**Topics:** 

1/6/19: GiGi's Playhouse (Down Syndrome Achievement Center) – Guest: Heather Rodriguez, Chairman Board of Directors. Discussed GiGi's Playhouse has 40 playhouses throughout the country. It was created to change the way the world views a Down's syndrome diagnosis and sends a global message of acceptance for all. Talked about upcoming events: "World Down Syndrome Awareness Day," "I Have a Vision Gala" and "Dance-a-thon." 1/13/19: St. Joseph's Family Health – Guest: Dr. Luis Castro. Discussed upcoming flu season and who should and shouldn't get a flu shot. How to lessen chances of contracting the flu.

Raw Breed and Subcat Studios developed this campaign, with a purpose to collect gently worn or new shoes for the kids that are less fortunate in the community.
