Conservation and Environmental issues	04/02/15	09:06 AM	18 Min	Danna Watkins Run For Clean Water. The Run For Clean Water in Camdenton is raising money for clean water projects working with Corps of Engineers and other groups.
	04/09/15	09:06 AM	18 Min	Tons of waste is placed in landfills and household hazardous waste is dumped on the ground, contaminating water supplies and the air. The annual recycling event is a concerted community effort for a centralized and free drop off for citizens in a 3 county area to dispose of items, including tires, paint and other hazardous waste, electronics, non hazardous recyclables are dropped at this event as well.

Pollock also spoke on the benefits of the show me green sales tax holiday and how it draws people to shop in Lebanon and Laclede County, therefore boosting revenue from the purchase of other items.

A tax which was passed on April 7th will provide funding to payback emergency funds being borrowed from the Laclede County General Revenue reserve fund. Merritt said the new system will include enhanced 911 and location services for cell phones.

Discussion on where gas lines are, what happens and what to do if lines are struck during excavation. What consumers should do if they smell gas.
	05/23/15	09:06 AM	18 Min	Laclede County Sheriff Wayne Merritt. Sheriff Merritt with an update on law enforcement / 911 tax that will go into effect October, 2015. The tax was passed to continue funding for enhanced 911 services in the county and to upgrade failing equipment. Merritt reported that the new system is estimated to cost \$300-\$500 thousand and include call mapping for cellphones. Merritt also talked about the dangers of 911 prank calls and letting juveniles playing with old cellphones.

Laclede County Red Cross raises fund to support those efforts, by holding a Breakfast which recognizes heroes from within the community.
