He's a licensed attorney, Christian school administrator, researcher and consultant. He is the author of the book, 'Secrets of the Trial of Jesus' and the DVD, 'The Trial of Jesus.' Why does Randy use the term 'secrets' in his book since we have the trial of Jesus plainly laid out in the Bible? He explained that sometimes we gloss over aspects of the trial itself, especially the build-up to it. This is especially important because as well-known as this trial is yet today, some people still don't correctly understand why Jesus came to earth. Randy explained that Jesus didn't come to earth to institute social justice or to solve an emotional problem and therefore we're to love ourselves. He also didn't come to solve a health problem, a financial problem or a paternity problem whereby some believe Jesus came to make us aware that we're all God's children. We were guilty individuals condemned to die shortly and awaiting execution. So Jesus   |

Ron is the author of over 70 books most of which deal in the area of apologetics. He has also authored some Bible study books. This program discussed his book, '90 Days Through the New Testament in Chronological Order'. Ron feels there's a great need for people to get back to the Bible. He noted that the reason why so many people don't feel close to the Lord is because they really aren't into God's Word. In response he's been writing books on Bible study to draw people back into Scripture and help them to understand how exciting it can be.  Why a book dealing with the N.T. in chronological fashion? Ron told listeners that the N.T. deals with real people and real events that happened in history. It's not just a book of theology or doctrine so he felt that people might like to cover it in the same order as events actually occurred.  Ron admitted that there is some debate regarding the chronological order of events. The chronology that he presents is mainstream among the very best conservative scholars, namely those who believe the Bible is the Word of God. In other words, the scholarship he used doesn't come from liberal voices that question whether the N.T. was actually written by Matthew, Mark, Luke & John or don't believe in miracles, etc.  This program is jam-packed with interesting facts as Ron covers numerous N.T. related topics and answers some questions as well. For example:  Over what period of time was the N.T. written?  A New Testament overview: What is its place in the entirety of Scripture and how is it broken down?  What about the differences in the New Testament accounts? Should any of them be viewed as contradictions?  Why we can understand the book of Acts as the Acts of the Holy Spirit and not just the Acts of the Apostles.  The implications and |

Churches which one time took positions in opposition to homosexuality and transgenderism are now removing their opposition and have become what some term, "opening and welcoming" on the subject allowing those who identify as being homosexual or transgender into their church membership and even into positions of authority in the church including that of the pastorate. It notes that evangelical LGBTQ individuals have been taught through the church that such relationships may be sinful yet these people of faith know deep within them that they were born that way. Is that true?  Dr. Brown began by telling the audience that God makes this very clear in Genesis where it says "male and female created he them." You are either XX (female) or XY (male). He's amazed at how many people are willing to put away science for feeling.  I Corinthians 6:9-11 says, 'Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate (the one who takes the female part in a homosexual relationship) nor abusers of themselves with mankind (that's the one who takes the male part) Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God."  The next part says, 'And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are justified in the name of our Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God."  Dr. Brown described how in context this is not a one-time incident but rather a lifestyle involving these practices, so as far as being born that way is concerned, such individuals are deceived. He admitted that when he was dating, he had the deep desire to have sexual relationships those girls he dated. He did not engage in that because the Bible says that activity is to be confined to the marriage relationship as I Corinthians 7 makes clear. So just because someone has the deep desire within themselves to engage in something doesn't make it biblical. The born-again believer will instead put off the old man and put on the new man.  Can a person be both faithful to God and to the understanding of themselves as being LGBTQ?  On this point Dr. Brown looked to Jude 1:3 where it encourages us to earnestly contend for the faith that is once delivered to the saints. T |

