Description: 65 y/o Joseph Weingart is killed after a crash involving a semi and an SUV on I-39. Weingart (SUV) crossed the median and struck a semi head on. Police aren't sure what caused him to do that. I-39 SB was closed for several hours and traffic was backed up for miles.

Title: Realtor Danger

Length: 1:55

Description: A real estate agent in Arkansas is found dead after showing a house there. Locally, Stateline realtors are on high alert so it doesn't happen to them. Agents here say they try not to show basements of the home to prospective buyer and walk behind them.

Title: Domestic Violence Ceremony

Air: 10/1 Show: 9:00 pm. Morning News on 10/2

Length: 1:50

Description: 17th Judicial Circuit Court of Winnebago County holds a candlelight vigil to remember Stateliners who died as victims of domestic violence. Organizers say it's important to remember those we've lost so that future generations can do what it takes to end domestic violence.

Title: Rock Co. Computer Cop

Description: The computer program, Computer Cop, is under fire. It allegedly has no safeguards to prevent hackers from being able to capture what a user types on their computer. Computer Cop is distributed by police agencies across the country to help protects kids from online predators. But, it could actually put them at risk, as well as others for identity theft. Rock Co. Sheriff's Dept. distributed it to residents. However, they say no one has complained to them about the program.

Description: AAA report says people are more distracted while driving despite the use of hands free devices. It says that it forces people to look at screens in the car, which takes their eyes off the road more than before when cell phones were allowed while driving.

Length: 2:14

Description: Nine juveniles are arrested for curfew violations in Rockford. They were allegedly behind crimes like aggravated battery and robbery, but were never charged. Police think it may be gang related due to graffiti tags at the crime scenes.

Title: Freeport Bus Accident Follow-up

Description: A bus carrying six passengers to the hospital in Freeport crashes into a tree due to the driver using her cell phone. The company, Rolling Hills Progress Center of Carroll Co., denies the driver was using her cell phone. Police charged her with using a cell phone though. The driver's future with the company will be decided in 4-6 weeks after she comes back from medical leave.

Title: Janesville Police Officer Domestic Violence

Description: Sgt. Brian Donohoue of the Janesville Police Dept. has his charges of domestic violence dropped. He allegedly attacked his wife. But, investigators say there wasn't enough evidence to pursue Donohoue. Donohoue's wife maintains she was attacked.

Title: Blackert Plea

Length: 1:35

Description: Jenee Blackert, a former teacher and coach at Belvidere North, pleads guilty to sexually assaulting a 17 y/o student. According to the plea deal, she'll spend 4 years in prison. Blackert, through her lawyer, says she feels bad she let the community and school down. Blackert also apologized to the victim's family.

Description: Janesville P.D. and Rock County Sheriff's Deputies participate in the Fair and Impartial Police Training exercise. The idea is to get officers to recognize their own personal bias they have and how it affects their work. Janesville says it's a proactive measure to make sure they don't have an incident happen.

Description: A Rockford Mass Transit bus goes up in flames after an engine malfunction. Passengers were evacuated. One of them took video of the flames. We spoke to him about the experience. He says the driver didn't notice. No one was hurt.

Description: A Rockford driver catches on camera rubble from a building being demolished hit a fence which falls into the street. The fence is supposed to prevent debris from falling into street. Driver who filmed it says it's ridiculous that he has to watch out for debris in the street. The city says the contractor is at fault. The Illinois Dept. of Transportation required the contractor to close a lane of traffic, which they didn't. City says they'll notify IDOT. IDOT will either stop the project or force the contractor to close the lane.

Cleary's killer withdrew money from an ATM using her card. Sen. Dave Syverson says the state should adopt policies that'll help police do their job.

Description: Rockford Police meet with Rockford clergy to help build trust between

officers and the community.

Description: Thor Advertising posts the picture of William Bigel on an electronic billboard. He is wanted for harassment. Bigel would hack the profiles of dead teenage girls and harass their friends by saying it's their fault she died.

Length: 2:06

Description: Brown was supposed to be sentenced for viciously beating an elderly couple and killing their dogs. But, the judge didn't sentence him because he wanted more time to consider the penalty. Judge says he wants to get it right.

Length: 2:12

Description: Sergio Ortiz-Raygoza is arrested in Beloit after Beloit Police, the U.S. Marshall Service, and Immigration and Customs Enforcement work together to get him. He's behind several shootings in Beloit and South Beloit. The feds were interested in him because he's behind shootings in two states (IL and WI).

Description: A couple is killed in an apparent murder-suicide. The daughter of Angela Singleton (one of the victims) spoke out about how she didn't see it coming. Police believe Angela Singleton shot her boyfriend before turning the gun on herself.

Description: Two people are killed in a shed fire. A third person is in critical. An eyewitness tells us he tried pulling one of the victims out of the shed. Fire Dept. is still investigating the cause of the fire.

