CBN National Security Correspondent Caitlin Burke Reports: Two recent cyber-attacks highlight a new way hackers have found to successfully target businesses and governments alike. The strategy, which is growing in popularity involves bad actors targeting third-party vendors who provide a service used by a network of companies or government agencies. Once the hackers find a way in, they have access to those providers' entire customer base. It's called a cyber supply chain attack, and according to security experts, these types of attacks mean you're only as strong as your weakest link. The two most recent attacks on the cyber supply chain were carried out by two different U.S. adversaries. In the first, Chinese hackers targeted an email security provider, and in the other, Russian hackers infiltrated a file transfer program used by the federal government. The SolarWinds cyber-attack back in 2020 remains the highest-profile example of this kind of strategy. Hackers placed malware on signed versions of software from the IT management system's supplier and then used it to gain access to 18,000 government and private organizations. Scott White, director of George Washington University's Cyber Security Program, says this supply chain hack is being used by both criminals and Advanced Persistent Threats (APT's) like China, Russia, and North Korea. He says protection against this line of attack is especially difficult because hackers could gain access at any point across very interconnected systems. That's especially true for global supply chains, with many countries not requiring the same security standards as the U.S. Research shows why securing these critical supply chains is so important. According to Gartner Inc, 45 percent of global organizations can expect a software supply chain attack by 2025. White says the federal government already offers resources to help U.S. organizations examine their various member networks and come up with a risk management process. While these specific attacks don't always make headlines, they must be taken seriously. In 2022 alone, more than 10 million people, and some 17,000 organizations fell victim to a cyber supply chain breach. That number is expected to rise in the future.

CBN Medical Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: Young people as young as middle school need to know just one pill from a friend or a drug dealer can secretly contain a deadly amount of fentanyl. That's the warning being issued by experts on drug abuse and a father who lost his son to an accidental fentanyl overdose. David Magee, author of "Things Have Changed: What Every Parent (and Educator), Should Know About the Student Mental Health and Substance Misuse Crisis" told CBN News his son William seemed on top of the world. He was a track star and honors student at Ole Miss. Then the unthinkable happened. Beginning in high school and through college, however, William treated his anxiety with prescription medication he bought on the street. After rehab, it appeared William kicked his habit, but after an apparent relapse, his father found William dead from an accidental overdose. Davis learned his son bought and took a pill that he didn't know contained a deadly amount of fentanyl. The grieving father recommends parents talk to their children about their emotions as early as possible. Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid that's up to 100 times more potent than morphine. In fact, it's so powerful only a speck, just two milligrams, can kill. That's the size of a few grains of salt. Drug dealers often add a little fentanyl to the prescription pills they manufacture in illegal labs, where they make counterfeit versions of medications like Xanax, Adderall, Percocet, Oxycontin, and more. They add fentanyl to make the drugs more addictive and keep their customers coming back for more. However, sometimes these pills contain deadly amounts of fentanyl. That's why people of all ages who take pills purchased on the street are overdosing from fentanyl without ever intending to take the drug, even children as young as middle school. The National Institute on Drug Abuse has monitored illicit drug use among middle school children for more than 40 years. Current director Dr. Nora Volkow told CBN News today's numbers represent a good news-bad news scenario. On one hand, she says the number of middle school children who are using illicit drugs is lower than in previous years. However, those who are taking them face a much greater risk of death than in the past. Technology has a major impact in making today's drug trade more prevalent. Kelly Newcom, founder of Brave Parenting told CBN News that parents need to become educated about teen drug use. For example, parents need to be aware that kids who buy so-called "street drugs," such as counterfeit prescription pills, no longer have to meet a dealer in some random alley or on an actual street as they did in years past. Today, all they have to do is make a deal on their smartphone, in some cases right under their parent's noses. The pills are then usually dropped off, even on the front doorstep, disguised for instance, as a food delivery. Psychologists say starting in middle school, teenagers can experience tremendous emotional upheaval. For this reason, many young people reach for pills to feel something different. Licensed psychologist Carolyn Rubenstein, PhD recommends parents try to make their children feel comfortable talking about their emotional challenges, adding it's helpful when parents explain to their children if they ever want to take prescription medication it must be prescribed by their doctor and purchased at a pharmacy. Newcom said parents should try to eliminate distractions when they attempt to discuss drug use with their children.

