January 21, 2024 - Jessica Tull speaks to Angelle French, Executive Director of the Pembina county JDA. We will discuss topics such as rural housing and benefits to living in the area.

January 28, 2024 – We speak to Mr. Ben Winchester, rural sociologist with the University of Minnesota extension, who discusses changing the rural narrative, and what communities need to focus on to keep on thriving.

February 4, 2024 – Walhalla Executive Director Rebecca Davis and Walhalla Chamber Board Member Desiree Kente discuss future plans for the city and upcoming meetings people may want to attend.

February 11, 2024 - We speak with Border Patrol Agent David Marcus of the Grand Forks Border Patrol Sector in regards to recent sightings of illegal border crossers in Pembina County.

February 18, 2024 - We check in with Cavalier student Eva Robinson and dog-musher who will be participating in this year's Jr. Iditarod race.
