4/7/19: FCA Motocross – Guest: Ed Stratton. Discussed what FCA is about. Faith + Sport = FCA, uniting two passions, faith and athletics, to impact the world for Jesus Christ. FCA Motocross is a place for you to improve your race skills, meet new friends and hear God's challenge for your life. It's a week-long, overnight camp which provides life lessons off the track and 20 hours of top level instruction on the track.
