• Crosstalk, "Beware of Social Emotional Learning (SEL)"

Summary: In previous programs we have warned about Social-Emotional Learning that is invading many public schools across the nation. But did you know SEL is also invading Christian schools? Appearing with Jim to tell us more, Crosstalk welcomed Julie Quist. Julie is Board Chair of Child Protection League which is committed to promoting the welfare of children and protecting them from exploitation, indoctrination and violence. Julie defined SEL as, "...a radical education program that indoctrinates children with the basic principles of cultural Marxism." She warned that this is not the way it presents itself to the public, but this is what it is. For Julie, SEL is vary vague as it talks about children controlling their emotions. It also communicates that it gives them life skills because those words are very appealing to parents and the public. Since SEL is based on emotion and not at all about academics, cognitive learning has no part in it. This has replaced academics as the core curriculum. Isn't school and education supposed to be about academics? Yes, and that's why Julie calls SEL "fake education." As she pointed out, we send our children to school to learn basic knowledge which is the building block for being able to understand the world, be successful and provide leadership. In the end, SEL is all about indoctrinating children into a worldview that's based upon Critical Race Theory. In other words, it's based on equity and is, as they call it, a lever for social justice. Summary: Barbara Loe Fisher is president of the National Vaccine Information Center (NVIC), a non-profit charity she co-founded with parents of DPT vaccine injured children in 1982. As of July 21st, 2023, nearly 1.6 million adverse reactions to the COVID shots have been reported to the Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System (VAERS). That includes over 35,600 deaths, over 20,400 heart attacks, over 67,000 left permanently disabled and over 206,000 hospitalizations. While these numbers were increasing, NVIC was immediately censored in 2021 after holding their 5th International Public Conference of Vaccination online. They were vilified and characterized as terrorists and people who were trying to cause injury and death to those who would listen to what they say. The result is that they were taken off all four social media platforms. In addition, Democrats in the House of Representatives wrote a letter to PayPal in December of 2021 telling them to cut off the ability of NVIC to receive donations. PayPal did just that. What are we to make of this relationship between symptoms and censorship? • The Phyllis Schlafly Report, "Religion Is Part of America's Founding"

Did you know that the Declaration of Independence is America's great religious document? The Declaration of Independence is the official and unequivocal recognition by the American people of our belief and faith in God. It affirms God's existence as a "self-evident" truth that requires no further discussion or debate. The nation created by the great Declaration is God's country. The rights it defines are God-given. The Declaration of Independence contains five references to God - God as Creator of all men, God as supreme Lawmaker, God as Source of all rights, God as the world's supreme Judge, and God as our Patron and Protector. The Declaration of Independence declares that each of us was created. If we were created, we must have had a Creator. The Declaration of Independence declares that each of us is created equal. This means equal before God. It does not mean that all are born with equal capabilities, as obviously we are not. The modern discovery of DNA now confirms that each of God's creatures is unequal and different from every other person who ever lived or ever will live on this earth. The Declaration of Independence proclaims that life and liberty are the unalienable gifts of God — natural rights — which no person or government can rightfully take away. It affirms that the purpose of government is to secure our God-given unalienable individual rights, and that government derives its powers from the consent of the governed. For the first time in history, our Declaration reduced government from master to servant. Knowledge of our Declaration of Independence should be required of all schoolchildren. They should also be taught that many of the men who signed it paid for their courage with their lives and fortunes. It's our challenge to make sure that we maintain freedom and independence for our children.

Summary: In the U.S. we try to whitewash the practice of abortion with terms like "reproductive health" or "choice," but just because the methods and terminology have changed, the bottom line is that what's happening to the pre-born today is no different from that of pagan civilizations of the past. It's still barbarism. The reversal of Roe v. Wade by the Dobbs decision has drawn the lines clearer than ever in this battle between life and death. Though the highest office in our land continues to fight for and advance this culture of death, we must remember that it's God that hates the hands that shed innocent blood. To bring analysis on related issues that have been unfolding, Jim welcomed Pastor Jim Harden back to Crosstalk. He's president and CEO of CompassCare Pregnancy Services in New York. Pastor Harden pioneered the first measurable and repeatable medical model in the pregnancy center movement, helping hundreds of centers nationwide become more effective at reaching more women and saving more babies from abortion. He's written extensively on medical ethics, executive leadership, and pro-life strategy. According to Pastor Harden, the Democrats love to make that claim so that Republicans will run their campaigns based upon how the Democrats want them to be run. He explained how Republicans swallowed that bait during the 2020 mid-terms. He predicted the "red wave" would "die on the beach" as Republicans backed away from the abortion issue and scrubbed their websites of their pro-life stance. Why? It's because people want to talk about this issue and as a recent Gallup Poll showed, the majority of Americans want 98% of all abortions restricted. This means Republicans need to talk about the true, Democrat position on this issue. That's unfettered, unrestricted abortion through all 9 months of pregnancy. He also noted how it's still the responsibility of the federal government to protect all people equally and not disqualify one category of individuals from equal protection under the law. That's a slippery slope and at that point one must ask, who's next?
