Date: April 1, 2018

Issue: Pink Hands of Hope. Brian and his wife, Laurie, started Pink Hands of Hope after her battle with Stage 1 breast cancer. As she was going through the process, they discovered a lack of items covered by health insurance and didn't want others to face the same problems. The organization is a non-profit with a thrift store set up to help with the costs. The proceeds from the store go directly to women fighting breast cancer. This includes providing wigs, prosthesis, bras, chemo caps and shawls. The organization also holds a fashion show each year with breast cancer survivors as the models.

Issue: PCADV. PA Coalition Against Domestic Violence - PCADV's 60 community-based programs and statewide office are joined in a coalition acting hand-in-hand on behalf of domestic violence victims and their children. The goal is to break the generational cycle of violence for children, teens and young adults by changing public attitudes and social norms to create a future in which lives are neither lost to nor limited by domestic violence.

Issue: Paxton Ministries. Paxton Ministries provides affordable housing and support services for adults who may be challenged with poverty, mental illness, or intellectual disability. The staff provides a personal care home, apartment-style living facility and lodge program. The monthly occupancy fee is based on a sliding-scale structure or percentage of income basis. Staff members assist residents in managing their daily needs, such as medication administration, healthy meals, laundry and finances.
