Kyle McLane, missionary to Ukraine informed listeners that families make the decision to be separated. Men 18-60 are not allowed to leave. Lines 20-30km into Poland. There are invalids who need help. The Polish pastors and churches are helping refugees. www.sendrelief.org is a way for listeners to aid. Hardship stretches our faith, draws people to Christ and opportunities to share the good news of salvation.

Sam Huges, missionary in Ukraine at the Bible College and Seminary, training the next generation. The Hughes family is in Hungary and will soon be in Romania. They are coordinating border crossing of teachers, doing translation between refugees and Romanians. Ways to help: pray, \$ and encourage the helpers. Sam said Psalm 46 has been his comfort.
