7/1	Supreme Court Turns It's Back on Protecting Life	Jim Schneider / Brad Mattes	<p>This past Monday, the U.S. Supreme Court struck down a Louisiana law that required abortion doctors and abortion centers to abide by the same requirements that other surgical centers need to abide by in the state. An exception was carved out on this point for abortion centers. The opinion was 5-4 as Chief Justice John Roberts sided with liberals on the court.</p> <p>The abortion industry is elated with the decision and has been given 'fresh breath' in their push to advance an abortion agenda, an agenda they tout as so-called 'reproductive rights.'</p> <p>Joining Jim to discuss this and related issues was Brad Mattes. Brad is the president of Life Issues Institute, the pro-life grassroots partner of the Susan B. Anthony List Education Fund. Life Issues Institute was founded in 1991 to serve the educational needs of the pro-life movement. Brad is the host of Life Issues, a daily radio commentary and also producer of multiple pro-life specials. Brad has been engaged in the pro-life movement for over 4 decades.</p> <p>This decision was very similar to a previous case in Texas in 2016 (Whole Woman's Health v. Hellerstedt). In that case, Chief Justice Roberts voted on the side of life.</p> <p>The Louisiana law required that an abortionist must have hospital admitting privileges within 30 miles of where they do the abortions.</p> <p>The attorney general and officials in Louisiana made the case that the abortion industry and abortionists involved did not have third party legal standing to represent women and sue on their behalf. They made a strong case to show how an abortion facility in Louisiana botched abortions and had pages of violations and therefore this was not a group of individuals who should have legal standing to sue because they do not represent the well-being of women.</p> <p>This issue brings up many questions including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-Is this a case where abortion was a 'political tool' used to advance a social agenda?</li> <li>-Could it be that Roberts wants to remain popular within the Capital Beltway?</li> <li>-Where does Joe Biden stand on this issue?</li> </ul>

He is the author of nearly two dozen books including ‘Old Earth Creationism on Trial’, a Noah Trilogy: ‘Noah: Man of God,’ ‘Noah: Man of Resolve,’ ‘Noah: Man of Destiny.’ ‘In Defense of Easter’ and others. He is also a researcher and an apologist.</p> <p>There have been numerous opinions from Christians down through the centuries as it relates to this topic. Tim gave a brief synopsis of the 3 major views at issue here which include:</p> <p>The Sethite View—While diminishing a bit among scholarship, many people still hold to this view. It was the most dominant view in church history from about the 5<sup>th</sup> century until about 100 years ago. For Tim, its strength is that it doesn’t have to draw from very far outside the context although he also believes that it’s more of a negative reaction to the Fallen Angel View.</p> <p>From there, Tim moved on to explain the Royalty (divine tyrant) View, then he described the Fallen Angel (divine being) View.</p>

They were also involved in radio ministry in partnership with Trans World Radio, FEBC and HCJB. It was a time when the</p>



			<p>communists said they would eradicate any form of religion from their countries and put the last Bible ‘under glass’ in a museum in Moscow. Even though Peter left this life in 1987, God blessed his prayers in a big way as the walls of communism came down 3 years later.</p> <p>SGA operates under the authority of churches in the nations they serve and while the amount of freedom varies from country to country, he indicated that those churches are allowed to establish various theological training institutions. Once individuals are trained, they secure sponsors to the U.S. The SGA then sends national church planting families into previously unreached towns and villages to evangelize and plant new churches. Included in this effort is the providing of resources to meet both the physical and spiritual needs of people in the various communities.</p> <p>How is the coronavirus pandemic affecting Russia? While noting the challenges it presents, in the end Michael believes, ‘...this (the coronavirus pandemic) represents the greatest opportunity for the proclamation of the gospel since the fall of communism.’</p>

She obtained her undergraduate degrees in chemistry and mathematics from the University of Arizona in Tucson and her M.D. from Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. She completed an internal medicine residency at Parkland Memorial Hospital and University of Arizona Affiliated Hospitals and then became an instructor at the University of Arizona College of Medicine and a staff physician at the Tucson Veterans Administration Hospital. She’s been in solo private practice since 1981. In addition to AAPS, she’s currently president of Doctors for Disaster Preparedness. Last week a group of physicians went to Washington D.C. to hold a press conference to address COVID-19 concerns including prevention, treatment and the risks associated with the virus. Despite their credentials and medical backgrounds, ‘big tech’ decided to step in and shut them down.</p> <p>What was so egregious about what the doctors presented that ‘big tech’ shut them down, especially when all they were doing is noting their success and giving people hope? Dr. Orient noted that these were real doctors, seeing real patients and having success using hydroxychloroquine. 7/10	2nd Amendment Issues	Jim Schneider / Mark Walters	<p>Mark Walters is a national board member of the Citizens Committee for the Right to Keep and Bear Arms and the broadcast media spokesman for the Second Amendment Foundation. He's the recipient of the 2015 Gun Rights Defender of the Year Award, a columnist and author of three books, 'Lessons from Armed America' 'Lessons from Unarmed America' and 'Grilling While Armed.'</p> <p>Last Thursday, the Attorney General of New York sued the National Rifle Association, seeking to put them out of business. Allegations have been made that high ranking executives have diverted millions of dollars for things like personal trips, no-show contracts for associates and other questionable expenditures. Mark believes this is both politically motivated and about other concerns as well. Mark is critical of current management within the NRA and he spells out why in this broadcast.</p> <p>While that's been going on, there's the situation concerning the Attorney General of Washington, D.C. who's pursuing a civil case against the NRA Foundation. Is there a connection between this case and the one in New York?</p> <p>Mark communicated that when you begin to see things line up, you can legitimately question whether or not these are coincidences. At the same time, Paul wrote in <a href="#">II Timothy 1:7</a> that we've not been given a spirit of fear.</p> <p>He went on to note that fear is not an emotion. Fear is an evil spirit. So we have only two choices in our lives. Either we'll be filled with the Spirit of God (Christ living in us) or filled with the spirit of fear that comes from the enemy.</p> <p>When filled with the Spirit of God, we then function in the realm of the fruit of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, etc.—<a href="#">Galatians 5:22-23</a>), attributes that reflect a relationship with the living Lord Jesus. The other does just the opposite of that, robbing us of those same attributes while steering us toward apprehension and depression.</p> <p>Is the existence of this fear purposeful? Can we realistically keep everyone safe? These are just two questions that Dr. Frazier answered as he attempted to bring biblical balance to the COVID-19 issue and how we should view the future.</p>

Robert has held senior positions at the American Civil Rights Union, the Family Research Council, the Culture and Family Institute at Concerned Women for America, the Heritage Foundation, Coral Ridge Ministries and the Media Research Center. The goal is to intentionally get the victim to doubt their perception of reality and their memories.</p> <p>Dr. Brown discusses how we're being 'gaslighted' via rhetoric assaulting the nuclear family, the police, border/immigration control, capitalism and much more. Mat indicated that every single faculty member of Notre Dame felt the same way, even those whose have differing judicial philosophies.</p> <p>Barrett is married and has 7 children, 2 who were adopted from Haiti. If she gets through the confirmation hearings, she will be the first person on the Supreme Court to have school age children.</p>

			<p>Chuck Schumer and Pat Lahey have said that the American Bar Association evaluation is the 'gold standard' by which judicial candidates are judged. In 2017, a majority of the standing committee of the ABA believed that Barrett was well qualified. Interestingly, Chuck Schumer is now saying that Barrett is wildly out of the mainstream.</p> <p>What other attacks have been coming out against her?