Paul Popov is the CEO of Door of Hope International. Door of Hope is a voice and a helping hand to persecuted Christians worldwide. In 1948, when he was just five years old, his father, prominent Protestant minister Haralan Popov, was brutally taken from his family by the KGB and arrested on false charges of being a 'spy for America.' It was 15 years later that Paul saw his father again. Having grown up without a father in a communist nation, he was deprived of many things. The Popov family was branded as 'enemies of the state.'  Paul began by discussing his recent visit to Bulgaria, a time of reflection and victory that lies in suffering for Christ because as he noted, the communists put many people to death.  What's interesting is how he described his father's ten-day trial under the communists. The New York Times, the BBC and others were actually invited to attend. That tells you the trial was different. It wasn't to simply destroy the church. It was to destroy it, as Paul put it, 'in a refined, modern, contemporary way by not killing them, but having them confess that they had done evil things.' This was part of the communists cold-war propaganda attempt to blacken Christians so that no one would have anything to do with them.  One of the things that was done on Haralan's birthday (March 7th) was to publish a book based upon secret police file evidence. This 500 page book tells how legally the trial looked very proper in terms of those involved; the prosecutors, the defense lawyers, etc. However, from the secret police documents, it was discovered that this proper formatting was all pre-determined in advance.  Paul described how this was the beginning of the propaganda war between East and West and two cultures, the Judeo-Christian worldview in the West vs. the communist/materialist worldview of atheism from the East. He's also the content manager for attractions at the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum. He is both a researcher and an apologist. Tim has served in the positions of a pastor and youth pastor. He's the author of numerous books including 'Old Earth Creationism on Trial', 'God and Cancer: Finding Hope in the Midst of God's Trials,' and the book we're discussing today 'In Defense of Easter: Answering Critical Challenges to the Resurrection of Jesus.'  Jim came right out with a tough accusation often tossed at Christians concerning Easter. It claims that Easter is a pagan holiday with connections to Ishtar or Ashtoreth.  Tim began by explaining that it's not wrong to celebrate the fact that Jesus rose from the dead. In fact, he believes we should be celebrating it every day.  The term 'Easter' most likely has a German origin (Ostern) which has to do with the rising of the sun. He warned listeners that while eggs and bunnies have become attached to the holiday, at the beginning God considered those things very good, so in and of themselves, rabbits and eggs aren't pagan. For Tim this means there really isn't much basis for the idea of attaching pagan connections to the celebration Christians call Easter.  Why does Tim believe the matter of the resurrection is so critical? He referred to 1 Corinthians 15 where Paul indicated that if there is no resurrection from the dead, Christ is not risen and our faith is futile.  This means we're still in our sins, we can't be forgiven and we'll suffer eternally for them. So if Christ hasn't risen, there is no Christian faith. Tim described the resurrection as God's stamp of approval regarding what Jesus did. Had Jesus only died and stayed in the grave, that would have made him a false prophet because he said he would rise.   |

That's an interesting point because as Tim's book points out, Jesus not only appeared to his followers, he also appeared to skeptics as well.  As this program moved along, Jim had Tim address the following:  -Change in the disciples as proof of the resurrection.  -The 2 classes of arguments skeptics use to try and explain away the resurrection.  -The existence of the church as proof of the resurrection.  -What is the 'principle of embarrassment?'  -Did Jesus arise physically or did he arise spiritually?  -Does the Bible text contradict itself regarding the resurrection?  -Peter LaBarbera is the founder and president of Americans for Truth, a non-partisan, educational group dedicated to exposing the homosexual-bisexual-transgender activist agendas.  Discussion began with news about South Bend, Indiana, Mayor Pete Buttigleg. The Human Rights Campaign (HRC) said that Buttigleg is, 'the first 'out' gay candidate to seek democratic nomination for president.' Do you know that both sides of the argument quote the bible? Joining us to discuss both the biblical and scientific arguments are Pat Roy and Kyle Justice. Together, they have produced a DVD titled "Faith on the Edge."  So, why is belief in the "flat earth" gaining 'ground?' Pat Roy believes that many "flat earthers" are "posting on social media and causing doubts by way of questioning the earth's characteristics. Roy says "once you start getting into it, you can get deeper and deeper" leading many to indoctrination. Furthermore (and sad but true), Roy says "a lot of people when asked to defend the round earth, actually couldn't do it." When did belief in a flat earth take off? Kyle Justice points back to the year 2014 when (again) social media became a platform for it's modern day movement.  Roy and Justice acknowledge there are both secular and biblical flat earthers who use the bible to defend their argument. However, Roy says "we've got to be careful that we are rightly dividing the Word of God." Roy says many times advocates are saying "take every verse literally" yet, we must remember there are several different literary styles used in the bible – therefore otherwise, we just make up for ourselves what we want the Scripture to be saying.  Why though? What do advocates of a flat earth stand to gain? He is frequently interviewed on topics such as abortion, sex education, pornography, gambling and on our topic today.  When did the push for marijuana begin? Smith (speaking of his state of Illinois) says it took ten years to become legal (effective in 2014) and now, five years later there is even more push back for more legalization claiming "not enough." Smith chides "(today with all of the available conditions) if you cannot qualify for medical marijuana in the state of Illinois, there is something wrong with you!"  But, what about the "medical side?" Marijuana advocates herald that only marijuana can provide true pain relief. Smith argues first of all "Raw marijuana is not medicine! Eating a raw plant that has not been dispensed, measured, or given in a prescribed dose, is absolutely ridiculous! Like eating mold and calling it penicillin." Furthermore, Smith mentions that there are "derivatives (of marijuana) that the FDA has approved that do not get you high (without THC)." Smith says "all the experts are looking at CBD (from marijuana) saying THIS is the real medical benefit in this plant whereas, the THC is what is sought after which is what gets a person high." | 4/24 | The Aftermath of the Mueller Report          | Jim Schneider /<br>Robert<br>Romano | Last week, the long awaited Mueller Report was released to the American people. The report vindicated President Trump of any collusion with Russia. Still, this has not satisfied members of the democratic party who are calling for the release of a report not redacted, and calling for testimony to be given by numerous individuals. Furthermore, are also calls for impeachment from the same. It appears so many are unhappy that the President is innocent and many are vowing to continue the "digging" until they can find him guilty of something – anything. Joining us to discuss the aftermath of the Mueller Report is the Vice President of Public Policy with Americans for Limited Government, Robert Romano.  According to the special counsel's report (Mueller), Romano comments "the evidence was not sufficient to charge that any member of the Trump campaign coordinated or conspired with representatives of the Russian government to interfere with the 2016 electionsnow we know from other documents disclosures that this investigation began as an opposition research document from the Clinton campaign and the DNC, who paid former British spy, Christopher Steele, to look into   |

