APRIL

- 01 - 6:00 The world moved deeply before the deterioration of the pontiff Jean Paul the Second. The Vatican reported today the agonizing situation of the Holy Father, with respiratory insufficiency, cardiac, and renal failure, intensified by a urinary infection. At noon was said the Pope was in an inconsistent state.
11:00 While a new day appears in Vatican City, many followers continue gathering at Saint Peter's Square, and they pray and wait for news in relation to the health of Pope Jean Paul the Second. According to the Vatican, the Pope has conscience of his situation and his closest collaborators responded to his need, for them not to transfer him back to the hospital. He continues being seen at his room in the Vatican.
- 04 - 6:00 In Vatican City, thousands of supporters continue giving the last farewell to Pope Jean Paul the Second. The body of the pontiff lies down in the Clements Chapel, at Saint Peter's Cathedral. Millions of people are expected to assist to give the Pope the last goodbye.
11:00 In other news, In Fairfax, Police authorities returned to the neighborhood where a suspect invaded a residency with the purpose to attack sexually with a knife to a woman.
- 05 - 6:00 The endless march of thousands of people continues at Saint Peter's Cathedral, to pay respect and give the last farewell to Pope Jean Paul the Second. And once the Pope is entombing, the Cardinals following a tradition will choose the new successor of Saint Peter.
11:00 Changing a tradition of centuries and by a request of the deceased Pope Jean Paul the Second, the sound of bells will be added to the traditional white smoke to announce the world the election of a new Pope. At the same time, thousands of followers continue marching before the body of the Pope at Saint Peter's Cathedral.
- 06 - 6:00 President George W. Bush, and two of his predated, gathered this afternoon along thousands of peregrines that continue paying honor to Pope Jean Paul the Second, whose papacy embraced the government of five presidents of the United States.
11:00 The election of a new pope is considered one of the most important in history. The process through a special conclave requires arduous organization and a series of step to follow.
- 07 - 6:00 The doors at Saint Peter's Cathedral remain close, after four days of interminable pilgrimage of million of people from around the world. Authorities in the Vatican said that around two million of peregrines passed by the remains of the pope. At the same time, many wait for the beginning of the funeral services.
11:00 The Vatican made public the details of the solemn funeral for its sanctity Pope Jean Paul the Second, which will be held tomorrow. The mass of farewell will be carrying through Saint Peter's Square, and will be preceded of a procession with mortal remains, later introduced in a coffin of cypress tree, lined of crimson velvet. The remains will be placed in the coffin with a white silk watch over the face, a rosary in the hands, with ritual attire, and white miter. The remains of Jean Paul the Second will be buried next to the crypt of Saint Peter, who is known for been the first pope in Catholic history.
- 08 - 6:00 Powerful and humble people, united without class distinction, got together in the greatest concentration ever known in modern times, just to say goodbye in a emotive way to Jean Paul the Second.
11:00 In El Salvador, ex-president Francisco Flores made public that will resigned from his candidacy to the general secretary of the Organizations of American States, confined in Washington DC. Flores said that this decision was made in relation to the dangerous situation that separate the Mesoamerican region instead of unifies it. The announce emerged only two days, before representatives of various countries that conform the OEA gather in Washington to elect the next general secretary of this organization. The resignation will be presented formally this Monday in Washington.
- 11 - 6:00 In Washington, the police arrested a suspicious man that entered the Capitol with two suitcases. The two bags were examined by specialized explosive equipment, and later checked by personnel. The Capitol main building was briefly evacuated for precaution. According to authorities, the suspect attired totally in black refused to follow orders to abandon the area, and later was arrested. The suspect from China, has migratory, and mentally problems according to authorities.
11:00 In Annapolis, state legislators are about to end the legislative session for this year, which involves topics such as, slot machines, and international trades. On the other hand, immigrants expect good news in the way driving license could be processed.
12 - 6:00 The congress is considering the infliction and new restrictions those illegal residents look to expedite driving license, also other measurement of benefits.
