Section A: Newscast Overview

KY TZ FM Radio produces 4 daily newscasts. Three minute 'morning drive' reports air at 5:57, 6:57, 7:57 and 8:57am.

News Treatments: The nominal length of each of our lead or feature stories described below is between thirty-seconds and two minutes-thirty seconds.

News Cycle: Exclusive stories run in each of the daily local newscasts before being archived. As an example: A local story or feature will air 4 times in the course of a day, once in each newscast. In addition these stories are available to our audience on-demand via our station website for one week from date of first broadcast.

The below stories are representative of the local news content we produce on a daily basis:

April 18th: Talked to NDSU Extension Agent Ron Beneda about fieldwork. The snowpack is still solid and farmers are waiting to start fieldwork. He thinks that will start in mid to late-May. For now, there's still time to seed crops and get a good crop so farmers aren't worried yet.

April 23rd: Talked to North Dakota Assistant Secretary of State Jim Silrum. Walsh County's vote totals for the 2012 presidential election were wrong. Silrum and Walsh County election worker Linda Meberg explained the problems. The problems were addressed. The problems included an inadvertant adding of vote totals in the City of Grafton twice. The problem was rectified and won't happen again. The problem did not alter any COUNTYWIDE election results. The issue was very important for the entire county.

May 10th: Talked to the chairman of the Walsh County School Annexation Reorganizational Board, Joe Bata of Adams. Bata said there is a snag with the reorganization of the Adams and Park River school districts into the Park River Area School District. It appears the Adams School Board is spending money that should be turned over on the date of the reorganization of the two districts. The Reorganizational Committee has approved a spending limit that has already been reached by Adams. Bata says that should correct the problem.

May 10th: Talked to farmer Tom Campbell of Grafton. Campbell says he's just getting into the fields. He's seeding wheat and potatoes. Campbell says the big problem for him is going to be the type of growing season overall. Campbell says if there's a dry season, that'll be difficult for crops. He also says we have had a late spring. If there's an early fall, that'll put farmers in a bind because they will need all the warm, growing days possible for crops to reach maturity.

June 17th: Talked to Cavalier County Job Development Authority Executive Director Carol Goodman about plans to purchase the Stanley R. Mikkelsen Safeguard Complex. She says negotiations are ongoing with the person who's filed the high bid to buy the former U.S. government property. But other than that she can't say much because the JDA board of directors has been meeting in executive session to discuss further steps, if any. Our station is maintaining contact with Goodman and the JDA on that community and regional issue.

June 21st: Talked to Richard Flanders, Cavalier County Commissioner. Flanders says there are changes to county government due to the last North Dakota legislative session. He's saying those changes are going to be things county government will have to respond to. Money is always a problem. This is something that is different this year though. The state has appropriated money to all counties to use for infrastructure. Flanders is wondering when Cavalier County will get their money sent to them.

Section B: Special and Non-Broadcast Events

Throughout the year Simmons Stations assist local groups and organizations with the promotion and or co-sponsorship of various activities and events. 1- Relay For Life

Each year Simmons Multimedia Stations participate as a co-sponsor in several local Relay For Life events throughout our coverage area. We provide not only free air time for promoting the various American Cancer Society Relay fundraisers, but also make cash donations to this worthwhile cause.

2- CCMH Foundation Golf Tournament

For 19 years Simmons Stations have been a co-sponsor of the local Cavalier County Memorial Hospital Foundation Charity Golf Tournament held at the Langdon Country Club.

3- Morden Block Party

4- NOAA Sky Warn Weather Spotter Class
