KHTS-FM Quarterly Issues/Programs List

KHTS-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- BALBOA PARK CENTENNIAL: In 2015, Balboa Park will be the setting for a spectacular year of festivities that celebrates the 100th Anniversary of International Exposition of 1915 by once again putting San Diego on the world stage. The programming for the 2015 Balboa Park Centennial Celebration will showcase the best of San Diego amid a full calendar of events and world-class exhibits. Gerry Braun from the Balboa Park Centennial Committee is my guest on Community Connection. First, let's go back in time ... talk a bit about the 1915 Exposition. That Exposition gave us Balboa Park and most of the buildings that exist to this day. We have rebooted the organization of this festival. A different plan called Edge 2015 was the first attempt to move this event forward, but that has been dispatched for the new non-profit Balboa Park Centennial Committee organization that is now in place. It begins with a year of special programming in Balboa Park's museums and theaters. "Autonomy" is the company hired to put on the year-long celebration. Visitors will also see how the city leads in business sectors like health, communications and alternative energy; and strong arts and culture; and how San Diego is a border city that celebrates its bi-national relationships. Estimated cost? \$30 million to get the celebration "off the ground", \$50 million to make it good, and \$100 million for it to be spectacular. The events would kick-off with a welcoming celebration on Dec. 31, 2014. Braun added that the Spreckels Organ Pavilion will be given world-class sound and lighting. What are some of the possible events? There have been published reports of "spectaculars" on the bay and a "Mega" concert on the border. Looking for volunteers? How can San Diegans be involved? Design an official centennial Postcard contest? Fundraising?

PREPARE: secure your space, plan to be safe, organize disaster supplies, safequard your finances. SURVIVE: drop, cover, and hold-on. RECOVER: re-establish contact with loved ones. - MAX'S RING OF FIRE AND RONAN THOMPSON FOUNDATION: The month of September is Childhood Cancer Awareness month. On Community Connection, we'll be discussing the fight to beat pediatric cancer, and an upcoming promotion to help raise money to help in that effort. Our three guests are Melissa Mikulak, Co-founder of Max's Ring of Fire; Maya Thompson, Founder of Ronan Thompson Foundation; and Stacy Bartletti, San Diego mother of a child with pediatric cancer. In this country, cancer is the 2nd most common cause of death among children between the ages of 1 and 14, exceeded only by accidents. Every year, over 13,000 children and teens in the US are diagnosed with cancer, and nearly 1,500 die from the disease. The most common cancers in children are childhood leukemia, brain tumors, and lymphomas. The Run to Fight Children's Cancer is scheduled for October 26 at NTC Park at Liberty Station. The run raises funds for Max's Ring of Fire, a San Diego-based fundraising and advocacy organization that supports innovative pediatric cancer research and clinical trials, and the Ronan Thompson Foundation, an

organization dedicated to finding a cure for neuroblastoma. The Run to Fight Children's Cancer is hosted by Grand Canyon University. The run began in Phoenix two years ago and has raised nearly \$200,000 to help young cancer patients and families in need. The inaugural San Diego Run to Fight Children's Cancer features a 5k run/walk, one-mile family fun run, and quarter-mile Cancer Survivors Walk to honor children who have beat cancer, those who are still fighting the disease, and the children who have lost their battle. In San Diego County, 33% have used alcohol, 24% have used pot, and 14% have used a prescription drug without a prescription. Teens have a higher risk of becoming addicted to drugs the earlier they begin taking them. The McAlister Institute and three other organizations have teamed-up with the County of Health and Human Services to provide a free test that parents can utilize on their kids. One of the attempts to stop this disturbing trend is by using "suicide gatekeepers" - people trained to help stop an individual from trying to take his or her own life. Dr. Leon Alta-Miriano is one of those suicide gatekeepers, and he teaches others what to do in these situations. About 5,000 San Diegans have been trained as "suicide gatekeepers."
