WIOX Quarterly Program/Issues Report 3rd Quarter, 2023 Submitted 10/03/2023

WIOX is an NCE first service broadcast licensee serving a rural, mountainous region of upstate New York. Regularly scheduled programming is live, locally produced, community oriented, and serves a wide variety of public interests. Local issues are determined by the local community stakeholders and addressed by them on the air.

Significant aspects of regular programming on WIOX include reports on the region's economic development, culture and cultural events, experiential learning, and education; housing, insurance, food pantries; public health, healthcare, and wellness; criminal justice, tourism, global warming, and the environment; farming, forestry, gardening, social issues, agriculture, local news, and local emergency broadcasts. WIOX also provides support and education to students at SUNY Delhi interested in Applied Communication and related subjects. Students host radio shows under the supervision of WIOX hosts, who are also professors of communication at SUNY Delhi, and gain experience in public speaking, journalism, research, and related topics. In addition, providing opportunities for students to host their own radio programs offers WIOX listeners an opportunity to hear intergenerational points of view on issues of concern to communities.

In addition to the issues-related long-form programs found below, WIOX broadcasts include issues-oriented shortform programming such as local weather alerts, local writers, musicians, and performance artists material, and other locally focused content that reflects and responds to local issues, needs, and interests, including Covid-19 news, climate change, and information from local, state, and federal authorities.
