Anthony Award from the National Organization for Women, and appointed as a White House Fellow by President Bill Clinton.
5-19-21 Genevive Thiers	Founder, Sittercity.com	As the founder of Sittercity and a former babysitter, Genevieve Thiers took the online dating concept and applied it to caregiving to establish a centralized place for parents and caregivers to meet. She is also a trained opera singer who's sung at Carnegie Hall.
5-20-21 Susan Axelrod	Founder CURE	As a mother of a child with epilepsy, Susan Axelrod founded CURE in 1998 with a group of other parents who were frustrated that they could not protect their children from seizures or from the side effects of medications. Since 1998, CURE has raised more than \$70 million to fund epilepsy research.

5-21-21	Emily Barr		As President and CEO of Graham Media Group, Emily Barr oversees local TV stations around the country. Prior to joining Graham Media, Barr was the President and General Manager of ABC 7 Chicago. She also served in the same position in Raleigh-Durham, North Carolina, and early in her career, she worked at TV stations in Baltimore, Houston, Washington D.C. and St. Paul, Minnesota.
5-22-21	Helen Zia	Writer, Activist	The daughter of Chinese immigrants, Helen Zia published her first book, Asian American Dreams: The Emergence of an American People, in 2000. 5-25-21	Mary Nguyen Aregoni	Founder & CEO, Saigon Sisters Restaurant Group	Mary Nguyen Aregoni was still a child when her family was forced to flee their native Laos during the Vietnam War. They arrived on foot in Thailand, where they lived in a refugee camp immigrating to the United States. Aregoni later spent 20 years in marketing and IT at Procter and Gamble. After living through 9/11 as a New York City resident, she decided it was time to follow her dream: to open a Vietnamese restaurant. With the help of her sister Theresa, Saigon Sisters was born. The brand now includes three locations in Chicago, as well as Thai restaurant Bang Chop Thai.

5-26-21 Avis Brodess	Dystonia Warrior	Avis Brodess was a nationally ranked tennis player as a teenager, and the first female arbitrager on Wall Street in her 20s. But her most grueling challenge came in her 30s when she was diagnosed with cervical dystonia, a rare and incurable neurological disease where the brain can't control the neck muscles. Brodess discovered a medical breakthrough, a procedure that involved implanting electrodes in her brain and a rechargeable battery-powered stimulator in her chest wall.
5-27-21 Josephine Lee	President & Artistic Director, Chicago Children's Choir	Josephine Lee serves as the President and Artistic Director of Chicago Children's Choir (CCC), where she has revolutionized the field of youth choral music. She has led the CCC in collaborations with well-known artists, as well as performing for many dignitaries, including former President Barack Obama, First Lady Michelle Obama and the Dali Lama.
5-28-21 Natalie Shmulik	CEO The Hatchery	Natalie earned an M.L.A. in Gastronomy from Boston University. She opened her own restaurant in Toronto and went on to become a specialty consultant for one of Ontario's largest supermarket chains. After discovering her passion for innovation, she was hired as a brand strategist for the first cold brew tea company in Chicago. She went on to head The Hatchery, one of the largest food incubators in the country.

6-1-21 Simone Elkeles- Young Adult Author

After picking up a romance novel while at the library with her young daughter, Simone Elkeles was hooked. She read more than 100 before trying her hand at writing the genre, and quickly became a New York Times bestselling young adult author. She is best known for her teen romance Perfect Chemistry.

6-2-21 Alexandra Lebenthal- Financial Expert

Alexandra Lebenthal is a financial expert with more than 30 years of experience on Wall Street. In 1995, she became President and CEO of Lebenthal & Company, the municipal bond firm founded by her grandparents in 1925. In 2012, Fortune magazine dubbed her "The New Queen of Wall Street." Lebenthal served as CEO of the firm until it was sold in 2017.

6-3-21 Betsy Ziegler- CEO, 1871, Tech Innovation Hub

Betsy Ziegler is the first female CEO for the tech incubator company 1871. Before joining 1871, Betsy was the Chief Innovation Officer at the Kellogg School of Management, Northwestern University, and a Principal at McKinsey & Company.

6-4-21 Monica Rochester- Capt., U.S. Coast Guard

Monica Rochester was only one of two women in the Coast Guard when she first enlisted. Most recently she served as the Sector Los Angeles-Long Beach commander. As a captain in the U.S. Coast Guard, she was a Prevention Operations specialist with focus on commercial vessel safety and security, marine investigations, and waterways management. She also served in the US Department of Homeland Security as a chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear defense expert.

6-5-21 Ivy Kagan Bierman- entertainment labor attorney and partner

Before Ivy Kagan Bierman became an entertainment labor attorney and partner at Loeb & Loeb in Los Angeles, she was an actress seeking her start on Broadway. Today, she counsels entertainment and advertising companies in guild and union matters.

6-6-21 Nancy Rotering- Mayor, Highland Park, IL

Nancy Rotering is currently the Mayor of Highland Park, Illinois. Before becoming mayor, Rotering served as a Council Member for Highland Park. She was also a candidate in the 2018 race for Illinois Attorney General.

6-10-21 Alina Moran- President of Dignity Health California Hospital Medical Center After working as a mechanical engineer for years Alina went back to school pursing her master's degree in public administration. Alina began working in a variety of finance positions in New York's hospital system before becoming the CEO at NYC Health + Hospitals/Metropolitan. Alina was named president of Dignity Health – California Hospital Medical Center (CHMC) in February of 2020 and leads the overall direction, strategy, and operation of the hospital.

6-11-21 Brittani & Brandi Jackson- Physicians and Founders Med Like Me Brandi and Brittani are twin sisters and best friends. They were separated for the first time when they attended different medical schools. The sisters reunited in Chicago after med school, and are now both practicing physicians working with vulnerable populations on Chicago's West and South Sides. They also created Med Like Me as a resource to help guide minorities who may want to follow in their footsteps.

6-12-21 Sandy Goldberg- Clinical Nutritionist

After losing 183 pounds, Sandy Goldberg wanted to help others have a similar experience. She went back to school and studied nutrition, got her degree and opened her own practice.
