I Asbury Library Funding – Education And Community Development

The City of Asbury, a suburb of Dubuque and home to WJOD, has grown quickly and has outgrown its library. A series of fundraising events are underway to help raise the millions needed for the new library. In April, the library hosted a fund raising trivia contest. Chad Kunkel has done a series of interviews about what is going to be included in the library, including attempts to make it part of Asbury Park so more residents will use it. The interviews lasted one minute and were presented on all five Townsquare Media Stations of Dubuque. The forms detailing the times they were aired are attached to this form for each station.

II Youth Development

Director Jennie Weber told us about the YWCA/YMCA "Reach and Rise Mentoring Program". Reach & Rise pairs qualified adults with area at risk youth ages 6 and 17. A Supportive, consistent mentoring relationship is developed through recreational play and paraprofessional therapeutic techniques. The mentor becomes an extra parent for the child to rely on. This interview was aired on all five Townsquare Media radio stations in Dubuque.

III Welfare of Animals

V History of Galena

Thursday, Friday and Saturday, April 24th, 25th and 26th, The Dubuque Drug Task Force and seven other organizations collected outdated prescription and non prescription drugs from anyone who would like to dispose of them safely. The idea is to keep the drugs out of the hands of drug abusers, playful children, or people who may accidently take outdated drugs. Gary Pape of the Dubuque Drug Task Force told us what they will take, "no questions asked", and about the different locations where they will be conducting the collections. Gary also told us about some of the dangers of leaving these drugs unattended.

VIII Assistance to U.S. Veterans and Current Military Personnel

"Operation We Care" is a Dubuque area organization that takes care of the personal needs of U.S. Veterans, current military personnel and their families when the Veterans Administration or the U.S. Military cannot, or their help is slow in coming. Chuck Tonn of Miracle Car Wash was interviewed on all five of our Townsquare Media stations about his fundraising efforts during the Memorial Day holiday. A large portion of his car wash service were dedicated to Operation We Care. The interviews included information about Operation We Care and it's various services. The interview was two minutes in length. played on Y-105 at 8:10a and 9:40a on 5/21. It was played on WJOD at 6:20a on 5/22, 9:40 on 5/23, and 6:45a on 5/24. On WDBQ-AM it was heard at 112:08p on 5/22 and 14:06p, on 5/23. Q1075 presented the interview on 5/22 at 112:51p. Eagle 102 played the interview at 12:49p on 5/23. Each station presented numerous live mentions of fund raiser during the event.

IX Hospice of Dubuque

Linda Wolf and Tiffany Brothers of Hospice of Dubuque were interviewed about the "Tree of Life" event. The tree of life is lit with bulbs representing people and families in the Dubuque area who have been helped when a family member is dying. Linda and Tiffany were interviewed on Y-105 at 8:10am on May 12th for five minutes. They were also interviews for two minutes on WJOD at 5/13 at 6:20 am and 9:53 am, on 5/14 at 8:40 am. They were interviewed on Q1075 for two minutes on 5/12 at 3:51pm, on 5/13 at 10:53am, and on 5/14 at 7:29am. The interview on WDBQ-am took place at 8:40a on 5/13 and on Eagle 102 at 1:40pm on 5/14. There were many live public service announcements made on behalf of the Tree of Life event on our stations.

OTHER SERVICES

NEWS: All Townsquare Media of Dubuque stations carry news of the American Broadcasting Company and six local newscasts each weekday. In addition, WDBQ-AM carries Iowa state news from Radio Iowa.

WEATHER: Townsquare features full access to satellite and radar transmissions of current conditions. WJOD is associated with Weathertime, a private weather service that has a much better track record than the National Weather Service, is faster with their reports, and is especially valuable to the Dubuque area's extensive agricultural community.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: Cumulus / Townsquare of Dubuque stations average well over 50 locally oriented public service announcements per day for various non-profit groups in the tri states.
