X Feeding and helping with health care for those in need

Rev. Maryann LoGuidice was interviewed to promote Crop Walk, 2014. Crop Walk is an annual event that raises funds for various organizations that help feed the less fortunate. Twenty five percent of the funds are used in our community, and the rest is distributed worldwide to feed the hungry in the rest of the world. This year's Crop Walk is scheduled for Sunday, October 5th on Grandview Avenue in Dubuque. Last year, over 250 people participated. Rev. LoGuidice represents DACU, Dubuque Area Congregations United which has over 35 local church organizations participating.

Ena Hareen is a Dubuque area group that raises funds to feed school girls in Africa. The group also helps provide health care, including giving aids infected mothers baby food to help stop the spread of the disease. Micky Marolf, director of Big Band Express told our listeners about a concert on October 5th, 2014 that will raise funds for Ena Hareen.

XI Fine Arts Education for High School Children

Most high schools have sports booster clubs. Western Dubuque High has a special club to raise money for fine arts education for students. The club has already raised funds to outfit the new arts exposition center. Now the club is raising funds for the band, choir, dramatic arts, general art and other educational needs of students. More than 30% of Western Dubuque students are being educated in the arts. Brian Meyers, a Western DBQ High Arts Booster told our listeners about the purpose of the organization, and a fund raising Wingfest that was held on September 20th.

OTHER SERVICES

NEWS: All Townsquare Media of Dubuque stations carry news of the American Broadcasting Company and six local newscasts each weekday. In addition, WDBQ-AM carries Iowa state news from Radio Iowa.

WEATHER: Townsquare features full access to satellite and radar transmissions of current conditions. WJOD is associated with Weathertime, a private weather service that has a much better track record than the National Weather Service, is faster with their reports, and is especially valuable to the Dubuque area's extensive agricultural community.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS: Cumulus / Townsquare of Dubuque stations average well over 20 locally oriented public service announcements per day for various non-profit groups in the tri states.
