them have also been forced from their homes, but says, they're moving as fast as they can to let people back into their homes. Cal Fire says high winds, high temperatures and dry vegetation still have the potential to fuel more fire growth. No word yet though, when they think the fire will be brought under control.

Mandatory evacuations remain in place. And please evacuate when told to do so. A sixth life was lost over the weekend. The man refused to evacuate his home. Fire and police say by not evacuating, you're not only putting your own life, but the lives of first responders on the line. Evacuation shelters are open Crosspointe Community Church, Simpson University, Trinity High and Foothill High. Shasta Community College is full. If you have large animals, you can bring them to the Redding Rodeo Grounds and small ones can be brought to Haven Humane. Convoy of Hope is bringing a disaster services team and two tractor trailers of emergency supplies to Redding. They'll be working with churches and partners to set up distribution hubs soon. We'll continue to keep you updated as we pray for everyone involved.

If you live in one of these areas you may return home: Eureka Way to Buenaventura Blvd, Buenaventura Blvd from Hwy 299 (Eureka Way) to Hwy 273, Teton Road including the White Hawk Subdivision, Canyon Creek Drive including the Country Heights Subdivision, All surface streets off Westside Road including El Reno Lane, Kenyon Drive, Branstetter Lane and Cedars Road, Branstetter Lane to Texas Spring Road encompassing roads on Branstetter Lane Hwy 273 at Westwood Drive including The Westwood Subdivision, Clear Creek Road from Hwy 273 to Honey Bee Road. Over 700 homes have been lost and another hundred have been damaged. The fire is 20% contained and has burned almost 99,000 acres. We're praying for good news as these people return home and were keeping all first responders and evacuees in our prayers.

Evacuations remain in place for many of us in Shasta County, Redding and Trinity County. Last night crews continued to face challenges of steep terrain, erratic wind and previously unburned fuels, which contributed to spot fire potential. Today they'll continue to create control and contingency lines to help stop the fire from spreading. Some repopulation notices have been sent out and as conditions improve more will be ordered. The first of two trucks from Convoy of Hope will arrive today in Redding. They'll have 80,000 pounds of food, water and supplies for firefighters and evacuees.

A wildfire has been reported in that area, the Delta Fire was first reported as a 50-acre fire but has grown to about five hundred acres. It seems to be a very fast-moving fire just north of Redding. There are reports indicating a second fire has broken out near the Delta Fire but it's not very clear whether that's just part of the Delta Fire or not. Evacuations have been ordered near Fawndale. An evacuation center has been set up at the Mt. Sasta community building on 629 Alder Street. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.

I-5 has been closed - northbound at Fawndale Road and southbound at Mott Road, as the fire is burning on both sides of the highway. It's unknown how long I-5 will be closed. Evacuations have been ordered near Fawndale. Castle Rock Union Elementary School will be closed tomorrow. An evacuation center has been set up at the Mount Shasta Community Center on 629 Alder Street. Full air and ground response is in place. 600 personnel are assigned to the fire. Please be praying for the first responders and for residents affected by the fire. The cause of the fire is still under investigation.
Public Safety	BREAKAWAY News KKLC	9/6	5:50 am	20 seconds	I-5 remains closed as the fire burns on both sides of the freeway near the Vollmers Exit, north of Lakehead. The interstate has been shut down from 10 miles north of Redding at Fawndale, to about 3-and-a-half miles south of Mt Shasta, at Mott Road. The fire's now at 5000 acres, moving mostly to the north, destroying brush and timber in steep terrain. CHP says several trucks have been destroyed and at least 2 people appear to have lost their homes. Evacuation warnings have been issued in Dunsmuir. Shasta County Sheriffs have told people to leave their homes on both sides of I-5, north of Lakehead to the Shasta/Siskiyou county line. An Evacuation center has been set up at the Mt Shasta Community Center, at 629 Alder Street in Mt. Shasta. Right now, there's about 600 firefighters here trying to put out the fire... It's not known exactly how the fire started, but they suspect it was man-made. Warm temperatures and low humidity is making it hard for fire crews to get the fire under control... Also, smoke is likely to continue to be an issue today, as fire crews work to get the fire under control. No word yet though, on when that might happen.

Delta was initially reported just after one yesterday afternoon, but the fast-moving fire continued to grow at a rapid rate over night and through this morning. The five is still closed just ten miles north of Redding at Fawndale Road. Several hundred firefighters are working to contain Delta, they are currently coordinating with Shasta County's Sheriff for evacuations. Some of those include residents along I-5 from exit seven oh seven at vollmers to exit seven fourteen at Gibson. Evacuations have been

					ordered for residents around East Fork Road to Ram shorn. Sheriff's deputies for Siskiyou County say they have an evacuation warning in place for all residents of Dunsmuir. As for shelters, one has been set up at the Mt Shasta Community Center six-twenty-nine All Der Street in Mount Shasta. And small animals can be taken to the Mt Shasta Humane Society at twelve oh eight Mt Shasta Boulevard. Firefighters are working quickly to protect life and property, but they are expecting hot and dry temperatures with wind gusts which could become problematic. They are however activating both air assets and dozers to create control lines and attack the blaze from the air. Residents however are asked to please stay away so crews can work.

It's now at 22,000 acres with 0% containment. I-5 remains closed - northbound at Fawndale Road and southbound at Mott Road, as the fire is burning on both sides of the highway. Alternate routes will be needed if heading north into Oregon or heading south from Oregon into California. Likely the easiest will be highway 89/ 299 detour or head to the coast and use highway 101/199 to bypass the fire. Numerous evacuations have been ordered in Shasta and Trinity Counties. The Siskiyou County Sheriff's Office has issued an evacuation warning for all residents of Dunsmuir. An evacuation center has been set up at the Mount Shasta Community Center on 629 Alder Street. Small animals can be taken to the Siskiyou Humane Society in Mt. Shasta. Full air and ground response is in place. Over 1,200 personnel are assigned to the fire. Please be praying for the first responders and for residents affected by the fire. The cause of the fire has been determined to be human caused. And again, for those heading north or south on Interstate 5, you'll need to take lengthy alternate routes to get around the Delta Fire.

One lane in each direction opened earlier this morning with some restrictions. No vehicles carrying potential flammable materials will be allowed along a 17-mile stretch between Antlers Bridge in Lakehead and Flume Creek Road. Even vehicles carrying hay, wood chips, lumber and logs won't be allowed.
