Dana began her career as a producer on ABC's Nightline with Ted Koppel. She also served as executive producer of the debate "Men Are Finished," which was nationally broadcast on TV and NPR.

7-4-21 Annette Holt -First Deputy Commissioner Chicago Fire Department.

Annette Holt never knew a female firefighter when she was growing up. Nor had she ever met an African-American firefighter. It's all the more reason, why she had to join the department. She was recently named First Deputy Commissioner of the Chicago Fire Department. She is the first female to hold the number two position in the CFD.

7-5-21 Christie Hefner Former Chairman & CEO, Playboy Enterprises

Christie Hefner spent more than two decades with Playboy Enterprises, working her way up to Chairman of the Board and CEO in 1988. During her tenure, she grew the company's international and electronic division, and expanded the brand to include television and the web, the first for any magazine. In early 2009, she stepped down from her position at Playboy to focus more time on her charitable work and philanthropy. She was named executive chairman of Canyon Ranch Enterprises in 2011, and after leaving four years later, became chairman of Hatch Beauty

7-6-21 Mireya Mayor Primatologist, Conservationist, Explorer, TV Host Mireya Mayor is a scientist, anthropologist and a wildlife correspondent for National Geographic. The mother of six children is credited with discovering a new species of lemur while on one of her expeditions in Madagascar. She is also the author of Pink Boots and a Machete: My Journey From NFL Cheerleader to National Geographic Explorer.

7-7-21 Alisha Elenz, Executive Chef, mfk.

As the executive chef at mfk., Alisha Elenz leads a team that has earned three of Michelin's prestigious Bib Gourmand awards. A self-taught chef, Elenz worked her way up the ladder – maintaining that when you're thrown into uncharted or uncertain territory, you have to take a leap of faith and dive in headfirst.

7-8-21 Ava Blaser Dancer, Childhood Cancer Advocate

Trask has also written a book, You Negotiate Like a Girl, on her experience as an executive in the NFL.

7-10-21 Sherry Yard 3X James Beard Winner, Chef, Author

Sherry Yard is the recipient of three James Beard awards and has worked for 20 years alongside Wolfgang Puck. Also an author, Yard has published Desserts by the Yard; From Brooklyn to Beverly Hills; Recipes from the Sweetest Life Ever; and The Secrets of Baking: Simple Techniques for Sophisticated Desserts.

7-11-21 Katharine Zaleski Founder, Power To Fly

7-13-21 Kelly Pope Accountant and Professor

Kelly received her doctorate in accounting from Virginia Tech, where she began her teaching career. Pope is now an associate professor at DePaul University in Chicago and is an expert on fraud and ethics. Her research led to producing and directing the award-winning documentary All the Queen's Horses, which explores the biggest municipal fraud case in U.S. history.

7-14-21 Antonia Lofaso- Chef

Antonia Lofaso is a successful restaurateur and chef, cookbook author and TV personality. Lofaso has appeared on Top Chef: Chicago and Top Chef: All Stars.

7-15-21 Christy Webber- President, Christy Webber Landscape

Christy Webber always planned to be a P.E. teacher but after just one year, she was reevaluating what to do with her life. She started a mowing business in the Chicago area. The modest

company that began with two employees and a lawnmower has now grown into a multi-million dollar corporation employing more than 400 people, with high-profile clients ranging from The United Center, both Midway and O'Hare Airports, Navy Pier and Millennium Park.

7-16-21 Nancy Faust- former organist Chicago White Sox

For 40 years Nancy Faust was the lady behind the organ at all Chicago White Sox games. She retired in 2010. She was credited with creating the "walk-up" song back in 1970, when she began playing each player's home state song as they walked up to the plate.

7-17-21 Kelly Wallace- Journalist

Kelly Wallace began working in news as a producer for CNN in 1990. While at CNN she held a variety of roles; TV correspondent, digital correspondent and editor-at-large for CNN Digital, focusing on women's issues. She previously worked for CBS Evening News and IVillage, and in early 2019, was named managing director of TrailRunner International, a global strategic & communications advisory firm.

7-18-21 Eleni Pappas Assistant Fire Chief, Los Angeles County Fire Department Inspired by real-life events in 1992 watching Los Angeles burn during the civil unrest caused by the Rodney King beating, Eleni Pappas knew right then that she wanted to become a firefighter. Five years later, Pappas was working for the Los Angeles Fire Department. In 2001, she joined the Los Angeles County Fire Department. In August 2018, she made history by becoming the first female promoted to Assistant Fire Chief in her county.

7-19-21 Thea Flaum- Executive Producer, "Sneak Previews"

Thea Flaum began her career as a TV producer and is best known for creating Sneak Previews, the movie review show hosted by the late movie critics Roger Ebert and Gene Siskel. Currently, she is the President of the Hill Foundation, an organization she began with her husband that helps families facing spinal cord injuries.

7-20-21 Antoinette Alcazar- Patrol Officer Chicago Police Department

Antoinette Alcazar is a patrol officer with the Chicago Police Department. She moved to the U.S. when she was 11 years old as a political refugee from Chile. Later in life, Alcazar struggled as a mom in a bad marriage and survived cancer. A self-taught artist, she also enjoys expressing herself through her painting.

