KHTS-FM Quarterly Issues/Programs List

KHTS-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- BIG BROS BIG SIS SD: Jeremy Pfouts interviewed Louie Evans who (tm)s a Big Brothers Big Sisters recruitment specialist and a Big Brother, Matt May and his little brother Robert.
- CALIFORNIA'S DROUGHT: I'm Cliff Albert. Our state is facing one of the worst droughts in history. The Governor declared a drought state of emergency for California at the start of this year. In San Diego County, the various water agencies have been dealing with trying to get us all to conserve and with the fall out of conservation, will our efforts be enough? What more can we do to ride out these dry times? Joining us on Community Connection, our quests represent water districts in this County to bring us up to speed: Jeff Stephenson, Principal Water Resources Specialist with San Diego County Water Authority; Richard Namba, Senior Water Conservation Specialist with Otay Water District; Mario Remillard, Meter & Customer Services Supervisor/Conservation Coordinator with City of Carlsbad; and Luis Generoso, Water Resources Manager for City of San Diego. Discussions included: - State regulations that mandate water savings levels for each water district became effective June 1st. The savings levels vary from 12%-36%. Visit your water agency's website to see the water savings target that is in effect in your area. - The targets were set by the state, which looked at an agency's water use in 2013, and then determined how deep the cuts needed to be to achieve an overall 25% statewide goal. - The San Diego region achieved a 26% drop in June. -Although San Diego has invested in local supplies like recycled water and desalinated seawater, these are not counted in the requirement to save. - It's important for everyone to keep saving to meet the local and regional water use targets, and help the state save water in case next year is also dry. - Save water by stopping or limiting watering of ornamental turf - use potable water. - It's prohibited to water grass more than 2 times per week. - Make sure you're watering trees. They should be given a higher priority because lawns and shrubs can easily be removed/replaced. - Take shorter showers. - Replace toilet or washing machine. - Fix leaks.
- DOMESTIC VIOLENCE: liff Albert interviewed San Diego Police Lieutenant, Misty Cedrun. Domestic violence doesn't stay within the bounds of a victim's home life. It's a crime that can spill over into the workplace. If you're the co-worker of someone who is being abused, or

Thousands of women every year in the United States are diagnosed with breast cancer - it is the 2nd leading cause of cancer death in women in this country. The Helen Knoll Foundation was started in 2006 by David and Helen Knoll. Founded because Helen Knoll had breast cancer before she could have a mammogram since mammograms were only done on women 40 years and older (Helen was younger than 40). They raised awareness by sharing that women should be proactive by taking care of their health, be aware of pre-cursors, and be aware that there are screenings for women under 40. Be proactive: -Stop worrying and stressing because it weakens the immune system -There are screenings to help you become educated - Don't wait, take care of yourself even if you're under 40 (exercise to decrease obesity, limit alcohol, don't put cell phones in your bra, eat healthy) - Learn what the precursors to breast cancer are - Be aware that anyone at any age can get breast cancer so know your body and do self-exams - Talk to your mom and/or grandmother - Ask questions The rate of breast cancer in women under 40 is growing. Ultrasounds are a more effective screening for women under 40. Website: www.helenknollfoundation.org

Lock your car, and if you can take belongings with you, do that instead of leaving them in the car, or at the least, lock belongings in the trunk.