Trump and then come up with this dossier – accusing Trump had conspired with Russia to hack the DNC." We now know that Mueller concluded, no evidence, no conspiracy. But, was there any spying, at all, during the time? Romano says "there was spying that occurred. There were FISA warrants which enabled the Justice Department to access campaign emails, phone calls, text messages and other forms of communication (which is spying) and this continued even after the election and carried over into the start of the Trump administration." Romano comments "Former FBI director, James Comey lied to President Trump about the extent of the investigation (which was really into Trump all along) whereas then, they wanted to charge the President with obstruction for firing Comey, for lying about the investigation which was based upon phony allegations." Romano says "James Comey should have been fired because we now know (again) there was no conspiracy." To the charge that the President obstructed justice? Romano comments "the White House (under Trump) fully cooperated with this investigation, turning over millions of documents and making no assertions of executive privilege to the special counsel. They got everything they were looking for and Mueller determined not to charge the President with obstruction of Justice." Crosstalk also discusses allegations (from just this week) where Hillary Clinton said "Any other person who has engaged in those acts would certainly have been indicted, but, because of the rule in the Justice Department that you can't indict a sitting President, the whole matter of obstruction was very directly sent to the Congress. I'm really of the mind that the Mueller Report is part of the beginning. It's not the end." However, Romano says "it's very Soviet (of them), for doing something completely alien to the American system of justice; even totalitarian what almost happened here to the President yet, he survived, he's stronger politically now as a result of what all they have been doing (against him) since 2016." He's been involved with many books and DVD's and is a regular speaker in the Creation Museum Speaker Series. He's the author, co-author or editor of numerous books including being co-editor of a book we're discussing today, 'Glass House: Shattering the Myth of Evolution.'  As Bodie shows, evolutionary theory actually predates Darwin and in addition, it really isn't a theory. He explained that a theory is something much more than an idea. In science, a theory is something that is very well attested to. You go from a hypothesis to a theory and then to a law. There's nothing really against a theory but in the case of evolution, there are a lot of problems with it. So in the end, he refers to evolution as a hypothesis, a model, an idea, a belief system or a worldview.  Co-editor Ken Ham asks in the introduction of the book whether evolution has infiltrated the church. Bodie responded by noting that there has been an encroachment, a subtle progression that began in the late 1700's and early 1800's.  So if he goes to a church and says that in the beginning God created the heavens and the earth, everyone will say 'Amen!' On the other hand, if he then says that God did this in six, normal length days as it says in Genesis 1, some will say, 'How about the 'big-bang' theory and millions of years?' That shows how a portion of the evolutionary worldview has infiltrated the church.  In the end, for Bodie this is an authority issue. Whether you're talking about the flood, geological rock layers or the existence of God himself, He's the ultimate authority on all these subjects. As he noted, 'To object to God and His Word means you're elevating yourself to an authority greater than God.'  As this Crosstalk continued, he defined the term 'evolution', how the church is responding to the creation/evolution debate, why science comes out of a Christian worldview, 'living fossils' and the 'stasis' argument, what DNA s |