11:00 The man that caused trouble this past Monday in the Capitol, will face charges, but he will be taken out of the country as soon as possible. A prosecutor decided not to press charges against him. Authorities from immigration indicated that the man entered to the United States with an Australian passport, and was looking forward to see President Bush.
- 13 - 6:00 About three thousand laboratories around the world, received by error, samples of a deadly virus. The Pathology College of the United States wrongly sent the samples with investigative purpose. The Organization of World Health is asking for the urgent destruction, because of the risk that involves the use of this dangerous virus in an incorrect manner. Laboratories of 18 countries received the virus including, Brazil, Chile, and Mexico. The virus better known as Asiatic fever, killed over a million people in 1957.
11:00 The metropolitan area of Washington, experience once again the emotion of major league baseball, with the official presentation in the regular season of its team the Nationals, in the Robert F. Kennedy Stadium. With the participation of President George W. Bush, authorities made additional measurements to secure the audience. Every person will experience revisions, and will pass through metal detectors before entering the event. Doors will open at 4 p.m.
- 14 - 6:00 After 34 years of long wait, baseball made its comeback in Washington. At this moment, thousands of baseball fans are gathering at the R.F.K. Stadium to view the home inauguration of the regular season for the Nationals. Is expected the participation of President George W. Bush, who will throw the first pitch to initiate the festivities. The police in Washington and other government agencies reinforced the security around the stadium. Fans will be inspected before entering the event. At the same time, traffic is causing some problems around the area. The game is schedule to start at 7 p.m., with an expectation of 46 thousands fans.
11:00 Two men were found guilty in a Federal Court in Greenbelt, for conspiracy to submit false documents of illegal workers through federal agencies. Maqsoon Mir, a lawyer of Potomac, and Mamad Bajwa, a man dedicated to business in Herdon were found guilty today for committing fraud to the immigration agency. The sentence will be dictated on July 20; both of these men face 20 years in prison. According to prosecutors, the fraud was committed between 1998 and 2003.
- 15 - 6:00 If you are planning to be in the surroundings of the World Bank, and the International Monetary Reserve in Washington, this weekend, is prepare to expect delays and congestions, streets will be close, because of protests that will initiate tonight.
11:00 If you haven't sent your tax declaration, still have few minutes to do it. The last chance to give report to Uncle Sam expires at 12 tonight.
- 18 - 6:00 The public schools of Arlington County are mourning the death of a girl, after this morning's grave accident between a school bus and a recycle truck.
11:00 A Mexican woman that used to sell flowers in the streets continue missing, after she was kidnapped during day time in Silver Spring.
- 19 - 6:00 His name Benedict XVI, from Germany, he is the guardian of the conservative doctrine. The pope was elected today after 25 hours of deliberation, he is number 265. The crowd shouted, and cheered before the first presentation of the German Cardinal, Joseph Ratzinger as pope. On his first introduction to the people, the new pope addressed his message saying "Dear brothers and sisters."
11:00 The world has a new Pope; thousands of people celebrate the new leader of the Catholic Church. Tonight St. Mathews's Cathedral celebrated a mass in honor to the Pope.
- 20 - 6:00 In Arlington County, authorities continue investigating the causes of the fatal accident that left the death of a girl. Police investigate both of the driver's records.
11:00 The mayor of Washington, Anthony Williams could face problems if recognizing the marriage between homosexuals.
- 21 - 6:00 In Arlington, while families of the girl Lilibeth Gomez, prepare to give her the last goodbye, another minor died after consequences of the tragic accident between a school bus and a recycle truck.
11:00 Another Hispanic family cries the loss of his son, after the tragic accident in Arlington County, between a school bus and a recycle truck.
- 22 - 6:00 Community entities and activist groups ask the MVA, to perform the law, and standing regulations for the inmigrants with access to driver license.
11:00 Three people including two former employees of MVA were arrested, and face charges of falsification of personal documentation and fraud. According to the police, Dodson Robery, Margentina Pinilla, and Valentin Milstein, charged the amount of 1000 dollars to fake the documents.
- 25 - 6:00 According to studies, more Latinos are reaching the American dream, and obtain to purchase of their own house, however many keep being victim of abuse.

