WE HAVE NEW DETAILS ABOUT THE 175-MILLION DOLLAR PUBLIC-SAFETY BOND LANSING VOTERS WILL BE DECIDING ON IN NOVEMBER. IF IT PASSES... THE OLD McLAREN PARKING LOT ON SOUTH WASHINGTON COULD BE TURNED INTO HEADQUARTERS FOR THE POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS AS WELL AS 54-A DISTRICT COURT. BUT THERE'S ONE BIG CATCH. THE PROPOSED BOND WOULD RAISE PROPERTY TAXES BY THREE-POINT-NINE MILLS FOR 30-YEARS. THE DAYS OF LONG LINES AT SPARROWS FRANDOR TESTING SITE ARE OVER FOR NOW. BUT HEALTH SYSTEMS HAVE SEEN THIS BEFORE. SURGES COME AND GO... AND SO DOES THE NEED FOR TESTING

JOHN FOREN- SPARROW HOSPITAL SPOKESPERSON; "It's pretty steady. You know we've done altogether close to 850 thousand tests. So that's over you know, two and a half years. We were one of the first hospitals probably the first hospital in the state to do in-patient covid testing. So we've been at this for a while."

COVID-19 CASES ARE STILL STEADY. CURRENTLY ALL FIVE OF MID-MICHIGAN'S COUNTY'S ARE AT WHAT THE CDC CALLS A MEDIUM COVID-19 COMMUNITY LEVEL. THE CDC RECOMMENDS COMMUNITIES AT THIS LEVEL TAKE EXTRA CAUTION AND INCREASE TESTING. AND SPARROW SAYS WHAT THEY'RE SEEING REFLECTS THAT.

JOHN FOREN- SPARROW HOSPITAL SPOKESPERSON; "It's been steady, it goes through surges we still tell people, you know, be careful."

AND WITH FALL APPROACHING, THE MEDIUM LEVEL IS NOT THE BEST SPOT TO BE IN. BUT THERE'S SOME GOOD NEWS. WHILE HOSPITALS ARE SEEING STEADY CASE NUMBERS. HOSPITALIZATIONS ARE DOWN. ITS NOT TIME TO PANIC BUT IT IS TIME TO BE MORE CAUTIOUS.

SPARROW HEALTH SYSTEM HAS CONFIRMED TO NEWS TEN THAT IT IS LAYING OFF HUNDREDS OF WORKERS. SPARROW SAYS IT LOST 90-MILLION DOLLARS DURING THE FIRST SIX MONTHS OF THIS YEAR. THE COMPANY SAYS THE LAYOFFS INCLUDE

MANAGEMENT AND NON-PATIENT CARE POSITIONS... AS WELL AS CLINICAL CARE POSITIONS WHERE THE DEMAND IS DOWN. HOSPITALS HAVE ALSO SEEN A SHORTAGE OF NURSES... AND HAVE TO RAISE SALARIES AND PAY TRAVEL NURSE AGENCIES TO FILL THOSE GAPS. WE SPOKE WITH LAURA APPEL WITH THE MICHIGAN HEALTH AND HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION. SHE SAYS AS THE NUMBER OF PATIENTS SHRINK... AND COSTS KEEP GOING UP... HOSPITALS ACROSS MICHIGAN ARE HAVING TO MAKE DIFFICULT DECISIONS.

Story: Infant Sleep Safe Month

PUTTING A BABY TO BED...COMES WITH A LOT OF RULES...TO KEEP THEM SAFE. THE JACKSON COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT IS REMINDING EVERYONE -- OCTOBER IS INFANT SAFE SLEEP AWARENESS MONTH. SINCE 2016 -- FIFTEEN BABIES IN JACKSON COUNTY HAVE DIED BECAUSE HEALTH OFFICIALS SAY THEY WERE NOT SLEEPING SAFELY.

HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO MAKE SURE YOUR CHILD IS SAFE IN BED.

- KEEP BLANKETS OUT OF THE CRIB.
- USE A SLEEP SACK INSTEAD.
- STOP SWADDLING BABIES WHEN THEY SHOW SIGNS THEY CAN ROLL OVER, USUALLY 3-4 MONTHS.
- KEEP THE SLEEP SPACE JUST FOR YOUR LITTLE ONE, NO PILLOWS, BUMPER PADS, OR TOYS.
- MAKE SURE EVERYONE WHO WATCHES YOUR CHILD KNOWS THE SLEEP SAFE RULES.

Story: Domestic Violence Awareness

Domestic violence is still a staggering number, usually like every 20 seconds someone experiences some form of physical abuse. So really bringing awareness to that, showing survivors they're not alone.

DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITY OUTREACH LEAH DRYER SAYS – JUST LAST YEAR END VIOLENT ENCOUNTERS HELPED MORE THAN 18-HUNDRED PEOPLE WITH DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SITUATIONS IN THE TRI-COUNTY AREA. SHE SAYS – THE 24-7 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE HOTLINE JUST MEANS MORE RESOURCES WILL BE AVAILABLE.

LEAH DRYER, END VIOLENT ENCOUNTERS; “All the different resources that are available. A lot of people might not even realize what's out there. They might also not realize that they're in a domestic violence situation. And so getting that education out there that this is what it looks like – it's not always physical, there's a lot of manipulation, emotional abuse, control”.

THE HOTLINE IS FREE AND PROVIDES LOCAL SUPPORT TAILORED TO EACH UNIQUE SITUATION. SERVICES ARE 24-7 VIA PHONE, CHAT, OR TEXT.

LEAH DRYER, END VIOLENT ENCOUNTERS; “Raising awareness for that is important and getting youth involved letting them know that this is what a healthy relationship is and

what it's not and that can really just help prevent this pandemic from growing more and more throughout the years”.

THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES SAYS – THEY'RE JOINING NATIONAL EFFORTS TO EDUCATE COMMUNITIES ABOUT THE LASTING TRAUMA DOMESTIC VIOLENCE HAS ON INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES.

LEAH DRYER, END VIOLENT ENCOUNTERS; “There's just trained advocates that will help assist you. A lot of times these people aren't looking to tell you what to do, they're just there to be that supportive listening ear, make sure you have your options, know what's out there, and allow you to make that next step when you're ready”.