CBN Reporter Jenna Browder Reports: They call themselves "Joyful Warriors" and since 2021, Moms for Liberty has enlisted more than 100,000 members from across the country with the goal of standing up for parents' rights at each level of government. In that time, the organization has become a voice in the 2024 presidential election and has also taken arrows from the Southern Poverty Law Center. The issue of parents' rights is now a top-tier political issue in the United States, with many parents seeing their rights under attack, from being denied any say in the classroom, to transgender issues, to mandating masks and vaccines during the pandemic. Tina Descovich's devotion to her family led her to become a long-term advocate. In addition to serving as PTO president of her kids' elementary school, Descovich says she joined nearly every committee available. That thinking laid the groundwork for Moms for Liberty. Descovich eventually met Tiffany Justice, another concerned mom and former school board member in a neighboring county, through their shared congressman. What started in Florida has now grown to nearly 300 chapters nationwide and 120,000 members in 45 states, with victory after victory for the organization. Last year, Moms for Liberty endorsed candidates in 500 school board races across the country - 275 of those candidates won. With all of the attention has also come heightened scrutiny. And Moms for Liberty does have a target on its back. At its annual summit in Philadelphia this year, angry protestors terrorized participants and tried to shut down the event altogether. Despite being targeted, they call themselves "Joyful Warriors." Speaking of the future, Moms for Liberty has gained the respect of many of the leading 2024 GOP presidential hopefuls, from Donald Trump and Ron DeSantis to Nikki Haley, who all spoke at the Philadelphia summit. Looking back, Descovich says it's nothing short of a miracle Moms for Liberty has seen this level of success. As for what's next for Moms for Liberty, Descovich says it's a matter of expanding their fight for parents' rights. Right now, they're in 300 counties nationwide, on their way to reach all 3,000.

CBN Reporter Mark Martin Reports: Foreign ownership of American land is a hot-button issue these days, especially when it comes to China. The U.S. city that put this concern on the map is Grand Forks, North Dakota. CBN News traveled there to take a closer look at the pushback against what could be seen as a national security risk. Cheers and shouts of "USA" erupted at a city council meeting earlier this year after Grand Forks council members voted to stop a \$700 million Chinese-owned agricultural project. Grand Forks Mayor, Brandon Bochenski, said that economically, the Fufeng USA proposed development "would have been phenomenal." That economic glow faded sharply, however, after the U.S. Air Force weighed in. Fufeng USA is a subsidiary of "Fufeng Group Limited" based in China. The land at the heart of the controversy is around 370 acres in Grand Forks' agribusiness park. The Fufeng Group wanted to build a wet corn mill there. The property is about 12 miles from the Grand Forks Air Force Base. The Grand Forks Air Force Base is home to military activities involving both air and space operations. Critics have raised concerns of espionage over allegations the Fufeng Group has direct ties to the Chinese Communist Party. U.S. Senator Kevin Cramer of North Dakota did not mince words during an interview on Newsmax. While Fufeng officials deny the plant would be used for espionage, State Rep. Eric James Murphy (R-Grand Forks, North Dakota) had suspicions about the land purchase and supports the Air Force's assessment. State legislatures have considered measures to address foreign ownership of U.S. land, especially after the high-profile Chinese spy balloon flew over the country earlier this year. In April, North Dakota took action, passing a law banning adversary nations from owning land in the state. According to the Agriculture Department, Canada topped the list in 2021, owning 31 percent of all foreign-owned farming acreage. As for China, not including the recent Fufeng Group purchase, the country owns nearly 384,000 acres, which amounts to about .9 percent of the total. Still, lawmakers don't want that figure to grow. In a new bipartisan bill, U.S. Senators Joni Ernst and Debbie Stabenow are pushing back against Chinese acquisition of U.S. farmland. Also on the federal level, a proposed rule change would require foreign citizens and companies to get U.S. government approval to purchase property within 100 miles of eight military bases, including the Grand Forks Air Force Base. People in Grand Forks are happy about this strong pushback.

