ISSUE: GOVERNMENT/POLITICS

News at Nine Cover Stories:

Broadcast Date: April 10th – June 27th

Length: 13 minutes

Source: Local, Sister Stations and National

Description: We continued our coverage as Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker announced he was considering a run for president in 2016. We covered the different Republican events the Governor attended across the country as well as visits overseas. Our reporters also sat down with him one-on-one to discuss his viewpoints on the top political issues.

Broadcast Date: April 13th – June 30th

Length: 37 minutes

Source: Local and Sister Stations

Description: Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker unveiled a controversial state budget, that ended up sending the legislature into a stalemate on what to approve and what to change, including a \$300 million dollar cut to the UW-System, budget cuts to multiple departments and funding for a new Milwaukee Bucks Arena. The Joint Finance Committee didn't come to an agreement on the budget until after the deadline, forcing the Assembly and Senate to call for an "extraordinary" session to pass the budget.

Broadcast Date: April 7th

Length: 11 minutes

Source: Local

Description: FOX 47 had live coverage from all over our viewing area as counties and cities elected their new leaders, and voted on multiple school referendums. The biggest race for our area was the vote for Madison mayor. FOX 47 aired both candidate's speeches live after the final votes were tallied.

ISSUE: SPORTS

Broadcast Date: April 1st – June 30th

Length: 31 minutes

Source: Local

Description: Our crews were live from Indiana for the NCAA tournament, where the Wisconsin Men's Basketball team made it to the championship game against Duke. A few months after the end of the season, head coach Bo Ryan announced he would only coach one more season and then retire. We spoke with Coach Ryan, fans, fellow coaches and players about him leaving the team.

ISSUE: COMMUNITY/CITY

Broadcast Date: April 2nd – June 20th

Length: 55 minutes and 30 seconds

Source: Local

Description: FOX 47 continued to follow up on tensions between the African American community and Madison's police department following the officer involved shooting of Tony Robinson. The district attorney also announced that no charges would be filed against Officer Matt Kenny for killing Robinson. Kenny's attorney says he would like to return to the police force, however leaders in the African American community say they do not want him patrolling streets in the city anymore.

Broadcast Date: April 13th – June 17th

Length: 17 minutes

Source: Local, Sister stations and National

Description: The bird flu that devastated the poultry industry across the Midwest also impacted Wisconsin. Eight chicken and turkey farms were hit by the disease, affecting 1.6 million birds in Wisconsin. We updated our audience when counties would be put under quarantine, as well as restrictions on bird shows at state and county fairs. We also looked into the impact on chicken and egg prices due to the bird flu.

Length: 3 minutes

Source: Local

Description: In a special report, we spoke with a same-sex couple hoping to adopt their first child. But adopting is very expensive, so they started a Go Fund Me account to help raise

money to adopt a child. It's a growing trend for many couples looking to adopt, but can't afford all the thousands of dollars to go through the process.

Length: 4 minutes

Source: Local

Description: In a special report, we spoke with a Tae Kwon Do instructor about how he's trying to combat bullying in area schools, by teaching his students not only how to prevent classmates from bullying them, but also how not to be a bully themselves.

ISSUE: WEATHER

Broadcast Date: June 22nd and 23rd

Length: 13 minutes and 30 seconds

Source: Local and Sister Stations

Description: Severe storms rolled through parts of South Dakota, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa and Illinois the morning of June 22nd, knocking out power to tens of thousands of people, including in our viewing area. We spoke with residents whose homes were damaged or were left without power for days. We continued to follow up on the clean up a few days after the storm

ISSUE: FEATURE

Broadcast Date: June 17th

Length: 3 minutes

Source: Local

Description: Our anchor got an exclusive interview with Miss Wisconsin, who is a student at UW-Madison. She will compete in the upcoming Miss USA competition, representing Wisconsin. Hayley Landrie spoke about the pageant world and the issues she is most passionate about.

Broadcast Date: May 4th

Length: 5 minutes

Source: Local

Description: In a special FOX 47 report, we spoke with a Middleton High School athlete who was slated to be a top pick for college basketball teams, until he was diagnosed with a rare bone cancer that took away his ability to walk. Jackson Pagel, with help from his family and fellow teammates, is determined to walk again.

ISSUE: HEALTH

Broadcast Date: May 28th – June 25th

Length: 12 minutes

Source: Local

Description: FOX 47 started a special series to help teach people the most effective ways to be healthy and exercise. Our anchor Michelle Carolla works with an instructor at Orange Shoe fitness company to show people what exercises to try out and tips to eat healthier. The segment is called "Get Fit With FOX" and runs every Thursday.

Broadcast Date: April 27th

Length: 3 minutes and 30 seconds

Source: Local

Description: In a special report, FOX 47 looked into a new program in Dane County to help people curb their alcohol addiction and reduce the number of criminal incidents that involve drinking too much. We looked at the statistics of police reports and incidents involving alcohol as well as what happens in the brain to make people want to continue their addiction.

Broadcast Date: April 28th

Length: 2 minutes

Source: Local

Description: FOX 47 partnered with the Purple Stride race, to help promote the run and spread awareness of pancreatic cancer. Our anchor Michelle Carolla recorded an interview with the organizers of the race and a survivor of pancreatic cancer about the importance of this race.

ISSUE: CRIME/ACCIDENT

Broadcast Date: April 7th to June 27th

Length: 31 minutes and 30 seconds

Source: Local

Description: Since January, Wisconsin has seen five people drown in the Wisconsin River, including two children. We spoke with the families of the victims as well as residents along the river about the danger of the Wisconsin River. We also spoke with experts about how the combination of the strong currents and the changing sand bar make this river very dangerous.

Broadcast Date: April 13th to May 22nd

Length: 12 minutes

Source: Local

Description: Back in 2014, a former Dane County deputy killed his wife and sister-in-law in their Fitchburg home. FOX 47 covered the Andrew Steele trial and sentencing, as the defense tried to convince the jury Steele's mind was altered by his ALS diagnosis, while prosecutors said he was sane during the killings. A jury ended up finding Steele not guilty by reason of mental defect. We spoke with the victims' family following the verdict, saying no mercy should be shown to Steele. A judge later ordered Steele remain in an institution.

ISSUE: CONSUMER

Source: Local

Description: We spoke with local businesses who were hiring computer hackers to improve their company's cyber security. These people are called "ethical hackers". We spoke with a business CEO about why they would hire a hacker, as well as an ethical hacker about what flaws criminals look for to steal information from a company's database.

Source: Local

Description: New numbers show teen unemployment is rising across the country, including in Wisconsin. In a FOX 47 special report, we showcased a new program in Madison to help teens find jobs that will help them learn skills for the future. We spoke with one 14-year-old bussing tables at a local restaurant, as well as with Madison Mayor Paul Soglin on the benefit of hiring teens in the city.
