January 2015 News Items for Public File

1/7/15 - Langdon Cattle Theft

Police are asking for your help in solving the theft of 12 young black cattle from a farm near Langdon.

Cavalier County Sheriff's Department says it happened sometime Late Saturday or early Sunday when 2 to 3 people used a cattle trailer to steal the cows, possibly while driving a red pickup. The farm located 8 miles east and 4 miles North of Langdon. The theft is still under investigation.

1/15/15- Manitoba Crime Stoppers

RCMP were provided with a tip concerning a grow operation in a small rural town in southern Manitoba, the suspect was unknown to police and their activities had not been heard of previous to the information being received. A search warrant was prepared, 2 persons were arrested, 6 charges laid,\$20,000 dollars in cash along with \$600,000 in stolen property and 1,209 marihuana plants were seized.

1/20/15- Pembina County States Attorney

Three finalists are among the possible replacements for Pembina County State's Attorney Stephenie Davis, who resigned earlier this month to take a prosecutor job in western North Dakota. A committee will meet Feb. 4 to interview the finalists, according to Pembina County Human Resource Director Tanya Wieler. The finalists are: Ryan Bialas, who currently is working as a public defender in Dickinson, N.D.; Bryan Denham, a self-employed attorney in Skellytown, Texas; and Michael Mahoney, an attorney with the North Dakota attorney general's office in Bismarck. A fourth finalist, Jeanne McLean, Bismarck, has accepted another position and withdrew her name from consideration, according to Wieler. McLean is working with the North Dakota Supreme Court in Bismarck. Wieler said the committee expects to choose one candidate next week to recommend to the Pembina County Commission. Pembina County received 12 applications for the position. The pool then was narrowed to six, before the finalists were chosen, according to Wieler. Davis, a 2012 UND School of Law graduate, was elected to a four-year term in 2012. She resigned to move to Watford City, N.D., where she is an assistant state's attorney in McKenzie County. The interview committee consists of; Wieler; Pembina County Commission Chairwoman Hetty Walker; County Commissioner Gary Nilsson; Sheriff Terry Meidinger; Clerk of Court/Recorder Kay Newell Braget; and Social Service Director Jill Denault. Ramsey County State's Attorney Lonnie Olson also is assisting with the interviewing process, but will not have voting authority.

2/2/15 - Infant Homicide

Waywayseecappo, Manitoba February 2, 2015 - On January 31, 2015, the RCMP Serious Crimes Unit was called to assist Dakota Ojibway Police Service in an investigation into the death of a two-year-old boy from Waywayseecappo First Nation. This is an ongoing investigation, so no further details are available at this time. The name of the deceased will not be released. Waywayseecappo is located about 150 kilometres northwest of Brandon

2/10/15 Cavalier County Commissioner Charged

A Cavalier County commissioner is facing a driving under the influence charge while being accompanied by a minor.

Nick Moser, 34, Langdon, N.D., has entered a not guilty plea to the charge, a Class A misdemeanor. An initial appearance in Cavalier County District Court originally set for Tuesday was postponed after District Court Judge Laurie Fontaine recused herself from the case on Friday. The court appearance will be rescheduled once a new judge is appointed, according to Clerk of Court Anita Beauchamp. According to a charging document, Moser was pulled over by the North Dakota Highway Patrol at approximately 1:54 a.m. Jan. 31 along N.D. Highway 5 in the city of Langdon. He was accompanied by a four-year-old boy at the time, according to the report. When reached by telephone Monday, Moser declined comment on the advice of his attorney. He is being represented by former Grand Forks County State's Attorney Peter Welte, who resigned from that position last month to work with the Vogel Law Firm in Grand Forks. A Class A misdemeanor carries a possible maximum penalty of a \$3,000, one year in jail, or both.

2/19/15 Cramer to host Coffee in Cavalier

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Congressman Kevin Cramer will hold a Coffee with Cramer event in Cavalier on Thursday, February 19. Along with taking questions on any issue from attendees, Cramer will discuss legislative activity in Washington and its implications for North Dakota. This event is intended for the public and all are encouraged to attend.

"These events allow me to stay in touch with North Dakotans, meeting them face to face to discuss any topic on their mind," said Cramer.

3/4/15- Grafton Fire

At least one family remains displaced after a fire Monday evening that damaged rental units at Winter Park Apartments in Grafton, N.D. An official cause of the fire has not been determined. The fire is believed to have started in a second-floor apartment, according to Grafton Police Chief Anthony Dumas. "It appears, from what we gathered, as an unattended candle," he said, "but it's not definitive yet." While all 12 three-bedroom units initially were evacuated, four families were allowed to return later in the evening. Six others returned Tuesday morning, according to Walsh County Emergency Manager Brent Nelson. The American Red Cross found rooms for the evacuated residents at the AmericInn in Grafton, according to Nelson. The second-floor apartment where the fire is believed to have started sustained heavy damage, according to Dumas. It was occupied by a woman and two children. A first-floor unit, rented to a single woman, received water and smoke damage, according to Nelson. She had been displaced for a couple of days, but may be back in the apartment, he said. The damaged apartments are located in the southwest corner of the building, which is one of two in the complex located in south Grafton, just west of U.S. Highway 81 and south of N.D. Highway 17.

3/17/15 Devils Lake Prisoner Escape

Devils Lake, ND (WDAY/WDAZ TV) - Deputy US Marshal Dan Orr says authorities are following leads, but they still don't know where escaped prisoner Wesley E. Brown is. He's warning the public not to go near him if they see him. Deputy US Marshal Dan Orr, "We would encourage the public not to approach him or apprehend him, but rather just contact law enforcement. We have no information to indicate that he has a weapon at this time, but given the previous history of possessing a weapon as a convicted felon, we certainly have to take that into account. "Once Brown is brought back into custody, the US Marshals say it will investigate how he was able to escape from the Lake Region Law Enforcement Center.

3/22 /15 RCMP Drug Bust

On March 20, 2015, at approximately 8:00 am, RCMP Federal, Serious and Organized Crime (FSOC) officers executed four Controlled Drug and Substances Act warrants. Two of those warrants were executed in Winnipeg, one was executed in the RM of East St. Paul and one was executed in the RM of St. Clements. The Ontario Provincial Police assisted the RCMP and executed a warrant in Sioux Lookout, Ontario.During the course of this ongoing investigation, police have seized more than 30 pounds of marihuana, almost 250 Oxycodone tablets, a small amount of cocaine and two firearms. Police also recovered a stolen skid steer loader.Three people were arrested and charged:Darren