CBN Reporter Mark Martin Reports: U.S. Air Force leaders point to small drones as one of the top threats now faced in combat. The military site tasked with taking this challenge head-on is the Grand Forks Air Force Base in North Dakota. CBN News traveled there to get an up-close look. Russia's war on Ukraine is bringing drone warfare front and center, showcasing how these unmanned aerial vehicles are used for surveillance and combat. For example, footage reported released by Ukrainian special forces appears to show a drone destroying a Russian armored vehicle and tank. Then there's actually drone-on-drone combat. Another video depicts a drone dogfight, reportedly involving equipment used for surveillance by Ukrainian and Russian armed forces. And it's not just in the air. Other footage shows what appears to be a Ukrainian sea drone attacking a Russian tanker ship in the Black Sea. At North Dakota's Grand Forks Air Force Base, they're not taking the use of drones lightly. The 319th Reconnaissance Wing small UAS program is the first in Air Combat Command to utilize such a program with operators from multiple units. One drone that airmen train on is the quadcopter-style Skydio X2D. The security forces unit employs it to defend the base through perimeter scans or identifying threats from the sky. That function can also transfer to overseas bases. Capt. Matthew Crowell, vice chairman for sUAS Operations, says they also use it for aircraft recovery training, and if required, could fly it to survey a crash site. Members of the Aircraft Maintenance Unit gave CBN News a demo of the Skydio X2D. AMU flight chief Master Sqt. Matthew Roberts says using a system like this to survey and assess damages saves time, money and resources. There are actually two active duty military missions involving unmanned aerial systems operating at Grand Forks Air Force Base. In addition to the Skydio, another unit operates what's called the RQ-4 or Global Hawk. It's the world's largest drone. The 348th Reconnaissance Squadron files the Global Hawk at Grand Forks Air Force Base. The long-endurance aircraft can reach extremely high altitudes of 50-to 60,000 feet. Captain Mark Cochrane remotely pilots the large-scale system that provides global day or night intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance. Brad Bowman, of the Foundation for Defense of Democracies, calls these drone systems "fundamentally, important" to the U.S. military. And airmen at the Grand Forks Air Force Base are fully aware, describing this tech as a game changer in a time of war and another way Americans can feel safe.

CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: Reaching potential mass shooters before they pull the trigger has become the goal of a new initiative working to share a message of hope and deterrence. It's called "Let's Talk to Them." The organization started in 2020 following the back-to-back tragedies in Uvalde, Texas, and Buffalo, New York. In those cases, both shooters bought their weapons after turning 18 and used social media as their sounding board. The number of mass killings so far in 2023 number more than any other year at this point since 2006. As America struggles with this epidemic of violence as well as surging mental health crisis, young people are often caught in the middle. It's a morbid connection that suicide and homicide are the second and third leading causes of death for those between the ages of 10 to 24. Given the staggering growth of these violent deaths, national leaders and experts often find themselves dealing with the aftermath rather than planning on prevention. One of the more frightening statistics is the number of deadly mass shootings carried out by someone 21 or younger. That's become a focus for the Let's Talk to Them initiative. Jordan Estrada, acting director of the organization, is certainly familiar with the issue as a first responder. He's spent the last 15 years helping organizations put together active shooter response plans. Using that background and experience, he wants to focus on prevention by connecting potential killers with those willing and able to help. Estrada believes people are looking for a mental health solution without necessarily knowing what that solution is. Ken Churchill, founder of TalentED Ventures is helping finance the initiative. Churchill believes in innovating pathways for societal health. In this case, he points out how big tech's search engine optimization (SEO) on the topic of self-harm can provide help for anyone browsing the internet with self-destructive thoughts or questions - but nothing exists for people looking to commit mass violence. Compare that to search results on a statement like, "I want to commit mass murder" – where there's not one link to help. Instead, you can find step-by-step instructions on how to carry out a mass shooting in Google's top three results. The team is better understanding the mindset of potential mass murders by working closely with someone who strongly considered shooting up a public venue, a man by the name of Aaron Stark. Stark is a mental health advocate, sharing his story of how he strongly considered mass murder until help from a friend stopped his plans. Today, Stark helps Estrada and Churchill try to better understand that mindset. The team is searching for and curating content, media, blogs, and videos that might speak to anyone contemplating mass violence. The introduction page on the Let's Talk to Them website shares their vision to help. However, an undisclosed dark web page is now fully operational, connecting potential mass shooters with redirection content and chat features. The organization says this isn't about surveillance or espionage. Instead, the goal is to be a light shining into the dark corners of the web. Each situation varies, however, so police could potentially get involved. Estrada says the reason for his decision to help is because God's love is for everyone, even some capable of committing mass violence.

