Michael Hanline is 68 years old. The California Innocence Project has been around since 1999. They review over 2,000 claims of innocence from California inmates each year. A lot of people may be surprised to find out that this is even a problem in San Diego. We've seen stories in other countries but in addition to being a worldwide problem, it's happening in cities throughout the United States and it's on the rise here locally. I'm Cliff Albert, and joining us to talk about the steps being taken to fight this crime are San Diego County Supervisor Chairwoman Diane Jacob, San Diego District Attorney Bonnie Dumanis, Dr. Susan Tschirn, Vice Chair of the City of San Diego's Human Relations Commission, and Tiffany Mester, who was a victim who was able to escape her ordeal and is going to tell us her story.
