SUBJECT: Liberty Tree

**DISCUSSION:** The Allegany County Forestry Board is sponsoring Heritage/Legacy Liberty Tree tulip poplar seedlings that are available for planting this spring. The average tree seedling is about twelve to eighteen inches in height. Members of the forestry board collected seed from a scion (graft) of the original Maryland historic Liberty Tree, a tulip poplar that stood at the site of St. John's College in Annapolis, Maryland. Board members then sent the seeds to John S. Ayton State Tree Nursery where the tree nursery manager germinated the seeds and nurtured the seedlings. Under this tree, American revolutionaries advocated independence from Great Britain during the Stamp Act of 1765. Liberty Trees were gathering places where the Sons of Liberty met and discussed how to address and respond to oppressive British policies imposed on the American colonies. During these conferences under liberty trees, patriots planted seeds that led to the American Revolution. Samuel Chase and William Paca, two members of the Annapolis chapter of the Sons of Liberty who gathered for meetings under the St. John's College Liberty Tree, became signers of the Declaration of Independence. The tree stood silent witness from several blocks away when George Washington resigned his military commission as commander in chief of the Continental Army on December 23, 1783 at the Annapolis State House. Francis Scott Key, author of the Star Spangled Banner, often walked under the branches of the Liberty Tree in the 1790s while a student at St. John's College. In 1999, at an estimated 400 years of age, the last of the surviving liberty trees in the original 13 colonies died from damage caused by Hurricane Floyd. This tulip tree was at one time the largest known of its species in the United States: Height: 124'; Circumference: 26'; Spread: 117'; Diameter at 4 ½': 8.25'. The goal of the Heritage/Legacy Tree Program is the following:

- Preserve historic trees as part of our state's heritage by regenerating trees of historic significance
- Promote the value and benefits of trees to present and future generations
- Inform, educate and inspire youth with stories of their connection to heritage legacy trees

Now you too can own and maintain a piece of this living history while this limited supply of Liberty Trees last! The cost of each Liberty Tree is \$20 plus handling costs of \$10 for each tree the US Postal Service delivers by mail, for a total cost of \$30 per tree. A certificate of authenticity is included with each tree. All proceeds from the sale of Liberty Trees go to the Allegany County Forestry Board that consists of volunteers who support forest conservation projects in Allegany County, Maryland. Liberty tree seedlings will also be available at the Backyard Buffer Handout held by the Maryland Forest Service in early April at a date yet to be determined. Liberty Trees will also be available for purchase at the

Evergreen Heritage Center plant sale on May 20, 2018. Members of the forestry board plan, pending final approval, for the availability of purchase of Liberty Trees at tree events sponsored by the Allegany Soil Conservation District; the Forestry Department of Allegany College of Maryland, and the City of Cumberland (dates and time yet to be announced). **DISCUSSION:** The Maryland Department of Transportation State Highway Administration (MDOT SHA) will close and detour eastbound I-68 (National Freeway) at MD 53 (Winchester Road) for two weeks beginning March 4 in LaVale. The closure and detour are necessary for welding repairs underneath of the Winchester Road Bridge. After welding is complete on eastbound I-68, which is expected to take approximately two weeks, crews will shift to westbound I-68. The entire welding project should be complete by the end of March. Crews will work Sunday nights through Friday mornings from 10 p.m. until 5 a.m. Motorists will be directed off onto exit 34, MD 36 (New Georges Creek road SW) to US 40 alternate (National Pike) to exit 40, MD 658 (Vocke Road) and back to eastbound I-68. In approximately two weeks when crews switch to westbound I-68, overnight travelers will be detoured from I-68 at exit 39, MD 53 to US 40 alternate to MD 36 and back to westbound I-68 in Frostburg.

SUBJECT: Stepping On Program

DISCUSSION: The YMCA, Western Maryland Health System and the Allegany County Public Libraries have partnered together to launch a spring Stepping On – A Falls Prevention Program – beginning the week of March 5, 2018. Stepping ON offers older people information, strategies and exercises to reduce falls and increase self-confidence in situations where they are at risk of falling. The program uses adult group learning principles plus individualized follow-up to build participants' self-confidence in making decisions and behavioral changes to reduce fall risk. The program challenges older persons to appraise their fall risk realistically and apply knowledge about safety practices. The program is a seven week course of two hour duration each week, followed by a home visit or call approximately one month after the formal course concludes. Topics covered include: balance and strength exercises; home hazards; vision, footwear and community safety; bone health and medications. Each workshop is led by a trained professional. Course leaders will invite guest experts from the community to present on the topics of exercise (physical therapist), medication management (pharmacist), vision (occupational therapist or other vision expert), and community safety (police officer or firefighter). Through prepared handouts, participants complete self-assessments in such areas as home hazards, safe footwear, Vitamin D intake, medication review, and safe use of public transportation. The course highlights items useful in the prevention of falls, such as objects to improve lighting, reduce slippery surfaces, aid in safe mobility, reduce home hazards, and assist with

medication management. The follow-up home visit or phone call is made to reinforce fall prevention strategies and activities learned in the class sessions. Research has found that people who complete the Stepping ON workshop have a 31% reduced risk of falls. The Stepping ON program is now available in Allegany County thanks to funding from The Community Trust Foundation, through the Kim and Marion Leonard Authentic Leadership and Integrative Health Endowment and through a partnership of the Western Maryland Health System, the YMCA and the library system. Three sessions of Stepping ON will be offered starting the week of March 5: WMHS Homecare Office -- Mondays at 10:00am; LaVale Library -- Tuesdays at 1:00pm and Wednesdays at 12:30pm. DISCUSSION: The Allegany County Library System recently became a chapter of the Choose Civility initiative, which started in Howard County in 2007, and was inspired by the book, *Choosing Civility: The 25 Rules of Considerate Conduct*, by Johns Hopkins University Professor Dr. P.M. Forni. Dr. Forni's book is a reminder of the importance of civility in a world becoming less civil and promotes behaviors such as: listening, speaking kindly, taking responsibility and not blaming others, respecting others' opinions, time, and space. Government agencies, non-profits, businesses, and school and education systems have become partners to encourage others to choose civility in their personal and work lives. Choose Civility: Allegany County's first community partner has been the Women's Action Coalition of Greater Allegany County; the two organizations partnered to host three book discussions in the region on *Hillbilly Elegy* by J.D. Vance during the autumn. The Women's Action Coalition also made a generous donation of five hundred dollars to the chapter that will be used to help get the word out about the initiative across the county. In addition, the Allegany County Chamber of Commerce's Leadership Allegany! Class of 2018 selected Choose Civility: Allegany County as their class project and are planning an area-wide "Day of Civility" in the spring of 2018. A kick-off event for the initiative is being planned for February 13, 2018, at the Washington Street Library, and all are invited. "As a neutral, non-profit organization that provides resources, services, and opportunity to all who walk through its doors or visit it online, the Allegany County Library System wants to use its role in our community to bring people together in a safe space where they can share concerns, discuss ideas, and promote the civil behaviors described in the Choose Civility book," explained Jennifer Spriggs, Programming Director. The Library System has already implemented several new programs under the new initiative, such as ACLS Rocks, where participants create Gratitude Rocks to hide and share, and Lunch and Listen, a monthly program where adults can gather to hear stories while they enjoy their noon-time meal.

He says they have also looked at how the federal tax cut will impact residents in the state. He says the best advice he has is to file early to avoid scammers trying to steal your tax refund.