CBN Medical Reporter Lorie Johnson Reports: The U.S. Surgeon General says loneliness is now a public health threat so severe that it's on par with smoking and obesity. For far too many Americans, loneliness can become a painful secret, U.S. Surgeon General Vivek Murthy, M.D. said, revealing that he experienced this firsthand. Like many others, Dr. Murthy experienced loneliness as a child, and again as an adult. Last month, Dr. Murthy released a new Surgeon General Advisory calling attention to the public health crisis of loneliness, isolation, and lack of connection in our country. He said loneliness increases the risk of physical ailments like heart disease, dementia, and stroke plus mental ones, including depression, anxiety, and suicide. He adds the possibility of premature death due to loneliness could equal that of smoking 15 cigarettes a day, and can pose a greater health risk than living with obesity. Murthy said about half of adults are struggling with loneliness and even greater numbers of children are. That can be surprising given the fact that many young people are frequently connecting with their peers online. However, Murthy said technology serves as a poor substitute for in-person connection. Mental health experts, like psychiatrist Daniel Amen believe social media can prove to be addicting, and therefore predict the problem will only get worse. Dr. Amen said loneliness was a serious problem in America before the pandemic, but the COVID-19related shut-downs made loneliness "exponentially worse." He points out that while the pandemic is over, many people continue to remain isolated from those with whom they interacted before the pandemic. Therefore, he recommends minimizing screen time while maximizing in-person interactions. Dr. Amen also believes more public resources should be used to hire and train mental health professionals so they're more accessible and affordable to the people who need them.

CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: Research shows church involvement with adoption and foster care ministries has dropped substantially in the last five years. But not all is lost. One Ohio church is making its primary goal to care for the orphaned and sharing their success as an encouragement to all churches. America ranks third in the world for having the most orphaned children, according to World Population Review. Almost 400,000 of them live in foster care – and less than half are adopted each year. In the small town of Kinsman, Ohio a local church is hoping to change that by sharing hope by loving one child at a time. Four years ago, Pastor Jordan Biel discovered that in his county, 140 children living in group facilities needed foster families. Today, it has become a vision for the congregation to transform Trumbull County by partnering with the county's children's services to find a loving family for orphan children. The initiative is called #everychild. Over the past four years, 40 children have come into care via families at Rock of Grace, including five adoptions. Church members Melissa and Jason Crisp have been married for 24 years and have four biological children. Still, they've fostered nine more children in the last year and a half. While it's rewarding, Melissa says the hardest part is falling in love with a foster child, only to hand them over to a responsible family member who comes forward. Their desire is to one day adopt. Meanwhile, the process nurtures their faith as they learn to trust God's timing. Churchgoers everywhere are being encouraged to adopt at a time when adoptions have declined in the U.S. A Lifeway Research study found a little more than 2-in-5 U.S. protestant churches say their congregation is actively involved in an orphan ministry. Ohio has roughly 5,000 orphaned children. Nikki Culver, FAM director for Rock of Grace says those lives could be positively impacted for the kingdom if every church in the state stepped in to help nurture them. The same Lifeway Research shows church members providing foster care has dropped almost 10 percent over the last five years. Jordan's church vision came into focus after walking out of his own faith by adopting a little boy named Lucas. And for those who aren't ready to commit and foster or adopt - the church gives volunteer opportunities via its Family Advocacy Ministry, which pairs foster families with church volunteers who provide support by cooking, cleaning, babysitting, and praying for foster families. Melissa Crisp understands how deep spiritual support can go when pouring into the life of a foster child. And with the overturning of Roe v. Wade - experts predict a flood of stress on the foster care system. Foster families know the church will be needed even more to help fill the void. The #everychild campaign is just one example of how churches can make a difference in the lives of children in need. By providing support and care, churches can help these children thrive and reach their full potential.