Gary is the former Europe and Middle East Trade Specialist for the Indiana State Government. In 1987, Gary was invited to join the World Constitution and Parliament Association, one of the organizations involved at the forefront of promoting the world government agenda. During the next 4 years he obtained detailed documents which demonstrated that the push toward a one-world government was active and rapidly advancing. He's the author of 'Enroute to Global Occupation' and 'The New World Religion.' Gary began by describing the cultural, social and moral landscape today. Gary then shared his concerns over what people call the 'Deep State.' Since around the late '70's, there's been a push to get bureaucratic, left-leaning socialists into the Washington bureaucracy. He believes the 'Deep State' has done an incredible job in this regard. He believes it would take President Trump more than 10 years to 'drain the swamp' of left-leaning bureaucrats that exist in the State Department, the Justice Department, the Treasury and other cabinet level departments. The Equality Act amends a number of federal laws by elevating sexual orientation and gender identity to the same level as race in areas such as public accommodation, employment, etc. This expansion will cover every aspect of American life. In other words, anything you can't currently do regarding race you won't be able to do legally respective to LGBTQ. This includes cities, states, churches, religious organizations, all schools through the college and university level regardless of whether they're Christian, public or private. The next Sunday, he came back and he hung around while John put materials away and asked if he could come to John's house that day. John wanted to check with his parents at which point Jerry said that he didn't have a dad and his mother was working and she said it was OK.  John left a note on the door of Jerry's mother's place and Jerry went to John's for the afternoon. Eventually Jerry's mother came out with a suitcase and box of clothes. She told John that she had just remarried and has 3 children. Her husband had given her 30 days from the time of their wedding (about two weeks prior) to get rid of any two of her three children.  Through this experience, John and Jan got into trouble with county welfare agency because they didn't know you had to be licensed as foster parents in order to have a non-relative living with you for more than 78 days. Marissa Henley is a cancer survivor who writes and speaks about faith, friendship, God's character and suffering. She's the author of the book, 'Loving Your Friend Through Cancer.'  On October 25 <sup>th</sup> of 2010, the day before her 34 <sup>th</sup> birthday, Marissa, a mother with children of 6,4 and 18 months, received her biopsy results. The doctor told her that she had a rare and aggressive form of cancer known as angiosarcoma.  After hanging up with the doctor, she did what she doesn't recommend. She typed her cancer into Google and learned that the five year survival rate for people with angiosarcoma is about 30%.  Marissa began crying out to God to preserve her life, to allow her to live at least those 5 years, be able to see her children grow up and for her daughter to be able to remember her.  She went through a long treatment journey that lasted several months. Also, because her cancer was rare with a poor prognosis, she was  |

Eventually, 12 individuals, along with the gunman, were killed in what's been called the nation's deadliest mass shooting this year and the worst mass shooting in the history of Virginia Beach.  While not readily reported by most media, the shooting took place in a gun-free zone. However, as expected, many began pontificating on the need for what's termed, 'common sense gun control.'  Joining Jim to examine this issue was Alan Gottlieb. Alan is the founder of the Second Amendment Foundation, an organization that is dedicated to promoting a better understanding about our constitutional heritage to privately own and possess firearms. He's the author of numerous books including, 'Dancing in Blood: Exposing the Gun Lobby to Destroy Your Rights,' 'Politically Correct Guns,' 'The Gun Rights Fact Book,' and numerous others.  Jim began by noting an interesting statistic from the Crime Prevention Research Center. They examined public mass shootings from 1950 to May of 2018. They found that 97.8% of shootings occurred in gun-free zones.  Alan clarified that this was a gun-free zone only in the sense that employees weren't allowed to have a firearm. Those who were allowed by state law to conceal-carry could be in the building. Unfortunately, most of the people were employees, not non-employees.  So is there a law that could have stopped this incident from occurring? In this case Alan doesn't believe there is. The Virginia governor has come out with a proposal that involves forms of gun control that Alan believes are really old, repackaged versions. For example, he desires                   |

|     |                               |                                       | to ban assault weapons. The problem is, the shooter didn't use an assault weapon. The governor has come out in favor of universal background checks. The killer went through multiple background checks including an enhanced check. The governor has come out in favor of a one gun a month limitation on purchasing a firearm. The shooter bought the guns in 2016 and 2018, not exactly in the same month.  Alan believes that criminals by nature are going to break laws. So why should we believe that passing one more law is going to solve this problem?  Alan admits he doesn't have the answer, but the 'gun grabbers' are using this issue to further their gun rights agenda and to try and prohibit individual gun ownership because they don't have any answers either. Alan doesn't see justice in this disarming of the public. Instead he views it as social bigotry by those who'd never tolerate a similar 'broad-brush' policy aimed at the rights of any other social, cultural, religious or ethnic group. He's the speaker on 'The American Minute' daily broadcast.  Adolph Hitler was the head of the National Socialist Workers Party in Germany and eventually became the chancellor in the 1930's. Along with Italy's Mussolini who had invaded Ethiopia, to Emperor Hirohito in Japan who had invaded China, things were heating up worldwide, indicating that WWI might not be the war to end all wars as many had hoped.  Eventually these 3 nations teamed up to bring about WWII, as Hitler went from economic hero to aggressive dictator. In addition to this historical overview, William also looked at the D-Day prayer of Democrat Franklin Roosevelt. In fact, President Trump just recently read portions from it during his D-Day address. It was during his second stay in prison that he met a correctional officer who challenged him, and kept consistently reminding him, that God did not create him to be this way. As much as that hurt his feelings, within a few weeks David was seeking that offic |