Description: Freeport Police confirm that Tony Strong was shot and killed over a haircut. The shooter is still at large.

Description: Investigative piece trying to understand why police can't solve a murder that was caught on surveillance camera at 3 different angles. Police say there's just not enough. They want confession and physical evidence (not including surveillance),

Description: Some Rockford city leaders are upset that District 1's police station could go downtown. However, he doesn't have a solution yet.

She hopes the interview she did with us will help convince people she's the wrong person to be targeting.

Description: Beloit Police ask for the community's help by telling residents to lock up the weapons in their homes. Oftentimes, a stolen weapon is used in a crime. Also, they want residents to sign off on the Consent To Search Program, which allows police to search homes of residents if they believe illegal guns are inside.

Title: Trouble with Parolees

Length: 2:23

Description: Devonte Layne, a man just released from prison on parole, is arrested for shooting a man in the leg in Rockford. It highlights an ongoing problem in Rockford. The city has programs to keep people from re-offending. They contend it's working, saying only 11% re-offend.

Title: Geo-Policing Sites Set

Air: 12/2 Show: 9:00 pm. Morning News on 12/3

Length: 2:17

Description: Rockford City Council agrees to the final local for District 1's police department. It'll be located at Avon and State. Community groups are happy because, initially, the city thought about moving into the old Ware center in the heart of downtown. But, they didn't like that because it's at the edge of District 1's boundaries and would be hard to prevent crime since they're so far away from the center of the district.

Title: Fire Hydrant Problem Follow-up

Residents say if they have to pay more, then they want real fire hydrants.

Description: LPPD tweet out they've begun the process of implementing body cameras. Really, they've had discussions with the Mayor about trying to secure funding for them.

A bar employee says several people left the bar for an altercation. Police weren't called until someone was shot. The victim is 26 y/o Joseph Devleeger.

Title: Loves Park Cat House

Air: 12/8 Show: 9:00 pm. Morning News on 12/9

Length: 2:21

Description: 40 cats are removed from a house in Loves Park after Animal Services discovered the woman there was hoarding them. When firefighters went in to retrieve them - they had to wear masks because the smell of ammonia in the home was really strong. 77 y/o Sally Gaetjens is charged with several counts of animal care violations.

Title: Beloit Teen Rescue

Air: 12/9 Show: 9:00 pm. Morning News on 12/10

Length: 2:04

Description: Three teens are safe after jumping out of their car before it became submerged in the Rock River. The teens claim the road was icy at the Arlington-Eddy Boat Launch, but the fire department says there was no ice. A 17 y/o driver was charged with reckless driving.

Title: Sports Page Bar

Air: 12/9 Show: 9:00 pm. Morning News on 12/10

Length: 2:20

Description: A shooting at the bar's parking lot over the weekend led to the city of Rockford suspending their liquor license. The bar owner says he's being punished for crimes that has nothing to do with his business. The Rolling Green Neighborhood Assoc. says the bar actually brings in the kinds of people who would commit crimes and hopes the city doesn't give back their license.

Title: Puppy Mill Rescue

Air: 12/9 Show: 9:00 pm. Morning News on 12/10

Length: 2:12

Description: Fresh Start Animal Rescue says they saved 16 dogs from a puppy mill. The location and name of the mill is being kept under wraps. The dogs that were rescued are in bad shape. Some physically, others mentally. Fresh Start is actively looking for people to adopt the dogs.

Title: Justin Jones Update

Length: 2:10

Description: Justin Jones is arrested for sexually assaulting a Janesville teenager. Police arrested him in Iowa. Police also say that Jones knew the girl he was talking to was only 14.

Title: Barmore Settlement

Length: 1:45

Description: The city of Rockford reaches a settlement with the parents of Mark Barmore. Barmore was shot and killed by police in 2009. The parents filed a wrongful death lawsuit. The city agreed to pay them in excess of \$1 million, partially due to all the police involved deaths across the country. However, the city is not admitting they were at fault in the case.

Title: Why Settle Barmore?

Length: 2:27

Description: We asked the city why they would settle the Barmore case. They say it's what's best for the community due to the tense situations in Ferguson, New York, and Cleveland.

Title: Freeport Violence Interrupter

Length: 2:25

Description: Freeport community leaders want to enlist Violence Interrupters to combat the growing threat of crime. The Interrupters have a group in Chicago that deal with gang violence every day. Freeport community members reached out to them and the group is coming up here. Some of the members are former gang members themselves. They use that to intervene before a crime happens.

Title: Barmore Family Reaction

Length: 1:43

Description: The city of Rockford agrees to pay the Barmore family \$1.1 million after police shot and killed Mark Barmore five years ago. Barmore's father says no amount of money can heal the wounds of losing his son. He also says it's not enough because Barmore had a son with autism and the medical bills are high.