Tonight on Praise: Matt and Laurie sit down with Dr. Stephen C. CBN Reporter Brody Carter Reports: A summer camp founder in South Carolina says Christian revival is happening among the age group known as Generation Z, people born between 1999 and 2015. Crossroads Summer Camp, hosted on Anderson University's campus in South Carolina, was founded in 1996 by Clayton King, a traveling evangelist who's reaching the next generation by sharing the gospel and teaching them truth, meaning, and purpose. And research shows that could be why Gen Z is seen as losing their religion. The American Survey Center calls a third of this age group 'religious nones,' meaning no religious affiliation. That's why King and his team are focused on reaching Generation Z with the gospel. This year, more than 3,000 campers accepted Jesus as their personal savior at Crossroads Summer Camp. King attributes this surge in salvation to the goodness of God compared to what the world has to offer. King's wire Sharie, and co-founder of their separate nonprofit called Clayton King Ministries says she sees the Holy Spirit moving in each student's decision to choose Jesus. King's son, Jacob, is also stepping into his role as a traveling evangelist at 20 years old. He is passionate about sharing the gospel with his generation and believes Gen Z is desperate for identity and hungry for truth. Today, the King family serves all age groups through Clayton king Ministries offering marriage conferences, coaching networks, and mission trips. Clayton also preaches at NewSpring Church with several locations in South Carolina. After 36 years of sharing the gospel, King's message remains the same, and he believes this generation is experiencing a genuine revival.

CBN Reporter Heather Sells Reports: The "Sound of Freedom" has passed \$163 million in box office ticket sales, outgrossing big-budget competitors and becoming the surprise hit of the summer. All this despite early criticism of the movie by detractors who mislabeled it "Q-anon and adjacent" and called out the politics of star Jim Caviezel. For anti-trafficking advocates who have sought for decades to shine a spotlight on the exploitation of sex trafficking victims, the movie has provided welcomed awareness. Anti-trafficking advocates acknowledge that controversary over the film has politicized the issue in some ways, complicating their messaging. Still, they recognize that "Sound of Freedom" has provided an opportunity to educate moviegoers who want to better understand what's happening in their own communities and take action. Trafficking survivor Lisa Michelle founded Untethered Ministries in San Antonio, Texas, and says she's been overwhelmed with an outpouring of inquiries since the movie debuted. Michelle said she almost didn't see the movie, fearing it would hit too close to home. Along with other advocates in the U.S. Michelle regrets that "Sound of Freedom" focused on trafficking overseas, rather than here at home. Still, she says this summer provides a unique opportunity. In the wake of the movie, Safe House Project has also released new faith-based content for church groups wanting to engage with the issue. Other faith-based anti-trafficking advocates like Shared Hope, International Justice Mission, and Street Grace also provide resources for churches to access. Linda Smith, founder of Shared Hope International, says she hopes that more people will begin to recognize the signs of trafficking and understand how to keep kids safe. Michelle says people often are blind to trafficking in their neighborhoods. For parents, says Michelle, perhaps the most challenging task is keeping kids safe on their phones. That's typically where traffickers, posing as interested friends, prey on children and teens.

CBN Reporter Charlene Aaron Reports: In the year since the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, the talk of a federal abortion law has lessened. It is an issue that has now led to new trends in the evangelical adoption arena. Before the historic court action, statistics showed Christians already more likely to adopt than other Americans. Now they are stepping up at an even bigger rate to grow their families and help children in need. Herbie Newell, president and executive director of Lifeline Children's Services in Birmingham, AL said this comes at a time that the battle over adoption has never been greater. When the pandemic hit in 2020, border closings and lockdowns forced many countries to shut down their foreign adoption programs – an impact Newell points out is still being felt today. Newell also said pro-life pregnancy centers must adjust to the changing face of abortion. That includes reaching out to single women who are faced with an unplanned pregnancy. Meanwhile, Lifeline is recruiting kids to help make a difference through an initiative called Stand for Orphans. It is an idea started by kids for kids who need families. Since that first summer, nearly \$400,000 has been raised through the program and it is expanding as churches across the country include it in their vacation Bible schools.