11:00 The death of two children in an accident between a school bus and a recycle truck, moved the community of Arlington, and tonight a vigil was celebrated in memory of Lilibeth and Harrison.
26 - 6:00 Frontier groups arrived to the Capitol today, to ask for a migratory reform, and to give notice of human right violations that suffer illegal immigrants.
11:00 The Archbishop, Theodore McCarrick arrived to Washington after 22 days in the Vatican. The prelate spoke about the new plan of Pope Benedict XVI to bring communities together.
27 - 6:00 An man entrenched in a house with his nine-year-old son, in Alexandria, is in critical condition after receiving gunshots from the police. The minor is now safe.
11:00 A suspect in a series of fires in the metropolitan area, appeared before a court today, and faces multiple federal charges in Maryland and Washington.
28 - 6:00 In Maryland a group of Latinos could be fired, for not speaking English correctly.
11:00 Tonight president George W. Bush addressed a proposal to reform the social security. At the same time, he spoke about the proposal to control the rising prices of gasoline, education, and others.
29 - 6:00 Thomas Sweatt, accused of a series of fires around the metropolitan region, once again appeared before a court in Greenbelt. Sweatt faces charges in Maryland and Washington.
11:00 In Baltimore, detectives from the Homicide Department, informed that the two suspects, immigrants from Mexico are now witnesses from the case that involves the assassination of three minors. Policarpio Espinoza Perez, 22, and his cousin Adan Espinoza Canela, 17, declared themselves as innocent.

