In addition to being a partner at Benesch, Wolf O'Donnell is on the boards of Women's Initiatives in Law, Yale Chicago, the Woman's Athletic Club of Chicago and the Auxiliary Board of the Art Institute of Chicago.

- 11-2-21 Mimi LeClaire, President and CEO of Boys and Girls Clubs of Chicago Mimi LeClair is President and CEO of Boys and Girls Clubs of Chicago, where she oversees 23 clubs serving 18,000 children each year through after-school programs. In 2015, they honored her with the first Young Aviator's Award.

Kelly Cervantes, Advocate

Kelly Cervantes is an epilepsy advocate and board member of the nonprofit, Citizens United for Research in Epilepsy (CURE). Kelly, her husband Miguel (who starred as Alexander Hamilton in Hamilton and will take over the title role on Broadway) and their son Jackson lost their daughter and sister in October of 2019 after an almost 4-year battle with infantile spasms, a severe form of childhood epilepsy.

Nani Cholakians Coroner Lieutenant, LA County Department of Medical Examiner-Coroner Nani Cholakians has always had a fascination with the human body and bones. At the age of 22, she was hired as a death investigator. She was recently promoted to Coroner Lieutenant in the Investigations Division of the Los Angeles County Department of Medical Examiner-Coroner's Office. Cholakians has conducted over 2,000 death investigation cases.

Tammera Holmes grew up in a crime ridden suburb of Chicago but a chance opportunity taking an airplane ride with the Tuskegee airmen Inc, Young Eagles Program opened up her eyes to a career in aviation. She graduated college with an aviation management degree and started her own company in 2008. In 2016, she established the AeroStar Avion Institute, a non-profit organization designed to promote aviation careers for at-risk, minority youth.

11-8-21

Kathy LaSauce, former Air Force Pilot

Lasauce made history when she was chosen to be trained as an Air Force pilot. La Sauce became the first female aircraft commander at Norton Air Force Base. She was also the first woman to fly a C- 141 Starlifter, the first female officer to fly training aircraft, and serve as a wing flight simulator instructor and flight examiner pilot. She closed out her flying career by breaking yet another barrier, becoming the first woman in a very prestigious group - flying presidential support missions on the VC- 135 aircraft for the 89th Airlift Wing.

11-9-21

Vernice Armour, Former Captain, U.S. Marine Corps

Upon graduating flight school, Vernice became the Marine Corps' first African-American female pilot. She served two combat tours in Operation Iraqi Freedom; making her the nation's first African-American female combat pilot. She is the author of "Zero to Breakthrough" and now works as a motivational speaker.

11-10-21

Phyllis Wilson, Chief Warrant Officer 5, U.S. Army (retired)

Phyllis joined the Army in 1981. Wilson began in the Military Intelligence community as a German linguist Voice Intercept Operator and went on to serve in many other areas from tactical to strategic. She also served as a senior intelligence analyst, deployed to Iraq. She now serves as the President of the Women In Military Service For America (WIMSA) Memorial Foundation, Inc.

11-11-21

Zeita Merchant, Deputy Sector Commander at U.S. Coast Guard Sector New York With more than 20 years of military experience, Zeita currently serves as the Deputy Sector Commander at U.S. Coast Guard Sector New York. From 2016 to 2019, she served as the first Commanding Officer of Marine Safety Unit Chicago and was the first African American female to command a marine safety unit in the Coast Guard before serving as a National Security Fellow at Harvard University.

11-12-21

Darlene Iskra Commander, U.S. Navy (retired)

Darlene Iskra joined the Navy in 1979. After a year of training, Iskra became a Diving Officer, one of the first three female officers to do so. In 1990, Iskra was selected for Commanding Officer afloat, the first woman to command a commissioned vessel of the U.S. Navy. She reported for duty on the USS Opportune on December 27, 1990 in Naples, Italy. Seventeen days later, she and her crew were underway in support of Operation Desert Storm.

11-13-21

Avis Brodess, Dystonia Warrior

Avis Brodess was a nationally ranked tennis player as a teenager, and the first female arbitrager on Wall Street in her 20s. But her most grueling challenge came in her 30s when she was diagnosed with cervical dystonia, a rare and incurable neurological disease where the brain can't control the neck muscles. Brodess discovered a medical breakthrough, a procedure that involved implanting electrodes in her brain and a rechargeable battery-powered stimulator in her chest wall.

11-14-21

Josephine Lee, President & Artistic Director, Chicago Children's Choir Josephine Lee serves as the President and Artistic Director of Chicago Children's Choir (CCC), where she has revolutionized the field of youth choral music. She has led the CCC in collaborations with well-known artists, as well as performing for many dignitaries, including former President Barack Obama, First Lady Michelle Obama and the Dali Lama.

Heidi Stevens, Former Columnist Chicago Tribune

Heidi Stevens began her career at the Chicago Tribune as an editor, then was named a founding editor for the feature "On the Town." In 2012, she began writing her daily "Balancing Act" column, focusing on work-life balance, relationships and parenting.

Annie Nocenti, Former Writer, Marvel & DC Comics

Alina was named president of Dignity Health – California Hospital Medical Center (CHMC) in February of 2020 and leads the overall direction, strategy, and operation of the hospital.

12-10-21 Minky Worden, Director of Global Initiatives, Human Rights Watch As Human Rights Watch's Director of Global Initiatives, Minky Worden develops and implements international outreach and advocacy campaigns, focusing especially on how sport can advance human rights. She started at HRW in 1998 as Media Director, working with the world's journalists to help them cover human rights abuses in more than 90 countries.

12-11-21 Margot McMahon, Sculptor

Margot McMahon began sculpting at a young age. She earned an MFA from Yale University then taught sculpture and drawing at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. Camilla Webster is a bestselling author and visual artist, Webster has exhibited her paintings at prestigious international art shows like Art Basel. Her portraits and abstracts are also housed in private collections around the world.

12-16-21 Vicky Hernandez, Paramedic Field Chief, Chicago Fire Department Being a paramedic field chief in the city of Chicago isn't an easy job, Hernandez loves being a part of the action. Hernandez is noticing that more and more women are taking on roles with the fire department and quickly working their ways up through the ranks.

12-17-21 Simone Elkeles, Young Adult Author

After picking up a romance novel while at the library with her young daughter, Simone Elkeles was hooked. She read more than 100 before trying her hand at writing the genre, and quickly became a New York Times bestselling young adult author. She is best known for her teen romance Perfect Chemistry.
