Title Changing the World Through a Lemonade Stand
Length 25 minutes
Description Helping your fellow man doesn't have to be complicated or elaborate. Chris Marlow describes how we can intentionally help others by starting small and using our gifts and passions. He reflects on compassion fatigue and ways to combat it, pointing us to follow Jesus's example of withdrawing for time with God when we need refuel.

Title Saving Your Marriage from Divorce
Length 26 minutes
Description There is hope for bad marriages. In this two day Focus on the Family broadcast Jim Daly & John Fuller talk with Dr. David Clarke over his book, I Don't Want a Divorce. He shares that if you are struggling in your marriage that you are not alone and there is hope. He discusses the three main bad marriage types: the "We're unhappy but willing to work on it marriage," the "My marriage is stuck but my spouse won't work on it marriage" and the "My spouse committed a big sin marriage." He shares how couples got to where they were in the first place, the importance of getting your relationship right with God, communication, and taking ownership for your own sin. In marriages where the spouse is unwilling to work on the relationship Dr. Clarke draws from the model found in Matthew `18 on how to approach sin. A final word of hope is given that with God all things are possible.
