The American Red Cross shelter at Trinity Church 3355 Dunkel Rd closed on Tuesday but two families still remained and the Red Cross put them in a hotel.

The City will continue to advocate for residents without power, but it is advised that those still without power continue to make contact with the Lansing Board of Water and Light on a daily basis until their power is restored. BWL emergency numbers given out on screen.

Lansing Board of water and light is down to 400 customer outages down from 550 earlier in the day. The BWL projects that full restoration of power to its electric service territory will be operational by 11:59 PM. Line crews are working in the following areas and streets., WILX put all the information up on the screen so that

viewers would know when their electric would come on.
