“What makes this device unique is that it gives patients 16 options they are able to control, not only the location of the stimulation (towards the head, towards the tail, to the right, to the left, etc.), but also provide multiple kinds of electrical currents to address multiple issues,” said Martin. “In short, it repairs the connection of the spinal cord to the brain, therefore, the brain and the muscles are able to communicate. The overall goal is to restore motion that was lost due to a spinal cord injury.”
