California has just approved them for all cars and trucks. Officials say the digital plates make it easier for consumers to update their registration. It also makes it easier for police to spot cars with expired plates.</p> <p>Kia is recalling as many as 70 thousand SUVs equipped with trailer hitches because the wiring harness can cause a fire. The recall covers certain late model Sorento, Sorento Hybrid, Sorento Plug-In Hybrid, and Sportage vehicles equipped with a tow hitch harness.</p>

Floods have affected nearly all of Nigeria's states and 90,000 homes have been partially or completely destroyed. More than 1,500 people were injured and the disaster had an impact on farmland across all but five of Nigeria's 36 states. Lord we pray for aid to reach Nigeria and along with the aid a message of hope found in the gospel of Christ.</p> <p>Two evangelists sustained deep knife wounds after leading several Muslims to Christ at debates on Islam and Christianity in eastern Uganda. The two had debated Islamic scholars in several areas and after several people committed their lives to Christ the evangelists were attacked. The attack was the latest of many instances of persecution of Christians in Uganda. Lord we pray for healing and safety for both of these evangelists and for the persecution of Christians in Uganda to be replaced with revival.</p>

Despite enlisting her husband and three young children to help search around their yard and garage for two days, there was no sign of the ring. "I just accepted that it was gone," Garner said. The family stayed at their home during the storm and went outside to clean up as soon as it had passed. In a pile of brush and trees next to their garage...they found the ring. Garner said she couldn't believe it. She said she prayed and thanked God for this sign of hope for their community following the destruction of Ian.</p>

But in a boost for buyers, a drop in sales has caused mortgage rates to fall dramatically.</p> <p>Before complaining about all those extra airline fees, consider this: A new report suggests those fees are keeping airfares low. The four University of Idaho students – three girls and one boy – were found murdered on the second and third stories of that home just blocks from campus on Sunday, Nov. 13. The suspect and the weapon used have yet to be found. Police have warned the town of 25-thousand to be vigilant. Lord we pray you comfort the families of these young people and we pray the suspect in this horrific crime will soon be caught.</p> <p>Persecution of Christians has worsened in at least 18 countries at the hands of both totalitarian governments and militant non-state actors in recent years, according to a new report. Released by Catholic group Aid to the Church in Need, the report pinpointed Asia, Africa and the Middle East as the regions where the persecution of Christians is most grave. The person said Mongo had been found. He'd apparently been running with the wild Mustangs. The next day Adams drove four hours to pick up Mongo.</p> <p>Adams says that reuniting with Mongo was a dream come true and a much-needed victory. He added that it's the only positive thing that has happened to him in two years.</p>

The research by Ilana M. Horwitz, an assistant professor of Jewish studies and sociology at Tulane University, tracked 3,290 teenagers from 2003 to 2012. While the benefits of religion varied among teenage boys, Horwitz found that working-class boys, regardless of race, appear to benefit the most from the offerings of their Christian community when it comes to education.</p> <p>Academy and Tony Award-winning actor and director Denzel Washington continues to give God the glory for his many talents, most recently as a guest on the fourth season premiere of a late-night comedy talk show. In the 23-minute video interview, Washington speaks of his love for NewYork, pizza, his upcoming film "The Tragedy of Macbeth," how he prepares for his roles and what he's learned after the many years in Hollywood.
