

The story of American artist Earl Cunningham comes to life in the WMFE's production, EARL CUNNINGHAM: THE DRAGON OF ST. GEORGE STREET. Known as a primitive artist, Cunningham was essentially a self-taught painter who utilized a unique visionary technique to record his adventures as a wanderer and mariner. Earl Cunningham's work realizes a different realm of American art. His art has been associated with the works of American folk artists such as Grandma Moses, Morris Hirschfield and Lawrence Lebduska. Born in 1893 in Edgecomb, Maine, Cunningham spent his early years working as a tinker and became an accomplished mariner sailing the East Coast on giant coastal ships. It was during one of these voyages, around 1913, that Earl first visited Florida. He owned several boats in his lifetime and during World War I worked as a seaman. In 1915, Earl married a piano teacher named Iva Moses whom he called Maggie and began an almost nomadic lifestyle for several years. The couple bought a 35-foot cabin cruiser and cruised up and down the East Coast between Florida and Maine. Around 1936 the couple were divorced, and in 1949 he moved to St. George Street in St. Augustine and opened up the Over Fork Gallery. His landlady, Theresia Paffe, became his patron, close friend and personal and professional mainstay. He became known as 'the Dragon of St. George Street', a cranky, eccentric shopkeeper who was likely to run prospective customers out of his shop and was reluctant to sell his paintings. Earl Cunningham continued to paint as he moved into old age despite personal and emotional upheaval. Cunningham took his own life in 1977 at the age of 84.

The story of American artist Earl Cunningham comes to life in the WMFE's production, EARL CUNNINGHAM: THE DRAGON OF ST. GEORGE STREET. Known as a primitive artist, Cunningham was essentially a self-taught painter who utilized a unique visionary technique to record his adventures as a wanderer and mariner. Earl Cunningham's work realizes a different realm of American art. His art has been associated with the works of American folk artists such as Grandma Moses, Morris Hirschfield and Lawrence Lebduska. Born in 1893 in Edgecomb, Maine, Cunningham spent his early years working as a tinker and became an accomplished mariner sailing the East Coast on giant coastal ships. It was during one of these voyages, around 1913, that Earl first visited Florida. He owned several boats in his lifetime and during World War I worked as a seaman. In 1915, Earl married a piano teacher named Iva Moses whom he called Maggie and began an almost nomadic lifestyle for several years. The couple bought a 35-foot cabin cruiser and cruised up and down the East Coast between Florida and Maine. Around 1936 the couple were divorced, and in 1949 he moved to St. George Street in St. Augustine and opened up the Over Fork Gallery. His landlady, Theresia Paffe, became his patron, close friend and personal and professional mainstay. He became known as 'the Dragon of St.

George Street', a cranky, eccentric shopkeeper who was likely to run prospective customers out of his shop and was reluctant to sell his paintings. Earl Cunningham continued to paint as he moved into old age despite personal and emotional upheaval. Cunningham took his own life in 1977 at the age of 84.

The News Department staff, and I to a lesser degree, regularly follow news coverage of local issues as presented by other news organizations, consult informally with colleagues in the media, and routinely read a wide variety of news publications, including: daily and weekly newspapers from area communities, including The Plain Dealer, the Sun newspapers, The Beacon Journal, and occasional additional neighborhood publications; minority news and special interest publications such as the City News; area weekly and monthly news publications, including Crain's Cleveland Business, Cleveland Magazine, Eco-City Cleveland, Free Times, Northern Ohio Live, and the Crusader; and national news and special interest publications such as Time, Newsweek, The New York Times, Reader's Digest, The Wall Street Journal, American Journalism Review and Common Ground in order to relate issues of importance to national trends and perspectives.

The staff also exchanges reports daily with INFOHIO station in Columbus, and accesses the daily Ohio Public Radio Statehouse News Bureau (Columbus) audio feeds. Local, state, regional, national and international news from Associated Press is also scrutinized daily, as are other regularly-produced independent productions.