MAY

02 - 6:00 In Washington, the high costs of medical care for people without health insurance, are forcing various community organizations to prepare an initiative in order to abate the high costs.
11:00 In Montgomery Co., authorities search for the responsible to destruct several school buses. Officials don't discard the participation of juvenile gangs to this act.
03 - 6:00 Various initiatives against illegal immigrants are close to be approved by the Congress, among the reforms are the new requisites to obtain driver licenses, refuge, and to enforce the barrier in the frontier.
11:00 The Prince George Police is searching for the person responsible to gunshot a 22 year-old-man. The incident happened around 5:30 this afternoon, in Central Ave. close to Cindy Lane.
04 - 6:00 In the District of Columbia, authorities search for a man that attacked an 82-year-old woman yesterday. The incident occurred around 4:30 p.m. in the zone of Foggy Bottom; the victim was beaten repeatedly; the suspect later took her bag and ran away.
11:00 The federal law that involves procedures to obtain asylum in this country and driver license, require almost impossible solutions for those looking for legal status in this country. The topic is generating protests among organizations in Maryland.
05 - 6:00 The immigration and citizenship service extended considerably the number of visas addressed to professionals that concluded their studies in this country. The applicants can apply from May 12 of the present year.
11:00 The U.S. House of Representatives approved this afternoon the Real-ID Proposal, which will limit the access of driver license to illegal immigrants. Meanwhile, oppose parties, such as, the Mexican Embassy react after the resolution.
06 - 6:00 The Immigration and Citizenship Department will fast the process of legal procedures.
11:00 The police in Washington know the responsible of a brutal attack proportioned to an 83-year-old woman. The aggressor attacked the victim, and later stole an unknown amount of money from the victim.
09 - 6:00 Authorities said that will implement new rules to protect people from automobile accidents, the target audience will be young adults, now in time of graduation.
11:00 Just a day before various presidents from Central America arrive to Washington, protests are being held against the CAFTA resolution.
10 - 6:00 The Catholic Church of this nation initiated a campaign in favor of the immigrants and the protests against representatives of two political parties and their posture in response to a propose that requires stronger measurements to obtain driving license.
11:00 Illegal immigrants suffered a loss in the Congress today, after a battle against the reinforcement and new measurements to get driver license. The vote was unanimous, and it will force states to change their methods to obtain the licenses.
11 - 6:00 In Washington, moments of uncertainty were experienced today, after a small Airplane passed through the legal space in the perimeter of the white House.
11:00 The pilot and co-pilot that violated the restrictions of air space in the surroundings of Washington DC, were freed today at noon. According to federal authorities, the two men will not face criminal charges.
12 - 6:00 Today, President George W. Bush received presidents from Central America and the Dominican Republic, to discuss the CAFTA, which confront an opposition in the Congress.
11:00 Today was presented an important legislation, which will benefit the legalization of thousands of people. The legislation will embrace a broad reform of immigration laws.
13 - 6:00 Residents of Langley Park, mostly populated by immigrants will have the opportunity to find solutions for crime, vagrancy, alcoholism, and other problems, in conjunction with authorities from the area.
11:00 Fire workers detained a ten-year-old child, for supposed responsible to firing three cars in an apartment building of Silver Spring, Maryland.
16 - 6:00 A voracious fire took the life of two immigrants women from Peru. The two women used to live around Bailey's Cross Road, in the north of Virginia.
11:00 A new fire was reported in Montgomery County today, according to authorities the consequences of this event was produced by lack of prevention.
17 - 6:00 This afternoon, 17 students from High Point High School, in Prince Georges County, were transported to the hospital after an accident between the school bus and a vehicle in Beltsville. According to the police, the students suffered slight injuries.
11:00 In Alexandria, Virginia, two gang members were found guilty, in the federal case for the assassination of Brenda Paz, a pregnant woman, killed with a knife, later found in the borders of Shenandoah River.
18 - 6:00 In Arlington, a Yorktown High School student was arrested, after presumptively send a threat to another student. The school building was revised for two hours, but the police couldn't find any threatening object.
11:00 Authorities from the District of Columbia, in specific from an area mostly populated by Latinos, search for alternatives to combat crime, drugs, and delinquency.
19 - 6:00 Leaders in the District of Columbia, reacted with preoccupation before the intent from a conservative side of the Congress, to legalize guns in the District of Columbia.
11:00 Authorities chose to evacuate a sector of the University of Maryland, before an anonymous threat.
20 - 6:00 In Washington, protests eject, asking for the extradition of Luis Posada Carriles, accused in Venezuela for attempt against a passenger's aircraft.
11:00 A woman from Hispanic origin was taken to the hospital after being dragged by a car, this morning in the District of Columbia. The driver, who was driving a Honda vehicle escaped from the location. Police said that they found the vehicle abandoned close to the 16 and Spring Streets.
23 - 6:00 Summer time is around the corner and students out of school for vacations. For this reason the Montgomery County is getting prepare, creating an initiative to inform young people about security at work.
11:00 Authorities from Montgomery, Prince George County, the Archbishop of Washington, and community entities announced the future construction of a community center designated to help juveniles involved with gangs.
24 - 6:00 The measurements to eliminate, and diminish the illegal immigration in this country is the main issue in the Congress; it is also argue a controversial study to secure the frontier.
11:00 Parents react after the sexual assault to a 16 year old girl, in Wheaton High School. Two persons are in police custody.
25 - 6:00 A fatal accident registered this morning, reflects the necessity of immigrants to get a job, at the same time, reflects the lack of knowledge on traffic regulations.
11:00 A group of Latin women united to confront a battle against their employers, in order to syndicalized and fight for their rights.

