Synopsis:	Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education is reporting a record enrollment drop. Total enrollment at Pa.'s 14 state-owned universities has dipped to less than 89,000 students. Officials say 12 of the universities saw an admissions decrease this year, contributing to the state's largest decrease in enrollment in more than a decade with 5.4%. Last year, during the height of the pandemic, enrollment was down about 3.8%. Losses have been most apparent at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. System leaders believe the pandemic played a role in the decline, along with the impacts to family income and a growing number of students working jobs that are paying \$15 to \$20 an hour.
