The list below represents the current issues of community importance to which ideastream's news, public affairs and general programming staffs addressed their attention during the designated reporting period noted above. The list has been compiled by the ideastreamSM Content Department, under my direction and supervision.

The subjects are a consequence of current news as it developed in Northeast Ohio during the reporting period and the staff's newsgathering and outreach which included contact with officials in the region, community leaders, business leaders, healthcare representatives, other news media and a diverse mix of private citizens among others.

The Content staff regularly follow news of local issues or impact as presented by other news organizations, consult informally with colleagues in the media, and routinely read a wide variety of daily and weekly news publications from area communities, including *The Plain Dealer*, *The Beacon Journal*, and occasional additional neighborhood publications; minority news and special interest publications such as the *City News* and *The Call and Post*; area weekly and monthly news publications, including *Crain's Cleveland Business*, *Cleveland Magazine*, *Eco-City Cleveland*, *Free Times*, *Northern Ohio Live*; and online news sources such as www.CoolCleveland.com and blogs such as www.brewedfreshdaily.com, as well as national news and special interest publications such as *The New York Times*, and *The Wall Street Journal* in order to stay aware of issues and events inside and outside of our region and to gain various perspectives on what is newsworthy.

The staff also exchanges reports daily with INFOHIO station in Columbus, and accesses the daily *Ohio Public Radio Statehouse News Bureau* (Columbus) audio feeds. Local, state, regional, national and international news from *Associated Press* is also part of the daily diet of the Content staff, as are other regularly-produced independent productions.

The ideastreamsm Content staff also regularly reaches out to community civic groups and agencies for research and/or scholarly data to provide supplementary background material to assist in understanding local issues. The College of Urban Affairs at Cleveland State University, the Center for Regional Economic Issues at Case Western Reserve University, the Citizens League of Greater Cleveland, the League of Women Voters are examples of academic agencies or organizations whose written and programmatic materials have been particularly instrumental in helping us address community issues.

In addition, ideastream's ongoing utilization and broadcasting of cross-cultural and international-content materials is a valuable means to stay abreast of concerns and issues of immediate interest to the people of the many cultural heritages represented in the Greater Cleveland area.


The attached list represents the current issues of community importance to which ideastream's news and public affairs and general programming staffs have addressed their attention for the above-designated reporting period.

1. Gulf Coast and Ohio Pounded by Hurricane Ike

Hurricane Ike forced more than a million people from their homes along the Gulf Coast. The giant storm is estimated to be one of the most costly hurricanes in U.S. history. Because the storm was so large, many of us experienced its aftermath here in Ohio. We don't experience hurricanes in Ohio because they form over warm ocean waters, but on Sunday we got a taste of what it's like when winds clocked at nearly 78 miles per hour knocked down trees and power lines. Ike left behind terrible damage in Texas, and officials there are busy trying to restore power and make sure everyone has food and water.

2. Ohio Will Play Major Role in Upcoming Presidential Election

Ohio is called a Swing State, fairly evenly divided between Democrat and Republican voters. Either candidate could win the state this November. Voters in urban areas of northeast Ohio favor Barack Obama, and voters in central Ohio favor John McCain. Many people in rural areas, especially in southeast Ohio, are not sure yet who they will support. We can expect to see many visits from the candidates during the coming weeks.

3. General David Petraeus Gets a Promotion

The man in charge of U.S. troops in Iraq is getting a promotion. General David Petraeus will now oversee the wars in both Iraq and Afghanistan. The general is credited with improving the conditions in Iraq and pulling the country back from the edge of civil war.

4. Bengals, Browns and Buckeyes Blown Away During Windy Weekend

The Cincinnati Bengals had to battle the tail end of Hurricane Ike as well as the Tennessee Titans on Sunday afternoon. The Titans beat the Bengals twenty four to seven. Palmer has had three interceptions and no touchdowns in the first two games of the season. The Cleveland Browns didn't fare much better as their arch rivals, the Pittsburgh Steelers, blew into Cleveland Sunday night. Final score, Steelers 10, Browns 6, the home team's second loss. The Ohio State Buckeyes had a big loss to the University of Southern California last Saturday night.

5. Three Cleveland Zoo Elephants Make a Big Move to Columbus

Over the past few decades Thai farmers gradually moved away from using animals choosing to use tractors instead. Tractors provided a faster, more efficient means of farming, but the high price of oil has led many farmers to take a deliberate step backwards. Machines are much more expensive to run meaning that buffalo are back in demand.