26 - 6:00 Early this morning, an explosion was reported, when a subterranean transformer in the intersection of the 19 and G street got on fire.
11:00 Today, the police of the District of Columbia initiated an intensive campaign against drivers that violate traffic regulations; police said they will apply severe penalties.
27 - 6:00 Authorities advice the population on the risks that rivers and swimming pools represent in times of vacation, and holidays.
11:00 Authorities from different states advice, and remind drivers about the importance to buckle up, and not to drive under alcohol influence.
30 - 6:00 Today, in the National Cemetery of Arlington, President George W. Bush, pay respect to the men and women that lost their lives for this country in times of war.
11:00 Thousands of people from the Washington area returned after the extended weekend vacation. It is calculated that 500 thousand people left the area to visit the closest beaches and mountains.
31 - 6:00 The metropolitan police of Washington is after two suspects responsible to gunshot a group of people, killing one of them and leaving some in critical condition. This incident happened last night, in the northeast of 1st street.
11:00 The Washington Post, confirmed today that a former FBI agent was the confidential source, who gave internal information about Richard Nixon's presidency, the same ended his government.

JUNE

01 - 6:00 The issue of juvenile gangs and their criminal activities, will be debated for the first time in a meeting, where chancellors of 34 countries, members of the American States Organization will consider the problem and the difficulties to find a solution. According to the Dept. of Justice there are 30, 000 gangs with 800 members, which affect about 2,500 communities. The chancellors will meet this Sunday through Tuesday in Fort Lauderdale, FL.
11:00 A man crossed over the perimeter of the White House. The incident occurred in the afternoon, in front of Pennsylvania Ave. According to witnesses, the man jumped the fence in the Northeast side of the presidential mansion, saying that he was going to see the president. Once inside the secret service arrested him.
02 - 6:00 An unidentified male was shot in the head in the community of Brookshire, in District Heights, Maryland. His health is in critical condition.
And Prince George Police continue investigating the death of a woman. The victim was identified as Stacey Seaton, 17, a resident of Silver Maple Court, Bowie. She was found unconscious, and later died at a hospital in Bowie. The young woman was pregnant; she received gunshots on her head.
11:00 Montgomery County Police is investigating a case of rape of a woman of Gaithersburg. The police are after two Hispanic males; this incident occurred May 23 around 6 p.m. in apartments of West Deer Park Street. The victim was doing laundry when she was attacked.
03 - 6:00 Only two days after the beginning of a security campaign to prevent driving, and pedestrian accidents in Maryland, another Hispanic worker is added to the list of people that lose their lives tragically this year.
11:00 The Police Dept. of North Virginia is looking for a suspect that attacked a girl sexually. The case is alarming because it occurred in a recognized toy store.
06 - 6:00 The body of a Hispanic woman was found in the interior of an apartment building, where the majority of its residents are immigrants. Supposedly she was strangled.
11:00 After four weeks of intense protest from citizens, the president of Bolivia, Carlos Mesa resigned during a televised speech. The chief said that he would continue his presidency until the congress reviews his determination. Mesa plans to stay in Bolivian soil.
07 - 6:00 A woman died this morning in a rare accident in the Ronald Reagan National Airport. According to a spokesman of Airways Airline, the woman who unloaded luggage equipment was trapped between the machine and the aircraft. The flight with destination to Chicago was cancelled and passengers boarded another airline.
11:00 The woman who died this morning in a rare accident, in the Ronald Reagan National Airport was identified as Yolanda Devone Corbett, 32. The woman was a Washington DC resident.
08 - 6:00 The driver of a truck is dead after smashing the vehicle against a fence, in road 66 around Centerville. As a consequence of this accident the traffic jam continues along the busy highway.
11:00 A combination of forces between the Police Dept. of North Virginia, Fire Dept, and military staff, took another step of a constant preparation to confront an emergency of magnitude. For example, a terrorist attacks with chemical substance.
09 - 6:00 In Montgomery County, an ex-federal agent who was been judged for murder of a young marine after a traffic argument, was absolved of murder, but found guilty of other charges. The charges against Arthur Lloyd, 54, involve involuntary murder, and use of a weapon, and others. Lloyd will continue arrested until the sentence day schedule for July 26. He faces 35 years in prison.
11:00 In Bolivia a miner worker died today after violent confrontations between workers, farmers and the police of the city of Sucre. The congress was forced to suspend a crucial session, which concerned the issue of the resigned president Carlos Mesa.
10 - 6:00 A resident of Lorton has been accused to sexual harassed two girls, according to the police of Fairfax. Officials say that a man identified as Carlos Emilio Reategui, 48, molested an eight year old at her residency. This incident took place on March 14, before this incident another girl complained against Reategui. He was arrested at his residence in Lorton this past Friday. Reategui has been in jail since then, without bail.
11:00 A faithful community in Maryland was surprised to find out that religious services, and principal sacraments were being given by a supposed impostor, which pretending being a "Catholic Priest," baptized, married, and even gave certificates with signatures and religious stamps.
13 - 6:00 And as you heard, Michael Jackson gets once again all the attention from the country and the world. This afternoon he was declared "not guilty" by the jury in the case against him for supposed sexual abuse towards a minor. The jury found him not guilty of all the ten charges that a 15 year old and his family accused him.
11:00 A strong seism of 7.9 magnitudes, tossed the north of Chile, and part of the south of Peru, leaving at least eight deaths and some injured, according to officials. The earthquake was reported at 6:48 p.m. local time, the epicenter was at 110 kilometers at the northeast of Iquique, an unpopulated zone from the Andes.
14 - 6:00 The public schools of the District of Columbia, suspended their classes today at 12:30, because of the high temperatures that affected the region. These high temperatures forced many to look for shelter, especially elderly people with respiratory problems.
11:00 The area of Washington experienced today the first heat alert, caused by the high temperatures that were close to the 100 degrees. As consequence the heat forced the closure of public schools, and doctors to advise the community.
15 - 6:00 The heat continues affecting the area and the high temperatures give place to new preventions, especially to guide people with respiratory problems, children and elderly.
11:00 Although the Wilson Bridge project generates good expectations for the ones that travel between Virginia, Maryland, and the District of Columbia, residents in Alexandria will be the most affected for the inconvenient changes construction will turn over.
16 - 6:00 At least 19 people died, and 40 were injured when a hill knock out of plum on top of several houses in a region at the north of Guatemala. The president, Oscar Berger cancelled this agenda for the day to be present at the place of the disaster at the hill of "El Calvario" in the community of San Antonio Senahdu. The disaster occurred Wednesday at night.
11:00 In Washington, the FBI led the investigation of an unknown material that arrived today at the Israel Embassy. According to investigators, an employee of the embassy opened the letter, which is being examined at this time in a laboratory of Bethesda. Apparently, only one person was exposed to the substance, and damages haven't being reported.
17 - 6:00 Authorities from Fairfax County are worry for the terror that many immigrant families experience with domestic violence. Today, entities from the government and the community gave ideas to prevent this form of abuse.
11:00 Police is searching for two impostors that pretended to be officials from the zone of Gaithersburg.
20 - 6:00 Numerous people lost their houses and belongings after an atrocious fire, registered this past weekend in Wheaton.
11:00 In Arlington, representatives of different institutions and parents, gather today to analyze, and argue the process that investigate the reasons that provoked the fatal accident of a school bus where two Hispanic students lost their lives.
21 - 6:00 Police from the metropolitan region merged to control aggressive driving, those who don't respect the law, and place in danger their lives and the rest of the community.

