Program Description: Community Connections keeps viewers informed of current and future scheduled events happening within the viewing area and also includes weather, traffic, and community and cultural events as well as information on upcoming courses for self improvement and education.

Topics:

1/1/17: Chadwick Residence (Pt. 2) – Guest: Jenni Gratien, Exec. Director – discussed Chadwick's mission and experience to aid women focusing on sustainable, independent living. Services cover a wide array of life skills, including personal finance, effective parenting and successful employment.

1/8/17: On Point for College – Guest: Sam Rouser – discussed breaking down barriers through access to training, college, and careers for success in life; tom open the door to higher education for inner city youth; and to provide support that empowers them to succeed.