7-21-21 Flo Mitchell Brown- Media Entrepreneur

Flo Mitchell-Brown is a media entrepreneur who in 2015 was elected as part of the Board of Directors of the New York Women in Film and Television, where she supports, trains and develops women in leadership positions in the entertainment industry.

7-22-21 Alexa James -Executive Director of National Alliance Mental Illness Chicago Beginning her career as a social worker, Alexa James soon realized that the public needed to be educated on the country's mental health system and trained on how to deal with crisis intervention. Now, as the Executive Director for the National Alliance on Mental Illness Chicago, she helps people understand mental health issues, the challenges they face and the support that is available to them.

7-23-21 Ibtihaj Muhammad- U.S. Olympic Fencer

New Jersey native Muhammad is the first Muslim woman to represent the United States and bring home a bronze medal in the Olympic Games while wearing a hijab. She's a 5-time Senior World medalist and was the 2014 World Champion in the team event.

7-24-21 Marcia Cleveland- Swimmer, Coach and Author

Marcia Cleveland is a swimmer, coach and author who has been swimming since before she was two years old. Having swum competitively most of her life, she began open water swimming in 1991 to "be one with nature."

7-25-21 Sheila Brown- Executive Director, CineCares Foundation, Cinespace Chicago Film Studios

Sheila Brown is the Executive Director of the CineCares Foundation at Cinespace Chicago Film Studios. The foundation places young adults from underserved Chicago neighborhoods into paid internships at Cinespace, a working film and TV studio on shows like Chicago PD and Chicago Med. Prior to joining CineCares, Brown ran her own production company for 20 years working with top celebrities and brands.

7-26-21 Jackie King Schiller- Chef and Author

Before becoming a chef, Jacqueline King Schiller worked as a fashion model. She started modeling as a teen and by her 20s, she realized improper eating habits were making her feel sick. This revelation and newfound healthy eating habits led her to a new career as a chef, blogger and author.

7-27-21 Carol Brown- Olympic Bronze Medal Winner, Women's Rowing Carol Brown had never rowed before she joined the first women's crew team at Princeton University in 1971. Three years later, she made the U.S. National Team at the World Championships. At the 1975 World Rowing Championships, Brown won a silver medal with the women's eight. In 1976, Brown was a crew member of the American boat that won an Olympic bronze medal in the eight event, the first time women's rowing was on the Olympic program. She is currently a Vice President, US Olympians and Paralympians Association, the USOC athlete alumni organization.

7-28-21 Diane Ademu-John- Executive Producer, "Empire"

Writing for TV became an accidental dream for Diane Ademu-John by working night jobs as a production assistant. It was through this side work that she got "bit by the bug" that would lead her to become Executive Producer on the hit TV show Empire and a screenwriter and producer for shows like Medium and Body of Proof.

7-29-21 Kendall Coyne- U.S. Women's Olympic Hockey Team

When Kendall Coyne was fifteen she joined Team USA's U-18 team, and went on to win six world championships and two Olympic Medals, including the gold in 2018. In 2019 she became the first woman to participate in the All-Star skills competition, finishing second in the fastest skater event. She then became a television analyst for NBC and the San Jose Sharks, and in November of 2020 the Chicago Blackhawks hired Coyne as player development coach and youth hockey growth specialist, the first woman to serve in that capacity in their organization

7-30-21 Iris Grossman- Talent Agent Echo Lake Entertainment

Iris Grossman is a renowned talent agent currently working with Echo Lake Entertainment as a manager and producer. Before that, she was a college kid who sought to make her career among the stars.

7-31-31 Christine Cikowski- Chef & Owner, Honey Butter Fried Chicken & Sunday Dinner Club

Christine Cikowski began working in restaurants at age 16 but it wasn't until she was 27 that she enrolled in culinary school. While in school she met her soon to be business partner Josh Kulp. After graduating she began working at Blackbird restaurant in Chicago while making plans with Kulp to open Sunday Dinner Club in Chicago in 2005. In 2013 the two opened Honey Butter Fried Chicken, for which they earned a 2015 Star Chefs Rising Star Community Chefs Award.

Tara Poremba got her start in the Marine Corps. After her time in the Marines, Poremba
combined the two career paths she had always wanted to follow: Being a police officer and
working with animals. In 1995, Poremba became the first woman in the history of the Chicago
Police Department to become "Top Gun" of her graduating class. She now trains and handles

In 2019 Pallmeyer became the first woman to be chief judge in the 200-year history of the Federal District Court for the Northern District of Illinois. Prior to her appointment, she worked in private practice, served as an administrative law judge for the Illinois Human Rights Commission, and as a United States Magistrate Judge of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois. In 1997 Judge Pallmeyer was nominated by President Bill Clinton to a seat on the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois.

Wendy Freedman- Professor, University of Chicago Dept. of Astronomy & Astrophysics Wendy began her career as an astronomer at the Carnegie Observatories in Pasadena, California eventually becoming the first female director there as well as Las Campanas, Chile. Wendy coled an international team of astronomers on the Hubble Space Telescope Key Project. She is best known for her measurement of the Hubble Constant which measures the rate at which the universe is expanding.
