Governor Backing California Homeless Housing Plan Out Of San Diego --- 5/9/2024

Governor Gavin Newsom is supporting a bill from San Diego Assemblymember Chris Ward that would focus housing plans in California on the homeless. Assembly Bill 3093 would change the goals from providing housing for those making less than 50-percent of the area median income to three new categories: very low, extremely low and acutely low incomes, making up to 50, 30 and 15-percent of the AMI. The Governor says it will better force cities to plan for the housing that can help the homeless. The bill would also require each area to submit data on the homeless population to include them in the regional housing needs allocation from the state.

Space X is targeting an 8:20 p.m. launch with backup opportunities available through 10:18 p.m. The launch will send 20 <u>Starlink</u> satellites, including 13 with <u>Direct to Cell</u> capabilities, to low-Earth orbit from Space Launch Complex 4 East (SLC-4E) This is the fourth flight for the first stage booster supporting this mission. Following stage separation, the first stage will land on the Of Course I Still Love You droneship, which will be stationed in the Pacific Ocean.

>>CA Regulators Voting Today On \$24 Fixed Monthly Charge

(Sacramento, CA) -- A vote is coming today that impacts millions of Californians. State regulators will decide whether to change electricity bills, saving some people money but possibly leaving others paying more. This affects the three major investor-owned utilities: PG&E, SoCal Edison, and San Diego Gas and Electric. The proposed plan has two parts. One would lower the usage rate by five-to-seven cents per kilowatt hour, dropping ten-percent during peak hours. The other calls for a flat rate of 24-dollars, giving a discount to lower income customers.

A 21-mile stretch of Pacific Coast Highway near Malibu will see infrastructure upgrades and more traffic enforcement. Governor Newsom says the action will save lives, given 59 people have died along the dangerous corridor since 2010. A campaign is also being launched called "Go Safely PCH." It reminds drivers to slow down or face the consequences. The messages will be shared on billboards, lawn and beach signs, flyers, posters and on social media.

>>CA College Won't Invest In Companies That Profit From Genocide

(Sacramento, CA) -- A California university is the first in the state to meet protester demands. Students have been camping out at dozens of campuses over the Middle East war in Gaza. Most are calling for schools to divest from Israel. Sacramento State has now revised its policy, saying it won't invest in companies that "profit from genocide, ethnic cleansing, and activities that violate fundamental human rights." UC Riverside made a pact with protesters that it's business school will end global programs in Israel. UC Berkeley is also negotiating with students.