11:00 The police dept. of Prince George mourns this morning, after the death of an officer, who died in a shoot out in Laurel. The officer Steve Gaughan had 15 years working for the county police. The confrontation occurred this morning around south Laurel Drive and route 197.

22 - 6:00 Flags in middle antler rest in Prince George County, in honor to the officer that was killed yesterday in Laurel. A man was identified as Robert Mark Billett, 43, accused for the death of Officer Steven Gaughan, and faces charges of 1st degree murder. The suspect remains hospitalized after being injured for another officer involved in the altercation. According to the police Billett had criminal background for drug and assault.

11:00 A terrible criminal act almost ended the life of a young man. He was burned alive in the parking lot of a mall.

23 - 6:00 An indict that juvenile crime is on a rise in the District of Columbia, is the arrest of a 15 year old caring an A-K 47. Today, Chief police, Charles Ramsey, gave details of a plan against juvenile violence, which it will be implemented this summer.

11:00 An innovated system to control parking substitute the traditional parking meters in the streets, and avenues of Washington DC. The change started in the residential zone of Georgetown.

24 - 6:00 Hundreds of officials of various police departments from all around the country, relatives, and friends of officer Steven Gaughan are present in the funeral in Beltsville to honor his life. Gaughan was killed by gunshots this past Tuesday, after stopping a vehicle close to a residential zone in Laurel. One of the occupants shot him in the abdomen. Gaughan's body will be entombing tomorrow, at the Baptist Church in Riverdale.

11:00 The three children that disappeared this past Wednesday, were found dead in the trunk of a car, parked close to the yard where they were last seen.

27 - 6:00 Another pedestrian accident took the life of a four-year-old girl, and left her mother seriously injured. This new accident happened around Oxon Hill, in specific route 210, Palmer Road, Prince George County. Authorities said that the driver had green light.

11:00 A minor died today after being crashed by a vehicle in Montgomery County. The police informed that the vehicle crashes two people, one of them the girl, who died instantly. Investigators also said that the driver had green light, and wasn't driving in high speed.

28 - 6:00 Humidity and high temperatures registered during past days forced the National Weather Service to extend a heat advisory. According to the National Weather Service, this summer is expected to register high temperatures, which combined with humidity could produce temperatures over the 100 degrees. Authorities recommend the community, in specific third age people, and children with respiratory problems to protect themselves, and to drink liquid.

11:00 The president of the United States, George W. Bush asked the country for patience, in relation to the difficult work in Iraq. At the same time, President Bush rejected the petitions to arrange a date to retired the military forces, or to send more to combat the insurgents. The speech was delivered in a moment where violence in Iraq has affected the popularity of the commander and chief.