An Arizona man has his dialing dog to thank for saving his life. When Joe Stalnaker had a seizure last week... his German Shepherd dog Buddy went into action and dialed 9-1-1.

Many students in Appleton, Wisconsin returned to class this year to learn that one of their schools has earned national honors and not for academics. It's being recognized by one magazine for trying to promote student health. The students have learned to love healthy food.

The trouble began a few years ago, when many Americans started borrowing money to buy new homes, even though many of them couldn't afford it. Now they can't make their

C payments. That's why you might see some abandoned houses in your city. Big banks, like the ones in New York City, lent them money, and charged them some pretty hefty fees. Now the people can't back pay the banks, and the banks can't pay back the money they borrowed. A few giant banks have already had to close, so the federal government is stepping in to help. It's a difficult time, and many people are learning hard lessons about spending money they don't have.

2. General Motors Unveils its New Battery-Powered Car, the Chevy Volt

An important part of the U.S. economy, especially in Ohio, is the automotive industry. Like our neighboring state, Michigan, many of our jobs are tied to making cars. But as gasoline prices rise and more people are concerned about polluting the environment, engineers are trying to find new ways to power our cars. In Detroit, General Motors is trying something new. They are coming out with a battery-powered car called the Chevy Volt, due to hit the road about two years from now.

3. Sunlight Transforms Water from Dirty to Clean

For most of us in America, getting water is as simple as turning on a tap. But, for millions in developing countries, water can be as dangerous as it is life saving. So, what do you do when there is just no clean water available? David McKenzie found out in the giant slum of Kibera in Kenya that all you need is a bit of sunlight and some clear plastic bottles for a process called SODIS – Solar Water Disinfection.

4. Miami Valley WWII Veterans Take Honor Flight to Washington, DC

C Dayton area World War Two veterans received a big welcome in Washington, DC when they made the trek to the World War Two Memorial, as guests of "Honor Flight." That's a non-profit organization that sponsors trips to the memorial for veterans who cannot get there on their own because of physical or financial limitations. These vets didn't have to pay a penny for the trip, which included visits to the Korean War and Iwo Jima memorials.

5. Speedy Weiner Dogs Kick Off Cincinnati Oktoberfest

C The annual "running of the weiners" race has a new top dog: a four-year-old dachshund named Charlie. Charlie - who was adopted from a dachshund rescue group - beat out more than sixty other speedy weiner dogs to win. The race kicked off last weekend's Oktoberfest-Zinzinnati, a celebration of German culture and food in downtown Cincinnati.

6. NASA Study in Cleveland Will Help Astronauts Maintain Bone Density in Space

Would you like a job where you get paid to lay in bed? It might be fun for awhile, but for twelve weeks? Doctor Sanjay Gupta tells us about a man who did exactly that....at the Cleveland Clinic. It was all in the name of science, during a NASA experiment that could teach us how to keep our astronauts stronger when they're in space.

7. Texas Family Escapes from Hurricane Ike, Rescues Baby Squirrel on the Way

C A tiny survivor of Hurricane Ike has made its way to Oklahoma. A Houston family is riding out Ike's aftermath in Tulsa, and they brought a unique pet with them – a baby

squirrel they named Izzy that was orphaned in the storm. The Vlaha family turned Izzy over to Stephanie Yuill, Tulsa's so-called "Squirrel Lady," who will release the little squirrel when she's old enough to take care of herself.

8. Minnesota Corn Field Turned into Corn Maze with Election Theme

A Minnesota corn field has gone political. The Sever's Farm in Minnesota has carved a bi-partisan design into its cornfield maze this year. Last Saturday, the gates opened on the 12th edition of 'Sever's Corn Maze'. Visitors will navigate the meandering trail through the stalks, not knowing what it took to create this tribute to the democratic process.

9. Oldest Man in America Celebrates His 112th Birthday in Montana

Not too many of us know someone like Walter Bruening of Montana. He turned 112 years old this week! Bruening has some advice for the rest of us, who still have a long way to go before we reach his age. He says the key is staying active – keep your mind busy and your body busy at all times, he recommends.

Homeless, he wanders to the nearby city, like thousands of other children, in constant fear of being re-kidnapped by the rebels. At a young age, Francis witnessed the execution of two boys, killed by machete for not following orders. Terrified of a similar fate, he fled and now hopes to be reunited with his mother. As these children piece their lives together, the LRA continues to carry out attacks in the region. Though the ICC issued an arrest warrant for Kony in 2005, he remains at large, hiding in the jungle of neighboring Congo.

Though the ICC issued an arrest warrant for Kony in 2005, he remains at large, hiding in the jungle of neighboring Congo.
